Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

1. A War Diary is **SECRET**.

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.

4. Post-war disposal will be as under:

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mobn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

(i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary.

(ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.

(iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.

(iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:—
Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

(v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.

(vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

1. *Titles and Numbering of Files.*

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned

2. *Date reference.*

In giving communications a reference number, it is convenient to use the date system of four figures indicating day and month, e.g. 0102 for 1st February; 3010 for 30th October.

3. *Combined Numeration.*

If the systems outlined in paras 1 and 2 are combined, by placing the four date figures under the subject file numbers, a simple and informative method of reference results, thus

$$\begin{array}{r} 2-6-1 \\ \hline 0804 \end{array}$$

might be immediately identified as a communication dealing with replacement of gas masks, dated 8th April.

NOTE.—This method is not applicable to signal messages, A.F.C. 2128, which bear serial numbers 1 to 9999. The use of dashes eliminates confusion between serial numbers and file numbers.

4. *Documents for Preservation.*

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

5. *Correspondence in the Field.*

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.

Area Caiazzo 305852 Sheet 172 I	1 Aug	44	<p>Weather :- Fine and warm Further amendments on movement order today. Commanding Officer Lt.-col. W.C. Dick held an Adm "O" Gp. Lt.C. Nadeau i/c Carrier party to leave 3rd Aug. There is a heavy load of tentage to be carried and a tentative allotment of 30 TCVs in addition to the Rifle Coy vehicles. We are deficient mosquito nets and an issue of face nets is proposed as a temporary expedient. Anti-malaria war is to be intensified. At 1900 hrs a lecture to all Jr. Offrs on the "Characteristics of the VMG" by Capt. Andrews of the PLFs was held at Bde HQ. There was a movie at 2100 hrs.</p>	
	2 Aug	44n	<p>Weather :- Warm with slight rain Carrier party left at 1415 hrs with Capt. T.T. Arnold in command. Coy training consisted mostly of range work. "A" Coy reced a Battle Range for firing. At 1145 hrs the C.O. held a Trg Conference. A new draft of reinforcements arrived - 3 officers and 7 NCOs. 3 Browning MGs were delivered today from the Westmr Regt for our MG Pl. We had a casualty on the Piat range when a sliver from a German tank target penetrated the stomach of a soldier.</p>	
	4 Aug	44	<p>Weather :- Warm to hot Major J.W. Hughes put all the Coys through the 2" Mortar range this afternoon. The I.C. Lt. E.C. Carter went to a Bde conference where final details of the move were tied in. Route to Highway 6 was changed to Caiazzo-Dragoni-Pietramelara. Traffic discipline and security of move reemphasized. CANADAs, Div patches and ribbons to be removed today. The C.O. went to Caserta to see Pte. Pettpiece who was wounded yesterday. He continued to Naples to make necessary purchases. Recce party left today under Capt. Rich enroute to Lake Trasimeno area. More amendments to movement order, route cards completed and maps marked.</p>

The head of the Bde column pulled into FINOCCHIO staging area at 1300 hrs. We were missing "A" Coy 15cwt with kitchen and HQ Coy was called upon to feed this hungary Coy. One report has it that L/Cpl Brunhol, Sanitary Cpl having been delayed owing to tire trouble flagged a Brigadier's car and extorted from this senior Officer a written statement that he was NOT AWL. 	21 Aug	44	<p>Weather:- Clear at first but cloudy later The Bn passed the Bde SE at 0930 hrs. Route-- Montefalco, Foligno, Highway 77, Tolentino, Macerta, Iesi to area Iesi S388404. The column was all in by 2000 hrs but there were some straggling vehicles. Some difficulty was encountered in getting signs repainted with new unit Tac sign 56 and in future we shall have 3 sets of Tac signs to meet all contingencies. The area is somewhat cramped and the whole Div. is in a very compact concentration. It is pleasant rolling country with abundant vineyards, fig and apple groves and melon patches. The grapes are just ripening. There is still a slight shortage of pup tents, a matter that is now in hand.</p>

First: to destroy the German forces opposing us, free ROME and drive the enemy far to the North.

Second: to strike the first blow in the liberation of Europe and give our comrades in the West and in the East a good start by presenting them with a first-class victory.

The first object has been largely achieved. The second has been wholly fulfilled. To you, the soldiers of the Armies in Italy, belongs the honour and glory of this great victory, and I, as your Commander-in-Chief, send to each and every one of you my heartfelt congratulations and deepest appreciation for the magnificent way in which you have carried out your task, and in this hour we do not forget our comrades who have fallen in battle. We honour their name and mourn their loss.

Now we are completing an extensive regrouping in order to bring about the final collapse of the enemy, This is taking place according to plan, and it is my intention to proceed with the second and perhaps final stage of the destruction of the German armed forces in Italy.

These are great days, The Italian campaign has already made history and victory lies glearily ahead of us, but as good and experienced soldiers we know that the path is not an easy one and final success can only be won by fighting for it.

The eyes of the world and the hopes of all at home are upon us - we shall not disappoint them, we shall continue as we have begun to destroy the enemy wherever we find him and to march along the road to the last battles where final victory awaits us."



4. SECURITY REGULATIONS:

The following is a copy of security instructions issued by 1 Cdn Corps, and reprinted hereunder for the information of all ranks.

1. Fmn and unit comds will be held personally responsible for the following security precautions which will apply until cancelled by this HQ. These instructions apply equally to Press, Photo units, LOs from other armies and fmns, auxiliary services and concert parties. Small sub-unit must not be overlooked.

(a) Removal by painting out or scraping off of ALL fmn signs on vehs and unit sign posts. Greasing over signs is NOT sufficient.

(b) Removal from vehs of all signs indicating a fmn HQ (BM - GSO II, etc).

(c) Removal of all fmn flashes and "CANADA" badges and CVSMs. Cdn units will also remove all cap badges and unit flashes.

(d) Special instructions will be given to offr, DRs and dvrs visiting new area that they shall not in any way disclose its location to an unauthorized person on return to their unit.

(e) Disposal of Cdn cigarette packages and fmn and unit newspapers ("Maple Leaf") in such a way that they do not identify tps en route or in an area. Cdn cigarettes will not be given to or used for bartering with civilians.

SECURITY REGULATIONS (cont'd):

(f) Sudden collection of laundry, settling of accounts or special "acrounging" expeditions, likely to indicate imminent departure, will not be permitted. Laundry will NOT be sent out to civilians in the new area.

(g) All casual civilian and Italian Military labour in units unless authorized through proper channels will be rounded up and delivered to a collecting point to be specified by message later. NO local casual labour will be employed in the new area. (See 1 CRO 257).

(h) No casual civilians will be carried in military vehs except for disposal after detention, unless authorized by a provost officer. Any civilians so found will be held for disposal by FS.

(i) No civilians will be allowed in unit lines other than those actually living or working therein. These will be issued with a permit which must be allied with the holder's identity card. Permits will NOT be made out to bearer and will expire within one week. Permits will NOT be signed with Orderly Room stamp but over the name of the OC of the unit without mention of unit title.

(j) Any suspicious or inquisitive civilians will be held for disposal by FS.

(k) Enforcement of "out of bounds" regulations which includes ALL towns and villages.


(l) Colonels and above will NOT wear gorgette patches or red bands on their caps. Pennants will NOT be flown from vehs.

(m) Any officers who have forage caps may wear them.

(n) Wireless silence will be maintained.

2. All personnel, officers and ORs, will be fully instructed on these matters and warned against revealing their identity to any unauthorized person. They will be instructed to check and if necessary report breaches by others.

3. The success of future operations more than ever before in this theatre depends upon the success or failure of security measures. This must be driven home to every soldier.

MESSAGE FROM H.M. THE KING

The following message from H.M. The King has been received by the Supreme Allied Commander Mediterranean Theatre:

"I have greatly appreciated the opportunity you have afforded me of seeing so many of my Armed Forces and of those of the Allies in the Italian Theatre of War.

During the past few days I have traversed the ground from CASSINO to the present front line a distance of some 250 miles, through which, since the middle of May, the Eighth and Fifth Armies have driven a powerful and highly experienced German Force. It is true to say that the enemy has been out-generalled and outfought. His brilliant campaign has added much to the glory of the British, the Dominions and the Allied Armies. Such success could never have been achieved without full cooperation and powerful support of the Royal Navy, Royal Air Force and their Allied Brothers-In-Arms.

I am very pleased to have been able to see for myself some of the splendid work they are doing. Please convey to all under your command my best wishes and my confident belief that the final victory will be theirs. I pray that the day is not too far distant when I shall be able to welcome you home again."

THE FOLLOWING REPLY WAS SENT TO H.M. THE KING BY THE SUPREME ALLIED COMMANDER, MEDITERRANEAN THEATRE.

" On behalf of all ranks of the British, Dominion and Allied Services it is my humble duty to convey their thanks for Your Majesty's message which they appreciated greatly. The visit of Your Majesty to ITALY has given encouragement and inspiration to everyone to complete the task which lies ahead of them. "

8. RESTRICTION OF MOVEMENT.

1 The object of the exercise is to practice:

- (a) Inf cum tk sp by arty in the deliberate attack on a prepared posn.
- (b) The drills for river crossing at night.
- (c) Bridging by RCE
- (d) Marking of routes and TG from assembly areas to br and through gap in minefield to FUP.

2 Wireless silence imposes certain restrictions on the exercise which must be accepted but can be partially overcome if the situation is explained to all tps, and junior leaders use their imaginations. These restrictions are:

- (a) Amn can NOT be fired as without wireless fire control would be difficult. Without fire control firing becomes dangerous and it is felt that the results which may be obtained by firing live amn will NOT justify the risks which would have to be taken.
- (b) Comms between inf, tks and arty will be very limited and therefore there will be little opportunity for inf and tks to practice arty fire orders and corrections.
- (c) For the same reason comms between inf and tks will be very limited. Therefore it will be necessary for visual signals to be laid on in great detail between the two arms.

3 Enemy posns will be indicated on the ground before exercise starts but there will NOT be tps acting as enemy. Umpires will be sup by XII Cdn Inf Bde on the basis of three per rifle coy for two bas.
