SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES / week ending Saturday 1st June, 1940

(1) ARMAMENT 132 Rifles, .303 returned to D.O.O. 23rd May (omitted from armament report of 25th May.

(2) Ammunition See S.A.A. report

(3) DISPOSITION 25th May was devoted to settling down in Wellington Barracks. 27th May five officers attended D.C.M. At 1130 hrs No. 7 Platoon, Lieut. J. Stairs, i.c., was standing by to proceed to Port Rest Camp for a special guard at Pier "B" at 1200 hrs. it was placed on half hour notice. Advised special guard not required before morning of 29th May - this at 1520 hrs. Also on 27th May asked by Fortress number of L.M.G.'s on charge also ~~mountings from~~ A.A. mountings for same. Told none of either. Same day asked by F.W.T.C. to provide .22 in. rifles. Five were shipped to Bedford 28th May. At 1015 hrs 29th May advised guard required for patient in Military Hospital. Later cancelled. At 1040 hrs. advised Pier B guard to be in position at 1100 hrs. Advised Fortress unable to get transportation therefore unable to make it at stipulated hour. Undertook to have first detail in position by 1125 hrs. 30th May, 1630 hrs., C.O. and Adjutant to fortress to discuss with Hal. Rif. guards and duties.

31st May, 0945 hrs. Fortress requested a platoon to stand by to go to Airport from 1400 hrs until 1600 hrs. Later instructions resulted in guard taking up position 1355 hrs. Advised guard would be relieved by reinforced Hal. Rif. guard at 1800 hrs. At 2000 hrs advised guard for airport to be held ready for same duty June 1.

1st June, 1110 hrs., Fortress advised Bn. H.Q. of visit by staff officers to Eastern Passage Post, Asked that Passage be advised of submarine report, and issued instructions regarding mounting of District H.Q. guard which will commence 3rd June, 1940. This unit will provide guard and band 5th June and after that each third day.

(4) TRAINING "B" Coy. continuing training as per syllabus forwarded earlier.

(5) DISCIPLINE Generally - fair

Eight men awarded 48 days C.B.

Three men awarded 4 days forfeiture of pay by C.O.

One man awarded 28 days detention.

(6) HEALTH Generally - good.

81 men reported to M.I.R.

40 men given Medicine and duty.

31 men given medicine and light duty.

4 men given medicine and excused duty

5 men sent to hospital making total of seven in hospital.

Remarks: Sore feet (chiefly from E.T.C.Draft) and slight cuts treated at M.I.R. in large numbers. There were a few cases of sore throat and four of influenza. 1st June 50 men inspected for V.D.G., no cases found.

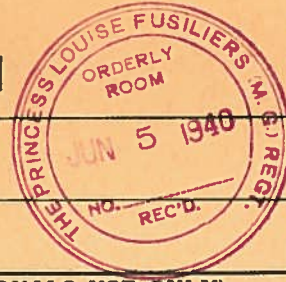

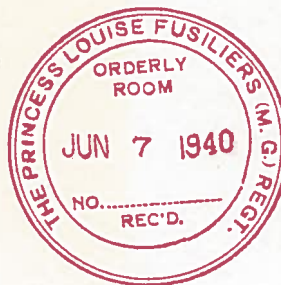

1. ARMAMENT
2. AMMUNITION See S.A.A. report.
3. DISPOSITION, STRENGTH. Recruiting commenced 3rd June and during the week 27 new men were taken on strength. 1 Platoon still continuing guard at Pier "B" over. Planes being dismantled etc. and loaded on Aircraft Carrier. Sent Signaller to Fortress Headquarters for duty. He is to be attached to F.H.Q. for an indefinite period. A guard instituted at D.H.Q. during the week and this Unit is supplying the guard every 3rd day beginning 5th June 1940. All Officers of "B" Company went to Eastern Passage on Tuesday for a tactical exercise with the Brigade Major. Major Fetterly announced that "B" Company would be moving to Dartmouth very soon, probably next week. Signal Platoon held an exercise Tuesday 4th June 1940 using Lucas Lamps and Flags and Heliograph with Stations in Tufts Cove Wellington Barracks Fort Needham and the City Water Tower on Robie St. At 1420 Hrs, 4th June 1940 a guard of 1 Platoon was sent to Halifax Airport to guard a flight of Stinson Monoplanes from the U.S.A. for transshipment overseas. This guard was relieved at 1800 hrs by the Rifles and went on again Wednesday 5th June 1940 at 0600 hrs. At 1524 hrs this guard was reduced from a Platoon to 1 Officer 2 N.C.O's & 12 men. 1. Instructions. Three officers detailed for this guard reported to the Embarkation Office at 1420 hrs. on 7 Jun 40, and were given instructions by Major Keating, E. S. O.

2. Rations & Quarters Instructions were received that Rations and Quarters would not be available at District Rest Camp, and unit would have to make own arrangements.

By the kindness of Mr. Wren, of the American Immigration, the use of the gymnasium as quarters was obtained and rations were supplied by this unit.

3. Detail
 - (a) Three officers and 56 other ranks, supplied by A, B, and H. Q. Coys., proceeded to OCEAN TERMINAL, and sentries were posted to guard Piers 20, 21, and 22, at 0730 hrs., in accordance with Embarkation Officers instructions. One N. C. O. and nine Fusiliers were used as runners, and the remainder as guards.
 - (b) On 9 Jun 40, additional guards of 27 other ranks from H. Q. Coy. (Band, etc.), were supplied to guard Piers 27 and 28, and sentries were in place at 1300 hrs. At 2200 hrs. 10 Jun 40, the 27 other ranks supplied by H. Q. Coy. were relieved from guards at PIER 27 & 28; and sentries were supplied for PIER 28 by the remaining guard.
 - (c) At 1000 hrs. 11 Jun 40, the guard was withdrawn from PIERS 20, 21, and 22; and one sergeant and ten other ranks were left to guard PIER 28, and were quartered in PIER 28 by the kindness of the HARBOUR COMMISSION.

1. Armament. No Change.

3. Disposition, Strength. Recruiting has been carried out all week with the number of applicants just about all we could handle. Average taken on about 14 per day. A great many more are turned down by the "Board" for dental reasons. In addition to the Guards at Immigration-reported last Saturday-an additional Platoon was posted in that vicinity on Sunday 9th June 1940. These Guards have all been lifted. On Monday 10th June 1940, this Unit sent a-~~draft~~ 20 men, in charge of an N.C.O. as a draft to the West Nova Scotia Regiment.

4. Training. Guards did not allow for any definite training Syllabus to be carried out but small groups trained on general M.G. work, and fire orders whenever possible. On Friday all available men -about 75 other ranks-^{fell in} in full marching order and taking advantage of the Band going to District Headquarters, marched to Garrison Cricket Grounds, where they broke off from the Band and for about an hour were given a lecture on and demonstration of extended fire^{order} drill. Recruits. Recruit training has been carried on during the week and very good progress can be reported. A high type of recruit is now coming in and they seem to be catching on very quickly. Dispositions and Defences.

Eastern Sector.

1. With reference to recce and conferences in connection with the adjustment of dispositions of the and the defence of the Eastern Sector against attack from the Eastward.

2. It has been decided that the undermentioned adjustments will be brought into effect forthwith.

(a) One Company F.L.PUS.(MG) will be placed under the tactical command of the Eastern Sector and will be disposed as follows:-

- (i) Coy. H. . and one platoon in Sector Reserve at Hazelhurst.
- (ii) One platoon in the present position east of Eastern Passage Village with tasks as follows-

Prepare to put down fire on:-

- (1) The beaches to Barrie Beach.
- (2) Barrie Beach.
- (3) The road and beaches SE of Barrie Beach.
- (4) The southern slopes of the highground in squares 9680 and 9760.

Note.

One sec of this pl will be in the present permanent emplacements-one sec will be kept as mobile as possible in order that it may be moved quickly. It will however, be prepared at all times to carry out the above tasks and to do this, temporary field emplacements will be constructed.

(iii) One pl at Cow Bay Beach with tasks as follows:-

- (1) To cover Cow Bay Beach.
- (2) To be prepared to put down fire on the road leading to Cow Bay Village.
- (3) To be prepared to bring fire to bear on the beaches in squares 0062 and 0063.
- (4) To provide and man a road block at approximately 994031 during the hours of darkness.
- (5) To provide and man a road block at the rd.junc.97963 during the hours of darkness.
- (6) To carry out a series of patrols of Cow Bay Beach during the hours of darkness. These patrols will be timed to meet the patrols of the F.L.I. Nighrs.at the run (about 982609)
- (7) To carry out a series of patrols to the beach at about 003628 during the hours of darkness. The final patrol of the night will be timed to arrive at the beach 30 minutes before daylight, and will remain at that point until daylight.

Note.

One sec of this platoon will be in a permanent emplacement-one sec will be ready to carry out all fire tasks, and will be kept as mobile as possible, in order that it may be moved quickly in the direction of -essey Vensy Head or elsewhere should the need arise.

(3)

After due consideration it has been decided that the R.C.A.F. seaplane base and air-drome can best be defended against an attack developing from the eastwards by moving the Coy. now protecting the R.C.A.F. establishments to ground more suitable for defence. Therefore on information that a landing is taking place or is about to take place on the beaches eastward, the following positions will be occupied.

(a) The pl. guarding the Seaplane Base will take up a position astride the road in square 9362 NW of Eastern Passage Village. This pl. has two principle tasks.

(i) To prevent the enemy from advancing on the Seaplane Base and the Imperial Oil Ltd. Refinery.

(ii) To counter-attack along the road from Eastern Passage Village in the direction of the rd. junc. 951626 should the enemy ~~be~~ succeed in penetrating through that point.

(b) One pl. will take up a position to cover the open ground extending southward from and including Hill 125 in square 9562.

(c) One platoon less one sec to take up a position astride the rd. at about 950697 covering the open ground extending southwards and acting as the reserve to the forward platoon (para 3(b) above.)

(d) One sec to occupy a position on the railway where it crosses the road at about 947634, to prevent the enemy from moving westwards along the railway.

(e) M.G. sec P.L. (MG) sector reserve to take up a position to cover the open ground southwards from Hill 125 in square 9562. The fire of this sec is to be carefully co-ordinated with the fire ~~from the~~ of the rifle secs covering this area and the fire from the M.G. pl. at about 947613 (see para 7(b) below.)

(4) The tasks of the rifle pl. in the Eastern Passage area will be slightly changed when the dispositions of the M.G.'s are completed. (see para 3(a) (iii) above). These changes are:-

(a) The sector at Barrie Beach will continue to patrol Barrie Beach during the hours of darkness and in addition will:-

(i) Patrol the beaches eastwards to rd. junc. 968599 during the hours of darkness.

(ii) ~~in the case of an attempted landing on the beaches in its area will warn pl. M. and the M.G. pl. at 948609 and then withdraw from the M.G. beaten zones to a previously recon defensive position north of the present position.~~

(b) The sec at present located at the crossroads 956616 will NOT man a road block at that point. It will:-

(i) Carry out a series of patrols each night from the crossroads 956616 - rd. junc. 962609 - end of rd. 976616 - shore of Cow Bay Pond - run about 942609. The patrol will be timed to meet the patrol from the P.L. (MG) pl. at Cow Bay which will end its patrol across the run from about 932609. The final patrols of the night will be timed to arrive at 962609 thirty minutes before daylight and will remain at the position until after daylight.

(ii) Maintain the present sec post and be prepared to give to a previously reconnoitered position in case of enemy attack.

(5) The action to be taken by the Rifle and M.G. pls in the Eastern Passage area will be governed by the direction of the attack. There appears to be three main avenues of attack.

(a) A landing on the beaches SE of Eastern Passage Village and an advance along the main road through Eastern Passage Village to the R.C.A.F. establishments and the Imperial Oil Ltd. Refinery.

(b) A landing on the beaches SE of Eastern Passage Village and an advance along the road from the rd. junc. 963604 - crossroads 956616 - rd. junc. 951626 - rd. to R.C.A.F. Aerodrome.

(c) A landing at Cow Bay Beach or Rainbow Haven and an advance along to the crossroads 956616 - rd. junc. 951626 - R.C.A.F. Aerodrome or an advance by the ~~road~~ road to the crossroads 956616 - Eastern Passage Village - Seaplane Base, Imperial Oil Ltd. Refinery.

(6) Action by rifle pl Eastern Passage area.

(a) In case of 5(a) and 5(b) above.

- (1) The sec at Larris Beach having warned pl H. . and M.G. pl, will withdraw to a previously recon position north of the present position.
- (11) The rifle sec at the crossroads 956616 is of little use in that position, therefore consideration should be given to either moving it to a position somewhere about 956608 or to a position near the edge of the wood about 956617, from where it can command considerable open ground and also the crossroads 956616.
- (111) Pl. H. . and the reserve sec at Eastern Passage/ Village will be moved forward to a position so that their fire may be co-ordinated with that of the M.G.'s. In addition, protection must be afforded to the M.G.pl, particularly the left flank.

(b) In the case of 5(c) above.

- (1) The sec at Larris Beach will move along the road from rd Jane. 943604 in the direction of the crossroads 956616 with the object of hampering enemy movement at that point.
- (11) The sec at the crossroads 956616 will hold the enemy at that point as long as possible and then will withdraw along the road to a position in square 9562. This sec will then come under the command of the pl in position in that area.
- (111) Pl. H. . and the reserve sec at Eastern Passage Village will move to a position astride the road at about 946616 with tasks as follows:-
 - (1) To stop an enemy advance along the road toward Eastern Passage Village.
 - (2) To co-ordinate its fire with that of the M.G.'s and the rifle pl holding the ground northwards. (see para 5(b) and (c) above.)
 - (3) To afford protection to the M.G.pl, particularly to its left flank.

(7) Action by M.G.pl Eastern Passage area.

- (a) In case of 5(a) it must remain at the present position to stop any advance should an enemy landing be effected.
- (b) In the case of 5(b) and 5(c) the pl will move to a previously recon position at about 956616- 947615 with the task of stopping any enemy advance either along the rd crossroads 956616-Eastern Passage or across the open ground northward to Hill 125, square 9562. The fire of this pl must be carefully co-ordinated with that of the M.G. sec (see para 5(c) above) and the rifle secs covering the same ground.

8. In regard to M.G. Defense Generally.

It must be realized that new positions may have to be occupied during darkness or fog. It is therefore essential that arrangements are made NOW so that the Machine Guns will be able to get into position during darkness or fog and bring fire to bear on all approaches.

9. Reserve.

- (a) When the final dispositions are completed the sector reserve will consist of TWO rifle platoons and ONE M.G. platoon located at HAZELHURST. It has been decided that in the case of a threatened attack from the Eastward a M.G. section will be moved from sector reserve to a position at Hill 125, square 9562.
- (b) The problem of providing support for the M.G. platoon at COW BAY BEACH has been discussed and it has been agreed that on the threat of a landing at that point a rifle platoon from sector reserve will move to COW BAY BEACH. It is pointed out that the O.C. Eastern Sector must be quite sure that the threat is genuine before committing half of his rifle reserve. In any case the most careful arrangements must be completed NOW for the rapid movement of the sector reserve to any point in the sector.
- (c) Should it be necessary to employ one rifle platoon from the sector reserve a rifle platoon will be withdrawn from the Joint Service Magazine to Sector Reserve.

10. INTERCOMMUNICATION.

- (a) The question of intercommunication must receive every attention, as early information of enemy activity is essential. It is considered that the present location of the Signal Office at the crossroads 956616 is too exposed. It would appear that the most satisfactory location would be at the Headquarters of the rifle platoon at EASTERN PASSAGE. Therefore arrangements are to be made to move the Signal office immediately.
- (b) All posts including the M.G. Post at COW BAY BEACH, are to be connected to the Signal office by telephone. The section at BARRIE BEACH must have communication by telephone to the M.G. Platoon at EASTERN PASSAGE.
- (c) It is considered that a system of light signals should be established. O.C. Eastern Sector will give this matter early attention and submit his recommendations to this H.Q.

11. TRANSPORT.

- (a) Until such time as sufficient M.T. is issued, civilian transport will have to be used in an emergency. In order that there will be no delay in moving troops in an emergency, the O.C. Eastern Sector will keep a record of the civilian transport immediately available for this use. This record should include all particulars of such transport. The record should be revised frequently and kept up to date.

11. TRANSPORT. (cont.)

- (b) It is suggested that R.C.A.F. H.T. might be used to move the Coy stationed at the Air Force establishments forward to the defensive positions. The O.C. Sector will ascertain from the O.C. R.C.A.F. Station whether or not motor transport would be made available.
- (c) It is understood that there are several holes in the road leading from the R.C.A.F. aerodrome to Hill 125, square 9562. This road should be repaired so that it can be used by H.T.

12. COMMAND.

- (a) The distribution of troops for the defence of the Eastern Sector against a landing from the eastward clearly divided the ~~troops~~ forward troops into two distinct localities viz., EASTERN PASSAGE & GOW BAY, therefore the senior officer in each locality will be responsible for the local defence plan, for co-ordinating the efforts of all troops in the area and will, of course, direct the defence in case of a hostile attack. This must be clearly understood by all commanders in the locality.
- (b) In view of the object of the defences East of the R.C.A.F. establishments it has been decided that all troops East of these establishments will come under the tactical command of the O.C. the Company stationed at the R.C.A.F. Aerodrome. This also means that any troops moved forward from the Sector Reserve automatically come under the command of the O.C. the Company stationed at the Aerodrome.
- (c) From the above it naturally follows that in the case of an attempted landing or attack from the Eastward, the Company Cdr of the Company stationed at the R.C.A.F. Aerodrome must establish his headquarters where he can direct the whole defence. The exact location cannot be laid down here but it is suggested that a suitable site might be one of the buildings at about 953624. In order that the defence may be effectively controlled, communication will have to be established with the Signal office at EASTERN PASSAGE and to Sector Headquarters at HAZELBURST. All of the preliminary work to establish this area H.Q. and inter-communication must be undertaken immediately.

TRAINING. 13.

- (a) In order that the full power of the defences will be brought into effect, careful training must be carried out and every available hour used to advantage. It would appear that the most satisfactory method would be to divide the training into a number of phases:-
 - (i) A study of the ground by all officers in conjunction with a study of the defence plan.
 - (ii) A study of the ground by all H.C.O.'s under their own officers. During this phase the plan will be explained.
 - (iii) The selection of section positions and co-ordinating the fire-plan for all small arms.
 - (iv) Practice individual sections in the occupation of their positions by day and by night.
 - (v) Practice individual Platoons in the occupation of their positions by day and by night.

14. ORDER/DIR.

1. Lieutenant Gormley and 20 P.E.I. Highlanders will catch the Duty Boat at Kings Wharf at 0800 hrs. Colwell together with Major Bennett, Captain Carew and Lieutenant Minshull will leave Barracks in the Station Wagon at 1315 hrs on Monday 17th June 1940 and arrangements have been made that they will meet Colonel Thompson of the P.E.I.H's and such other personnel as he chooses at Hazelhurst at 1400 hrs., From there they will proceed to make a recess or recesses of the places and locations for tents etc and Mr Minshull will discuss communications with the Highlanders representative. 1 Platoon will be at COW BAY in tents. 1 Platoon will be at EASTERN PASSAGE in tents and huts huts. 1 Platoon and Company Headquarters will be at Hazelhurst also in tents. This Unit to be responsible for its own cooking at all locations.
4. Order from Fortress says that the move is to be made FORTHWITH. This Unit has been told that we can have as long a time as is necessary for the gathering of stores and equipment but it is estimated that with good luck all will be ready by Tuesday night therefore the day has been set for Wednesday as per para 3 above.

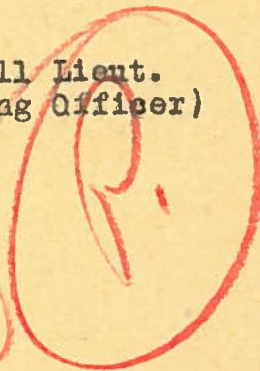

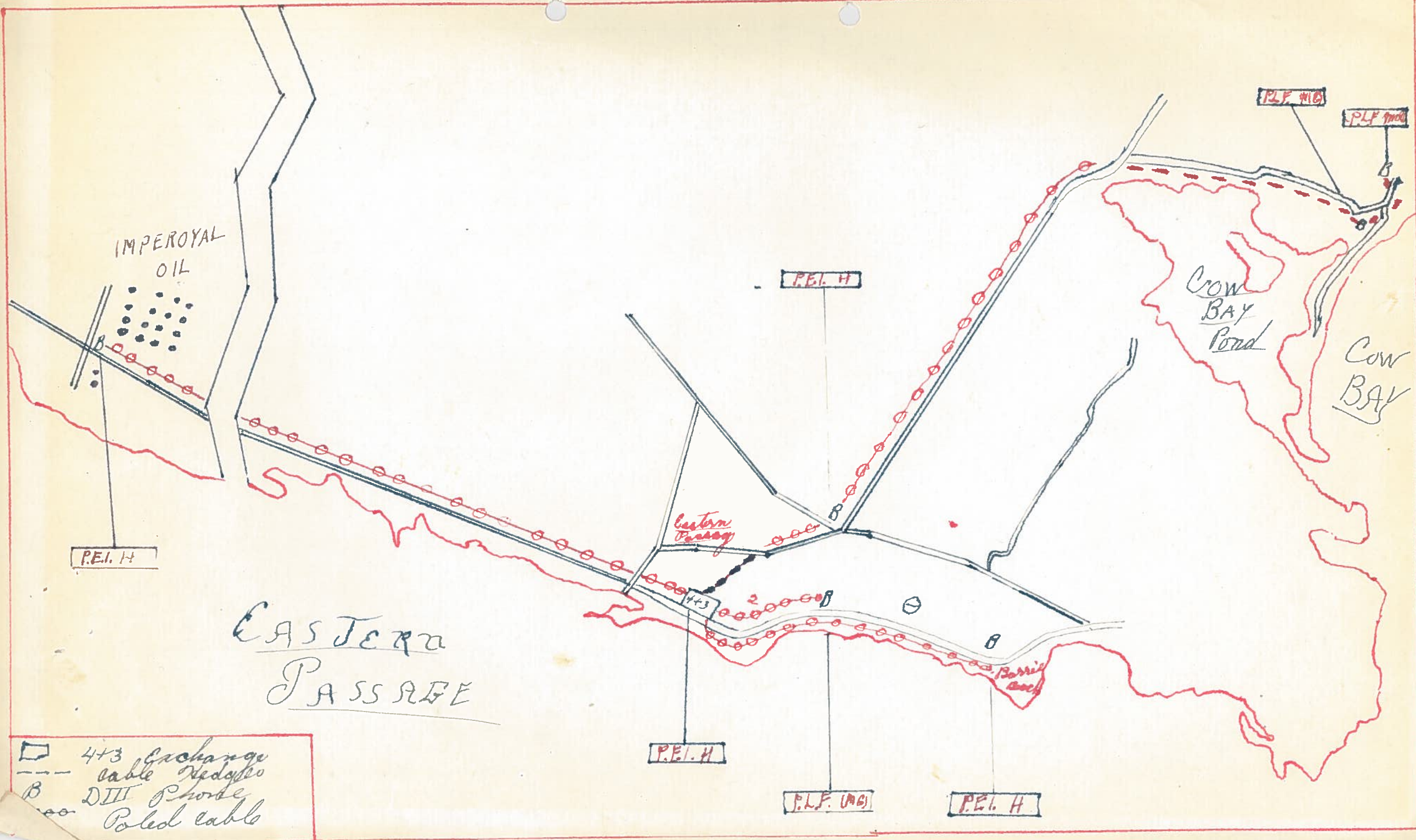
COMMUNICATION EASTERN AREA.


On the evening of Friday 21 June 1940 at approx.
2100 hrs. an alarm was raised at this Post. Upon investigation
six (6) objects were seen in the water directly off the mouth of
the Bay at a distance of about $1\frac{1}{2}$ or 2 miles. Three of these
were long low shapes with a raised block in the middle. The
others were ordinary surface craft. An alarm was immediately
sent to Fortress Headquarters.

I centered my attention on the centre low object.
As I watched it through glasses it slowly submerged. It took
about 2 min. to disappear. Thinking it might have been the
swell on the water that caused it to be hidden I kept the
glasses on the spot for about 2 min. longer but it did not re-
appear. I then looked for the other two low shapes and they
were gone also. These three objects resembled submarines and
reported them as such.

The three other surface craft remained in view
until about 2140 hrs. when a haze developed on the water
around them and it became impossible to see them.

At about 2200 hrs. an airplane appeared over the
Bay and dropped three flares which were too far inland to be
of any help to us. Nothing more could be seen. A close watch
was kept for the remainder of the night but nothing suspicious
was seen. The majority of the personnel at the Post saw the
same as described above.

4. VULNERABLE POINTS-ORDERS FOR SENTRIES

1. Questions have been raised as to the duties and responsibilities of armed sentries guarding vulnerable points, and in order to remove any possible misunderstanding as to their position it has been decided that all orders for sentries guarding vulnerable points will be amended forthwith to include orders to the following effect:-

(i) Any person approaching a post will be challenged:-
"HALT, WHO GOES THERE?"

The sentry must be perfectly certain that his challenge is given in the loudest possible manner so that those who may be dull of hearing can have the chance of responding:-
FRIEND

(ii) If a person who is challenged in this way does not halt, he will then be challenged again by the sentry.
"HALT OR I FIRE"

(iii) If a person does not halt after this warning, he will be challenged once again in the same manner. If the person does not halt and, if no other means are available to stop him, it is then the duty of the sentry to use his rifle and shoot- aiming low to hit but not to kill. The sentry must remember that it is his duty to stop a person from advancing farther should he fail to respond to the challenge and warning.

(iv) If a person can be stopped in any other way, for example, by calling the guard to assist, then the sentry will not shoot. The sentry must remember his responsibility but he will also use common sense when deciding whether to shoot.

(v) At night or in thick fog, a sentry must not allow himself to be rushed, and he must be well on the alert, even more so than in daylight. He must be ready to take such action as is necessary to prevent any person who refuses to respond to his challenge or warning from approaching his sentry post any farther.
