Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

1. A War Diary is **SECRET**.
2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.
3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.
4. Post-war disposal will be as under:
 - Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.
 - Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.
 - Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.
5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mobn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary.
- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:—Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

- (v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.
- (vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

1. *Titles and Numbering of Files.*

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned.

2. *Date reference.*

In giving communications a reference number, it is convenient to use the date system of four figures indicating day and month, e.g. 0102 for 1st February; 3010 for 30th October.

3. *Combined Numeration.*

If the systems outlined in paras 1 and 2 are combined, by placing the four date figures under the subject file numbers, a simple and informative method of reference results, thus

$$\begin{array}{r} 2-6-1 \\ \hline 0804 \end{array}$$

might be immediately identified as a communication dealing with replacement of gas masks, dated 8th April.

NOTE.—This method is not applicable to signal messages, A.F.C. 2128, which bear serial numbers 1 to 9999. The use of dashes eliminates confusion between serial numbers and file numbers.

4. *Documents for Preservation.*

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

5. *Correspondence in the Field.*

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.

3. ADDRESSING OF MAIL TO TROOPS OVERSEAS: (CARO 2015)

C.A.R.O. 181, 763, 768, 873, 1161 and 1407 are hereby cancelled and the following instructions issued:

1. All mail intended for members of the Can Army (Active Force) after proceeding overseas should be addressed as follows:

- Regimental Number
- Rank
- Name
- Unit (name of Bn, Battery, Engineer Company, Fd Amb, etc.)
- Canadian Army Overseas.

For Example:

D.15760
Sgt. John J. Smith
48th Highlanders of Canada
Canadian Army Overseas.

2. The address should be printed in clear, distinct block letters and all mails should bear the return address of the sender. As far as possible, all mail should be addressed in ink but in no case should indelible pencil be used. All mail must be properly prepaid.

3. Despite publicity given to the proper method of addressing mail to members of the Canadian Army Overseas difficulty is still being experienced by the Postal authorities due to the use of incorrect or incomplete addresses. The greatest difficulty experienced is in connection with:

- (a) Troops proceeding overseas as reinforcements.
- (b) Personnel attending courses overseas.
- (c) Members of advance parties.
- (d) Members of units which are part of Departmental Corps, e.g. a Fld Amb RCAMC, an Army Fd Wkshop RCOG.

In order to correct this situation action will be taken by Comdg Officers, to ensure that personnel under their command who are proceeding overseas and come within one of the above classifications are informed of their correct address in order that they, in turn, may notify their correspondents.

3. ADDRESSING OF MAIL TO TROOPS OVERSEAS (Cont'd)

3-A

4. The following instructions affect personnel who are included in respective sub-paragraphs above:

(a) Reinforcements

(i) Where Commandants of Advance Training Centres, etc., know to what Reinforcement Units personnel from their respective Training Centres will be posted on arrival overseas, they will give such information to these personnel prior to proceeding on embarkation leave. This is important in order that these reinforcements might advise relatives and friends of their correct address before departure from Canada.

(ii) Where Commandants of Advance Training Centres, etc, do not know to what Reinforcements Units personnel from their respective training Centres will be posted on arrival overseas, prior to such personnel proceeding on embarkation leave they will be instructed to make use of the Poste Restante service as explained in sub-paragraphs (b)(c) hereunder.

It is important that these personnel are made conversant with this service prior to proceeding on embarkation leave in order that relatives and friends may be advised as to correct address for mail, and also that these reinforcements will realize they have to make application to the Poste Restante section after arrival at destination to have their mail forwarded to place where they are stationed.

(b)(c) Personnel attending Courses Overseas and Advance Parties Poste Restante Service.

(i) Until such time as personnel in this category are able to give their correspondents a definite postal address, the Cdn Postal Corps H.Q. in the U.K. will act as a clearing and forwarding agency.

(ii) Personnel will be instructed that mail should be addressed as follows:

- Regimental Number
- Rank and Name
- Service or Unit
- c/o Post Restante
- Canadian Postal Corps Headquarters
- Canadian Army Overseas

(iii) Mail so addressed will be held at the Poste Restante Section until such time as inquiries are made by the addressee concerned, when it will be forwarded to him. Mail not applied for within sixty days after its receipt at the Poste Restante Section will be returned to the sender.

(iv) Personnel using the Poste Restante address are to be instructed that they must advise their correspondents of their address as soon as possible. It must be noted that the Poste Restante address is only a temporary expedient and cannot be used as a permanent address.

(d) Members of Units which are Part of a Departmental Corps or Service.

(i) It is essential that personnel overseas furnish their correspondents with the name of the Unit or formation in which they are serving. Cases have occurred in which only the Corps (R.C.Sigs., R.C.E., R.C.O.C., R.C.E., R.C.O.C., R.C.A.M.C., etc), have been indicated.

(ii) Mail should be addressed as shown in the following example:

C.41672
Pte. John Stretcher
No.10 Field Ambulance, RCAMC,
Canadian Army Overseas.

5. It is of paramount importance that all mail intended for overseas personnel be completed and correctly addressed in accordance with the foregoing instructions. Non-compliance with these instructions will result in confusion and delay in the delivery of mail.

6. As instructed in para 3, C.O's will ensure that personnel under their command are informed of their correct postal address prior to proceeding overseas. Also that the special facilities offered by Poste Restante Service are drawn to the attention of those personnel referred to in para 4.

(3) (a) A Commanding Officer will satisfy himself under the provisions of K.R. (CAN) 933(b), as follows:

- (i) That the soldier is free from debt and realizes his financial responsibility.
- (ii) That the moral character and disposition of the intended wife are such that it would in no way be undesirable for her to occupy public quarters.

(b) If under the age of 19 years, the soldier will be required to produce the written consent of his parent or guardian, before permission is granted.

(c) If the intended wife is under 18 years, the written consent of her parent or guardian will be required, before permission is granted.

(d) If a non-commissioned officer or man, whose next-of-kin is already in receipt of Dependents' Allowance, requests permission to marry, the Commanding Officer should ascertain if any hardships may ensue, consequent to the change of the recipient of Dependents' Allowance, before he grants permission.

(e) In the case of para (3)(d) above, before permission to marry is granted, the Commanding Officer shall notify the applicant that Dependents' Allowance in favour of any dependent under Article 101(c), which may be in payment, will automatically cease as of the date the change of assignment in favour of his wife is effected, unless a further assignment of 5 days' pay, with effect from the same date, is made in favour of the person on whose behalf allowances are already in payment under Article 101(c). He shall be further notified that, in the event of such further assignment being made, allowances will be continued until the Board has had an opportunity of reviewing the claim and deciding whether or not a continuance of allowance to the former next-of-kin is justified under the changed circumstances.

(f) Referring to para 3(a) above, the Commanding Officer will, if he considers such a course desirable, interview the intended wife, or consult her parents or guardian.

(4) Commanding Officers will personally check the soldier's documents, to ascertain whether the soldier declared:

- (i) Whether he was married or separated from his wife at the time of his enlistment.
- (ii) The assignments of pay and any Dependents' Allowance in force.
- (iii) Notification as to next-of-kin.

These may give some indication as to whether the soldier is eligible to be married.

(5) In the case of a soldier declaring he has been divorced, the Commanding Officer will require him to produce the original final decree, or a certified copy thereof, before permission to marry may be granted.

(6) After permission to marry has been granted, a Part II Order will be published, setting forth the name of the intended bride, in order that the name may be checked against the subsequent Part II Order stating the date of marriage, etc. In addition, the applicant will be furnished with a certificate or letter, signed by the Commanding Officer and bearing the Orderly Room stamp, reciting such permission, particulars of the applicant and his intended wife, and the date after which marriage may take place.

7. If, after obtaining permission to marry, a soldier wishes to marry a person other than the one for whom permission has already been granted, he will be required to submit a new application.

8. A period of two months will normally be required to elapse between the date of granting permission to marry, and the actual marriage ceremony. In urgent cases, however, a Commanding Officer will waive this requirement.

9. All officers, warrant officers and other ranks will, as soon as practicable after marriage, hand in the marriage certificate to their Commanding Officer. The necessary entries will thereupon be promulgated in the Part II Orders of the unit concerned, as follows:

- (i) Name, rank and number of the officer or soldier.
- (ii) Name of person the officer or soldier has married.
- (iii) Date of marriage.
- (iv) In cases where permission is required, the fact that it has been granted will also be shown.

10. Where application for Dependents' Allowance is made, a certified copy of the Marriage Certificate, together with a certified copy of the Daily Part II Order, showing the entry referred to in para (9), shall be attached to the M.F.M.16 ("Application for Dependents' Allowance"), completed by the officer or soldier, after which the marriage Certificate will be returned to the officer or soldier concerned. It is essential that the above procedure be carried out promptly, in order to avoid delay in the issue of Dependents' Allowance.

11. Officers below the rank of captain, warrant officers, non-commissioned officers and men, who marry without previously obtaining the permission of their Commanding Officer will not be eligible for Dependents' Allowance, except under the following circumstances:

(a) A Commanding Officer may grant permission to personnel mentioned in paras (1) and (2) of this Routine Order, subsequent to their having married without permission, provided (as regards para (2)) he satisfies himself according to the provisions of para (3)(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f). In such cases, Dependents' Allowance will be effective from the date of permission being granted, and NOT from the date of marriage.

(b) If personnel referred to in para (1) and (2) of this Routine Order, already in receipt of Dependents' Allowance, marry without the consent of their Commanding Officer, the Dependents' Allowance will continue to be paid to the original recipient, until such time as the Commanding Officer may grant permission to marry, whereupon the allowance will be effective to the new dependent from the date permission was granted, and NOT from the date of the marriage.

(12) (a) Members of the Nursing Service, R.C.A.M.C., Dietitians, physiotherapy Aids, and Home Sisters, will be governed by the regulations from time to time provided with reference to them.

(b) Officers and volunteers of the Canadian Women's Army Corps will be governed by "Regulations for the Canadian Women's Army Corps, 1942".

4. COMMUNICATION OF MILITARY INFORMATION:(D.R.O. #70).

Attention is directed to C.A.R.O. 2091, as follows. Provisions of para 8 are to be strictly adhered to.

1. All ranks are warned against communicating, either verbally or in writing, any item of information respecting Naval, Army or Air Force matters which may be of value to the enemy.
2. In particular, private conversation or correspondence should make no mention directly or indirectly of the following:-
 - (a) The disposition, movement or projected movement of warships, merchant Ships, troops or aircraft.
 - (b) Details as to numbers, armament, equipment or condition of ships of all kinds, troops or aircraft.
 - (c) Any measures which have been taken or which are projected for the defence of any place.
3. Officers Commanding will make sure that all ranks are aware that they must not disclose to unauthorized persons, in telephone conversation or in telegrams, information which might be useful to the enemy.
4. Any matters which may be of direct or indirect assistance to the enemy are not to be discussed by Officers or Other Ranks other than in the line of duty.
5. Unless specially authorized to do so, officers and soldiers are forbidden to communicate directly with Naval, Military or Air Force officials of another country except on purely private or personal affairs. Requests from officers or soldiers requiring private reference to military officials of another country must be submitted to the immediate superior of the officer or soldier concerned and thence; through the proper channels of communication, to N.D.H.Q.

6. (a) Attention is drawn to para 433(a) of K.R.(CAN) which provides in part:-

"An officer or soldier is forbidden to publish or communicate, either directly or indirectly, to the press, any military information, or his views on any military subject, without special authority from N.D.H.Q."

(b) Officers and other ranks are forbidden to communicate to the Press their personal views on any matter pertaining to, or connected with, their military duties.

(c) The attention of all ranks or civilians employed in military offices, including teleprinters and switchboard operators who in the course of their employment have access to military information, will also be drawn to the Official Secrets Act, Chapter 49, Statutes of Canada, 1939.

A digest of this Act appears as Appendix IV to K.R.(Can).

7. It has been brought to attention that offers or requests to correspond with soldiers are frequently made through the press and other wise. While many of these offers and requests may be bona fide it is pointed out that such correspondence might provide a means for obtaining military information of value to the enemy, or of instituting enemy propaganda. Accordingly, Officers and Other Ranks are forbidden:-

(a) To insert advertisements or letters in any publication inviting strangers to communicate with them.

(b) To enter into correspondence with strangers in response to advertisements or other invitations.

(c) In any other way to communicate with strangers by letter or otherwise concerning anything of a military nature.

8. This order is to be repeated in the orders of all units and establishments, and will be read once each calendar month on company or equivalent unit parades. The terms of this order will be specially brought to the attention of units and individuals when warned for despatch overseas.

This Order supersedes Routine Orders Nos. 218, 305, 387, 639, 1060, 1072 and 1280.
