5. WEB EQUIPMENT, 1937 PATTERN.

1. It has been noticed that in some cases the web equipment is not worn in the correct manner.

5. DRESS.

In order to clarify the situation in regard to dress the following extracts from and interpretations of Routine Orders are published for the information of all concerned.

(a) BATTLE DRESS

All ranks will wear battle dress on all parades and duties and when walking out, except where noted below. Anklets will be worn at all times when battle dress is worn.

(b) SERVICE DRESS

(i) Service dress may be worn by officers and Warrant officers Class I, when not on duty with troops, and by pipers and drummers, on duty, when wearing kilts.

(ii) The service dress of officers of Highland regiments is: service dress jacket, Highland pattern, with trows or service dress trousers.

(iii) When walking out, officers and Warrant Officers Class I, of Highland regiments may wear service dress with kilts.

(iv) Under no circumstances will the kilt or trows be worn with battle dress blouse.

(v) Service dress will NOT be worn by other ranks except as specified in para (b)(1) above.

(c) UNDRESS

(i) Undress may be worn by all ranks in the evening when NOT on duty. any

(ii) Undress will NOT be worn during the day on occasion.

5. DRESS (con)

(o) UNDRESS (con)

(iii) Officers proceeding out of barracks or camps in this dress will wear the Sam Browne belt, without brase or frog, or a cloth belt of the same colour and material as the frock, and of the same pattern as authorized for the service dress jacket. In Highland regiments, variation in the articles of undress may be made according to regimental custom, e.g. dirk belt in place of the Sam Browne or cloth belt.

(iv) Other ranks will NOT wear belts with undress.

(v) In Highland regiments, kilts and trews of authorized regimental tartan may be worn, but there must be uniformity in the unit.

(vi) The wearing of collar badges with the undress serge frock or jacket is optional by units and commanding officers will be responsible for the maintenance of uniformity within their units. Shoulder titles will not be worn with the undress serge frock or jacket.

(vii) Ref para (c)(i) above - In order to permit personnel having an all night pass to wear undress, evening is interpreted as being from 1700 hrs to 0800 hrs.

(d) HEADRESS

(i) Drab service dress cap The regulation headdress for wear with service dress will be the drab field service cap. Officers now in possession of the drab service dress cap (forage cap) may continue to wear it with service dress until replacement becomes necessary when the drab field service cap will be adopted.

The drab service dress cap (forage cap) will NOT be worn with battle dress.

(ii) Drab field service cap - This cap will be worn with undress, service dress and battle dress, except in the case of Highland regiments who will wear the drab tam o' shanter. The drab field service cap or the drab tam o' shanter will invariably be worn on duty when the steel helmet is not worn.

(iii) Coloured field service cap - All ranks of all arms except Highland regiments, may wear the coloured field service cap with service dress and battle dress when not on duty and with undress in the evening, when not on duty.

All ranks of Highland regiments may wear the glengarry with service dress and battle dress when not on duty and with undress in the evening, when not on duty.

(iv) Undress forage cap - Other rank personnel now in possession of the undress forage cap may continue to wear it with undress uniform, instead of the coloured field service cap.

(e) Generally.

(ii) All ranks must distinctly understand that the provision of undress uniform, coloured field service caps and Glengarrys is entirely optional and that no officer or soldier is required to provide himself with these articles and that during the period of war, undress uniform may be worn only in the evening, when not on duty.

(iv) All ranks must understand that this is an order and that disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.

5. FOOT BATHS FOR THE PREVENTION OF ATHLETE'S FOOT.

1. Foot Baths, containing a chlorine disinfectant solution in the strength of 0.5% of available chlorine, will be placed in a convenient location in the bath-houses and personnel will be required to use them when entering and leaving the showers. The Foot Baths can be placed in the passageway leading to the showers or in front of the showers.
2. The Foot Bath should be about six inches deep, at least two feet square and of noncorrosive material or protected with two coats of Bakelite Varnish Paint or Rubber Paint.
3. Care should be taken to see that the disinfectant solution is of effective strength at all times.
4. A chlorine disinfectant, high in available chlorine is recommended for this purpose.

7. DISTRICT COURT-MARTIAL.

F60498 Pte. Roland Clifford Carr, The P.E.I. Highrs. (A.F.)

No. F60498 Pte. Roland Clifford Carr, The P.E.I. Highrs. (A.F.), was tried by a District Court-Martial at the Citadel Halifax, N.S. on the 18th day of April, 1941.

The accused was charged under Section 15 (1) and Section 24 (2) of The Army Act with:-

1st Charge:- Absenting himself without leave and occasioning a cost to the Public of \$17.22 by his apprehension.

2nd Charge:- Losing by neglect his equipment, clothing and regimental necessaries to the value of \$15-79.

The accused pleaded Not Guilty to both charges.

The Court found the accused "Guilty" of the first charge and "Guilty" of the second charge with the exception that he did not lose a blanket valued at \$3.60.


The Court sentenced the accused to undergo detention for twenty-eight (28) days, and to be placed under stoppages to the amount of \$29.41.

The findings and Sentence were confirmed by the D.O.C. M.D. No. 6 and were duly promulgated.

The accused elected to be tried by a District Court-Martial.

The Court convened in District Order No. 780 of 1941 is dissolved.
