5. Dress-Officers.

- (1) The outfit allowance payable to Officers of the C.A.S.F. under the provisions of Art.191,F.R. & I.,C.A.S.F.(Canada) is intended to provide for one suit of service dress and one suit of battle dress,in addition to the other necessary articles of uniform,except in the case of officers of cavalry horsed units,who do not wear battle dress.
- (2) Officers,other than those of cavalry horsed units,doing duty with their units will provide themselves with a suit of battle dress,including field service cap and anklets,when their units have been issued with such dress.They will then wear either service dress or battle dress on all other occasions.
- (3) In the cases of officers,other than those of cavalry horsed units,not doing duty with their units,it is the intention that battle dress may be worn on all occasions for which uniform is prescribed.There is therefore no necessity for such officers to purchase a second suit of service dress to wear, in the event of the one suit of service dress which they are required to provide,not being available for any reason. When a change of clothing is necessary,battle dress may be worn by such officers whether serving at National Defence Headquarters District Headquarters or Headquarters of Formations.
- (4) Battle dress worn by officers will be of the same pattern as issued to other ranks and may be obtained from Ordnance Depots on payment in accordance with Routine Order No.182. There is no objection,however,to officers providing themselves with battle dress made of the same materials of the type at present used for officers' service dress garments,e.g.barathea, if they so desire,provided it is of the correct pattern in all respects.

6. Trench Coats.

Trench coats are NOT to be worn by officers of the C.A.S.F. in place of greatcoats.There is no objection,however to officers now in possession of trench coats wearing them in place of the waterproof coat when NOT on parade with troops. Rank badges will NOT be worn on waterproof coats.

7. Waterproof Coats.

Officers purchasing new waterproof coats should provide themselves with a coat of macintosh pattern cut on generous lines. This coat is a single breasted fly front coat with raglan sleeves and hook and eye at the collar.This coat is NOT worn on parade with troops.

3. MEDICAL ATTENTION DURING LEAVE OR FURLOUGH

- (a) Officers and Other Ranks, C.A.S.F., whilst on leave of absence or furlough, with pay, in Canada, will be eligible for medical treatment at Public expense, subject to the following conditions.
- (b) The officer or soldier to report to the nearest Military authority who will in every case, communicate with the District Medical Officer of the District in which the officer or soldier is temporarily residing.
- (c) The District Medical Officer may authorize the employment of a civilian practitioner when military facilities do not exist for treatment to be accorded.
- (d) Civilian medical practitioners' accounts for services should be forwarded in triplicate to the District Medical Officer of the Military District in which such services have been rendered.
- (e) District Medical Officers will survet such accounts and recommend them for payment from Public funds in accordance with the schedule of fees paid for similar services by the Department of Pensions and National Health.
- (f) The District Medical Officer will supply to Officers Commanding all units in the Military District, a list of military medical posts in the district to which soldiers on leave may apply for medical services.
- (g) Commanding Officers will ensure that the personnel under their command are made fully aware of the above instructions.
- (h) When treatment is furnished in a Military District other than that in which the officer or soldier is stationed, the D.O.C. will report full particulars to the D.O.C. to whose command the officer or soldier belongs.
