Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

1. A War Diary is **SECRET**.

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.

4. Post-war disposal will be as under:

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mobn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary.
- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:—Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

(v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.

(vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

THE EXTRACTION AND RETENTION OF APPENDICES, MAPS, ETC., FROM A WAR DIARY IS AN OFFENCE UNDER THE OFFICIAL SECRETS ACT

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

1. *Titles and Numbering of Files.*

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned.

2. *Date reference.*

In giving communications a reference number, it is convenient to use the date system of four figures indicating day and month, e.g. 0102 for 1st February; 3010 for 30th October.

3. *Combined Numeration.*

If the systems outlined in paras 1 and 2 are combined, by placing the four date figures under the subject file numbers, a simple and informative method of reference results, thus

$$\begin{array}{r} 2-6-1 \\ \hline 0804 \end{array}$$

might be immediately identified as a communication dealing with replacement of gas masks, dated 8th April.

NOTE.—This method is not applicable to signal messages, A.F.C. 2128, which bear serial numbers 1 to 9999. The use of dashes eliminates confusion between serial numbers and file numbers.

4. *Documents for Preservation.*

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

5. *Correspondence in the Field.*

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.

2. SECURITY OF OFFICIAL INFORMATION

Instructions for the staff of a C corps, Division, Brigade, Battalion or equivalent unit, relating to the safeguarding of Official Secrets and Information.

1. All members of a Headquarters, including all signal operators, signal office personnel and drivers of Headquarters cars are reminded that they are employed in a position of trust and are, therefore, under an obligation of secrecy.

2. No military information which may come to a person's knowledge as a result of employment at a Headquarters will be communicated to any person NOT employed at such Headquarters, except when necessary for the performance of duty. Information which may seem quite trivial may possibly give a clue to important military matters, with disastrous results to our Forces. Everyone, therefore, will make a definite rule NOT to mention any phase of their work to any person to discuss any phase of their work with another member of the staff, when there is any possibility of being overheard. Particular discretion will be observed when talking on the telephone with regard to military affairs. Signal operators and signal office personnel, likewise all drivers of Headquarters cars, are warned that any conversations regarding military matters they may overhear during the performance of their duties must be treated as secret and confidential.

3. Members of a Headquarters will NOT communicate confidential or secret information to other members of the staff unless it is necessary for the proper performance of their duties.

4. The following are relevant extracts from the Official Secrets Act, 1911 (M.M.L. p.895) as amended by the Official Secrets Act, 1923 (M.M.L. p.900) which Acts of the United Kingdom apply to personnel of the Canadian Army (Overseas).

I. A person is guilty of a felony and liable to penal servitude for a term of fourteen years who for any purpose prejudicial to the safety or interests of the State,

(a) Makes any sketch, photograph, plan, model or note which is calculated to be or might be or is intended to be directly or indirectly useful to the enemy;

(b) Obtains, records, publishes, or communicates to any other person any secret official code word or pass word, or any sketch, photograph, plan, model, article or note or other document or information which is calculated to be or might be or is intended to be directly or indirectly useful to any enemy;

2. SECURITY OF OFFICIAL INFORMATION (cont'd)

2-A

II. A person is guilty of a misdemeanour and liable to imprisonment for a term of two years who,

- (a) Having in his possession any code word, pass word, sketch, photograph, plan model, document or information, communicates such code word, pass word, sketch, photograph, plan, model, document or information to any person, other than a person to whom he is authorized to communicate it, or a person to whom it is in the interest of the State his duty to communicate it;
- (b) Uses the information in his possession for the benefit of any foreign power or in any other manner prejudicial to the safety or interests of the State;
- (c) Retains any sketch, photograph, plan, model, article, note or document in his possession or control when he has no right to retain it or when it is contrary to his duty to retain it, or fails to comply with all directions issued by lawful authority with regard to the return or disposal thereof;
- (d) Fails to take reasonable care of or so conducts himself as to endanger the safety of any sketch, photograph, plan, model, article, note, document or information.

1. It is notified for information that para.5 of Defence Regulations provides that no officer or other rank shall, unless acting in the course of duty in His Majesty's Service, make any photograph of, or of any part of, any object:-

(a) In any such area in the United Kingdom as may be specified by order of a competent authority, being an area in relation to which the restriction of photography appears to that competent authority to be expedient in the interests of the defence of the realm, or

(b) In any prohibited place within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act, 1911, M.M.L., page 895, as amended by the Official Secrets Act, 1920, M.M.L. page 960, that is:-

- (i) Any work of defence, arsenal, navy, military or air force establishment or station, factory; dockyard, mine, minefield, camp, ship or aircraft belonging to or occupied by or on behalf of His Majesty, or any telegraph, telephone, wireless, or signal station, or office so belonging to or occupied, and any place belonging to or occupied by or on behalf of His Majesty and used for the purpose of building repairing, making or storing any munitions of war; or any sketches, plans, models, or documents relating thereto, or for the purpose of getting any metals, oil, or minerals of use in time of war;
- (ii) Any place not belonging to His Majesty where any munitions of war or any sketches, models, plans or documents relating thereto are being made, repaired, gotten or stored under contract with, or with any person on behalf of His Majesty; or otherwise on behalf of His Majesty; and
- (iii) any place belonging to or used for the purposes of His Majesty which is for the time being declared by order of a Secretary of State to be a prohibited place for the purposes of this section on the ground that information with respect thereto, or damage thereto, would be useful to an enemy; and
- (iv) any railway, road, way or channel, or other means of communication by land or water (including any works or structures being part thereof or connected therewith), or any place used for gas, water, or electricity works or other works for purposes of a public character, or any place where any munitions of war, or any sketches, models, plans or documents relating thereto, are being made, repaired or stored otherwise than on behalf of His Majesty which is for the time being declared by order of

3. PHOTOGRAPHY - CONTROL OF (Cont'd)

(iv) a Secretary of State to be a prohibited place for the purposes of this section, on the ground that information with respect thereto, or the destruction or obstruction thereof, or interference therewith, would be useful to an enemy.

2. It is to be noted that military hospitals, headquarters, barracks, billets, camp and quarters are included in the above-mentioned definition of prohibited places.

3. Officers and other ranks, except when they are acting in the performance of their duty, shall not take any photograph of the following subjects as enumerated in para.1 of the Control of Photography Order (No.1), 1939. The term duty shall be strictly interpreted by Commanding Officers. The taking of so-called "Unit record pictures" for War Diary or other purposes shall not be regarded as a matter of "duty" except for the official accredited military photographers on establishments of formation headquarters. Control of Photography Order (no.1), 1939, enumerates the following subjects:-

- (a) Any fortification, battery, searchlight, listening-post or other work of Defence.
- (b) Any aerodrome or seaplane station.
- (c) Any assembly of any of His Majesty's forces.
- (d) Any barracks, encampment or building occupied or in course of preparation for occupation by any of His Majesty's Forces.
- (e) Any arsenal, factory, magazine or stores for munitions of war, arms, equipment or supplies.
- (f) Any wireless, telegraph, telephone, signal or cable station.
- (g) Any dock, caisson, dockyard, harbour, ship-building works or loading pier.
- (h) Any vessel of war either complete or under construction, or any vessel or vehicle engaged in the transport of supplies or personnel.
- (i) Any aircraft or the wreckage of any aircraft.
- (j) Any building structure, vessel or other object damaged by enemy action.
- (k) Any hospital or station at which casualties, whether civil or otherwise are treated; any ambulance or convoy of injured persons, or any injured person.
- (l) Any electricity, gas or water works, or any gasometer or reservoir, or any oil store.
- (m) Any assembly of persons for the purpose of transport or evacuation, or any temporary camp or other accommodation or transport vehicles used for the purpose of evacuation.
- (n) Any riotous or disorderly assembly, or premises, or other object damaged in the course of such an assembly.
- (o) Any roads or railways exclusively connected with works of defence.

4. Where it is desired to obtain, for unit records, photographs of subjects enumerated in para.1, Control of Photography Order (No.1), 1939, as above, applications shall be made to the Public Relations Officer of the formation concerned for the services of an official military photographer.

5. Any photograph or photographic negative or photographic film which any officer, soldier, attached civilian or employee of the Canadian Army Overseas desires to send out of the U.K. will be contained in an envelope or wrapper plainly marked "photograph".

6. Registration of Cameras - All ranks in possession of cameras will register them with the Headquarters of the formation or unit to which they are attached. It will be the responsibility of formation and unit commanders that a list of all ranks in possession of cameras is maintained in their Headquarters.

Officers commanding will ensure that appropriate disciplinary action is taken immediately any cases come to their notice of the sale, attempted sale, gift or other disposition by personnel of the Canadian Army Overseas of gifts, particularly cigarettes or tobacco, which have entered the United Kingdom free of duty.
 3. To facilitate proof and in order that charges may be laid under Army Act, Sec. 11, the following special order is made:-
 - (a) The sale, gift or other disposition, or any attempted sale, gift or other disposition, in the United Kingdom by personnel of the Canadian Army Overseas to civilian or others not members of the Canadian Armed Forces of any article, particularly tobacco or cigarettes, which has entered, or which is of a class of goods commonly known to enter, the United Kingdom free of duty as a gift for such personnel, whether or not such article has been received for or on behalf of such civilians or others, is hereby forbidden.
 - (b) The use of regimental funds for the purchase of cigarettes or tobacco in Canada for delivery in the United Kingdom and the sale of any duty-free tobacco or cigarettes in messes and canteens are hereby forbidden.
 - (c) The direct purchase outside the United Kingdom of any article for importation into the United Kingdom as a duty-free gift, by means of a remittance made under the provisions of F.R.&I. (Overseas) 593 and 594, or through any other medium, is hereby forbidden.

2. USE OF MOTOR VEHs

(i) In order to economize to the greatest possible extent in the use of rubber, pet and MT spares it is most important that all ranks be impressed with their personal responsibility in this regard. Anyone using a motor veh must realize that he is using a valuable piece of equipment and is consuming rubber and pet - both essential commodities and both in short sup.

(ii) Driving at excessive speed wastes both rubber and pet and cannot be tolerated. Cornering at speed is another cause of heavy wear on tires and front-axle mechanism and can easily be avoided.

(iii) It will be impressed on all ranks that the speeds laid down in "MT Drivers Regulations" and applicable to the type of veh concerned are maximum allowable speeds and will NOT be exceeded except in cases of emergency or on orders from higher authority.

(iv) Substantial economies in pet and rubber can be effected if normal cruising speeds are kept well below these maximum speeds. Drs can make a valuable contribution to the war effort by applying these principles to their every-day duties.

(i) With ref to 4 DRO 1447 if Cdn vehs in charge of an offr are checked for speeding, the offr will be charged under AA 40 for negligence in the care of Cdn vehs and under AA 11 for neglecting to obey Standing Orders, i.e., Regulations governing the use of Cdn Military Tpt.

(ii) OR's in charge of a veh will be dealt with under similar charges as normally for similar offences.

(iii) Cdn Pro Corps personnel will be instructed regarding the above.
