1. The following information is forwarded for what it is worth.
2. Mrs A.F.DUFFY, 45cCornwallis Street, came to this Orderly Room at about 1030 hrs 21 May, 1940 and gave the following information and requested that it be forwarded to proper authorities. (Mrs Duffy has a nephew in this Unit, a son in The Manchester Regiment and another son who is a C.Q.M.S. in The R.C.R.)
3. Mrs Duffy wished to report the activities of one JOE FLISK (not sure of the spelling of the surname) who, she claims is a GERMAN. This man used to work for Harry Pascall but lost his job because his fellow workmen refused to work with him on account of his incessant talk about the German successes and what they (the Germans) were going to do when they got to Halifax. Perhaps the most important (at least to the writer) that she said was that this man had moved from the City last week to MONTAGUE MINES, (This place is quite near IMPEROYAL & the new AIRPORT) where he lives in a three room shack painted RED.
4. Mrs Duffy came again to the Orderly Room this morning and reported that this man is again back in the employ of Mr Pascall and gets his breakfast at "TIBODEAU'S" at 188 Maynard Street. He apparently still lives at Montague Mines.
5. Since coming back to the City he again has boasted that he knows how many ships sail in each CONVOY and seemed very well informed about the troop movement that took place the other SUNDAY.
