**Instructions for Compilation and
Despatch**

1. A War Diary is **SECRET**.

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.

4. Post-war disposal will be as under:

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mohn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary.
- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:—Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

(v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.

(vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

1. *Titles and Numbering of Files.*

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned

2. *Date reference.*

In giving communications a reference number, it is convenient to use the date system of four figures indicating day and month, e.g. 0102 for 1st February; 3010 for 30th October.

3. *Combined Numeration.*

If the systems outlined in paras 1 and 2 are combined, by placing the four date figures under the subject file numbers, a simple and informative method of reference results, thus

$$\begin{array}{r} 2-6-1 \\ \hline 0804 \end{array}$$

might be immediately identified as a communication dealing with replacement of gas masks, dated 8th April.

NOTE.—This method is not applicable to signal messages, A.F.C. 2128, which bear serial numbers 1 to 9999. The use of dashes eliminates confusion between serial numbers and file numbers.

4. *Documents for Preservation.*

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

5. *Correspondence in the Field.*

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.

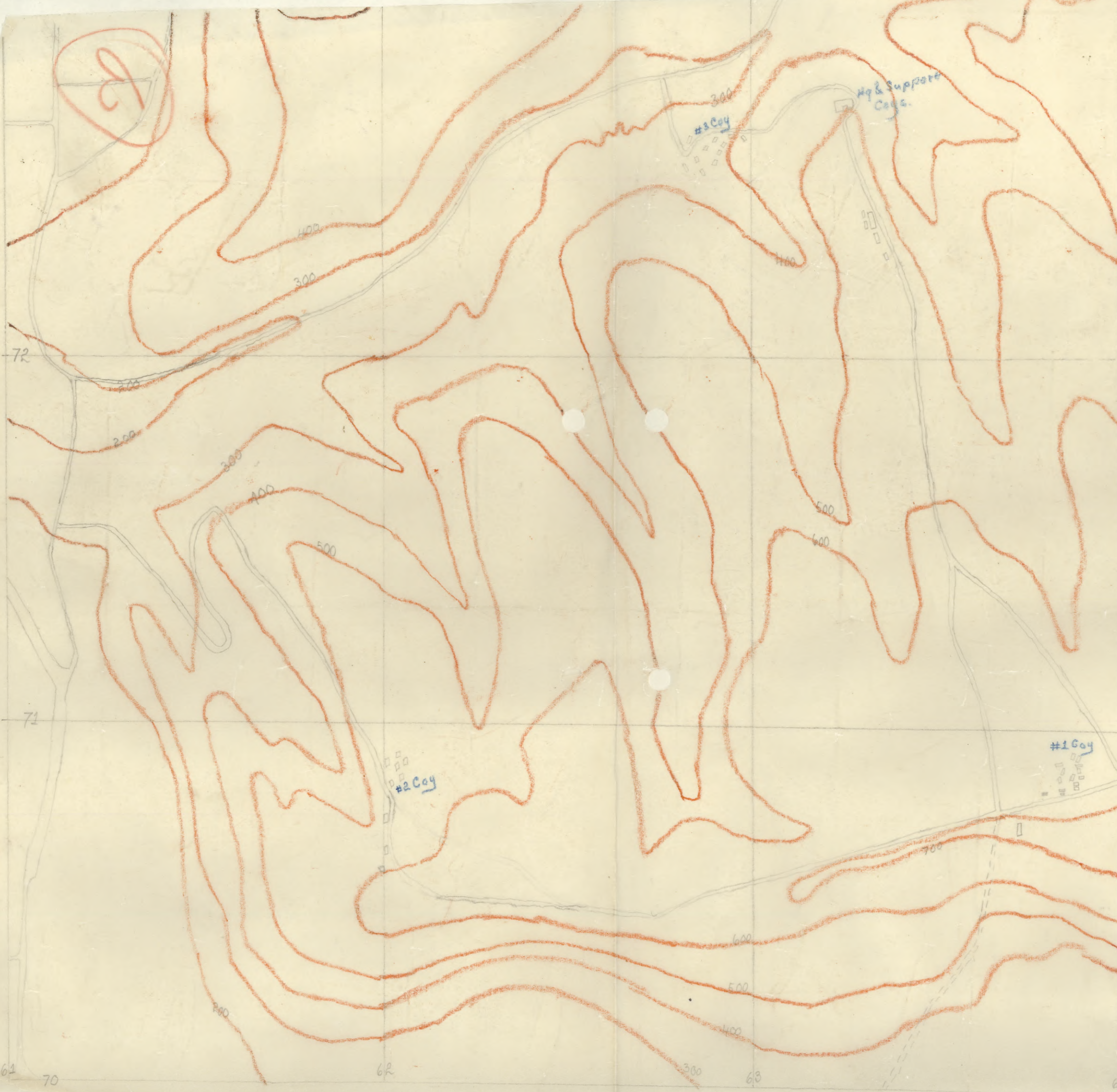

 - D - Refresher on Gas & P.A.D. subjects. Repeat T's.O.E.T.

- II
- A - Reclassify all ranks in rifle & Bren on ranges. (Bring 2nd class shots up to 1st, & select snipers)
 - B - Refresher on fieldcraft & sec control.
 - C - Preliminary hardening on assault course. (by secs.)
-
- III
- A - Battle Drill by plns of Rifle Coys.
 - B - Refresher of specialists, e.g. Sigs, Mortar, Carrier, A/T, Pioneers, etc.
 - C - Firing of all support weapons.
 - D - Tactical exercises at pln level.
-
- IV
- A - Battle Drill at Coy levels.
 - B - Tactical Exercises of Specialist gps.
 - C - Tactical Moves & Exercises by Night.
 - D - Bn tactics and Exercises.
-
5. Trg of tradesmen & n/t specialists.

Concurrently with Phases II to IV the trg of tradesmen and non-tradesmen specialists will be carried out under Bn. arrangements. Where necessary regtl schools will be organized to train required W.E. personnel.

Courses at extra-regtl schools will be utilized as directed in Div Trg Instr, (Trg/9-15) dated 12 Mar 43.

Requirements for such schools will be submitted by Coy Cmdrs to Bn HQ by 1200 hrs 19 Mar 43.

Bn. Trg. Instr. (Cont'd)

6. Coy Trg Programs

Coy Cmdrs will submit their Coy trg programs in weekly syllabus form (pro forma att'd) not later than 1000 hrs on the next preceeding Thursday.

Adequate Range allotments have been requested from Div H.Q. & Coys will be notified as soon as they are received. Adjustments of syllabuses may occur on this account.

Alternative trg subjects in the event of extreme wet weather should be readily available to Coy & Pln Cmdrs.

Allotment of assault course and local range will be made to Coys separately.

7. Responsibility for trg.

As the chief purpose of this trg is in the nature of a refresher for all ranks, it will not be necessary to attempt to segregate smaller groups whose present standard of trg may differ slightly from others. The reorganized pln will be the basic trg sub-unit.

Pln Cmdrs will therefore be responsible for the trg of their plns within the Coy trg program, under the supervision of the Coy Cmdr.

Coy Cmdrs will be fully responsible to see that the trg policy is fully carried out in accordance with their approved program. They will also see that their Coy H.Q. receives proper instr in functioning efficiently as such.

8. Trg Guidance.

Coy Cmdrs will review all Div Trg Instrs & publns referred to in Trg Instr/9-15 of 12 Mar 43. (Copy att'd) and see that their provisions are followed accurately.

Trg conferences of Coy Cmdrs will be held frequently to cover problems which may arise. First conference at 1100hrs 17 Mar in C.O.'s office.

9. General. The unit is most fortunate to be granted this period of special trg and we should welcome the opportunity to get up out of the mud and grease and get into real fighting trim. It is a great chance to renew our smartness both on parade and in the field, and we should take every opportunity to profit by it.

The keynote of this period is "Fighting Efficiency". Let everyone of us keep that objective constantly before us. Give a good example and insist on high class performance. Don't be satisfied till you get it!

Enthusiasm will work wonders - so let's all inspire the next fellow. Laugh at the griper - but offer to help him too. Don't waste trg time - it's too valuable.

Better 15 minutes smart close order drill than any 30 minutes spent 'putting in time'.

Good teamwork will win this war.

We want The Princess Louise Fusiliers to be the best fighting team in the whole Cdn Army - and with good teamwork we can be the best.

1. The following accidental deaths of Can soldiers in the UK have been reported. Had normal safety precautions been observed these particular accidents would not have occurred.

Accident No 1

One night a veh was parked on the wrong side of the rd and a number of men had gathered in front of it, obscuring the headlights. Another veh came along, going in the opposite direction, and ran into the parked veh. One man sustained such severe injuries that death resulted.

Accident No 2

A squad of men were undergoing grenade trg and during a break period two of them went for a walk. They saw a grenade lying on the ground. One man, thinking it was a dummy, picked it up. It was not a dummy and the man is now dead. Investigation disclosed that this grenade was a bling from a trg exercise and had not been accounted for, disposed of or marked in any manner.

Accident No 3

Two men were fooling in the barrack room. They picked up their rifles and made threatening gestures at one another. The rifle of one was loaded, was discharged, and killed the other man.

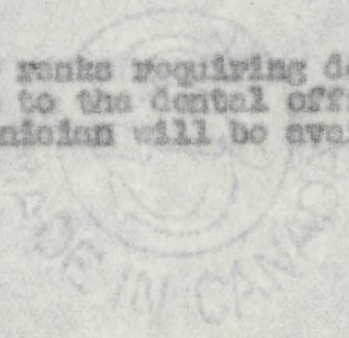

4. LOUSINESS AND TYPHUS

4-A

1. History shows that continental wars have been accompanied by outbreaks of EPIDEMIC TYPHUS FEVER. These have already occurred in Europe, in this war, with a high mortality. This form of Typhus is spread only by lice - usually and evidence of neglect and overcrowding.

2. The preventing of lousiness is a regimental responsibility. It may be ensured by regular body inspection and bathing, of unit personnel, and cleanliness of wearing apparel, blankets, pallasses etc. One infested man in a unit is a menace to all.

3. When a case of louse infestation occurs, the man and his immediate contacts will be treated by the Regimental Medical Offr, and disinfection of billets and clothing, etc, will be carried out in accordance with the principles set down in the Handbook of Military Hygiene, 1941.

4. Infested or suspected clothing, blankets, pallasses, etc, involving not more than six men at one time may be disinfected by arrangement with Field Ambulances, Field Hygiene Sections, or such fixed establishments as may be locally notified. Infested clothing, etc, in quantities not greater than one truck-load may be sent to a Field Hygiene Section or fixed disinfector with a working-party to handle same. Where numbers of blankets, clothing, etc., in excess of the above require disinfection, Field Hygiene Sections can arrange to have a mobile disinfector operate within the unit area as required. Also where local bathing facilities are inadequate, one or more sections of a Mobile Bath Unit can be utilized in the unit area in conjunction with a disinfector. Treatment of the infested men will remain a responsibility of the Regimental Medical Offr.

5. Regular washing of personal clothing and blankets as a measure for the prevention of lousiness is important.

6. Woollen clothing being liable to permanent creasing if not promptly dried upon removal from a steam disinfector it will be the responsibility of the unit whose equipment is being disinfested to provide a work party to undertake shaking and folding of the clothing, etc.

2. PERSONAL HYGIENE
2-A

1. Recently there has been a decided increase in the incidence of louse infestation and of scabies. This condition indicates a need of more attention to personal hygiene.
2. No Army can afford wastage of manpower from preventable conditions and it is imperative, therefore, that a high standard of personal hygiene be maintained among all ranks.
3. The extent to which the rules of personal hygiene are observed depends largely on the standard of discipline and man-management in any Unit.
4. While the unit Medical Officer is the expert adviser on these matters, the CO of each unit is responsible that action is taken so far as practicable under conditions obtaining from time to time to provide for:-

- Regular baths
- Control of lousiness
- Care of the feet
- Sterilization of eating utensils, etc.

5. It is particularly important that lousiness be reduced to a minimum as typhus fever is spread by the louse.

3. DISINFECTION AND DISINFESTATION OF BLANKETS
3-A

1. Personnel who are evacuated to Medical Units will carry with them only one blanket, all others in possession will be returned to Unit Quartermaster Stores.
2. In cases of communicable disease, including, Scabies and Pediculosis, the unit Quartermaster will arrange for the disinfection or disinfection of the blankets before re-issue. This will be carried out by the nearest Cdn Fd Hyg Section. (Fd Amb or CCSS may be used for small numbers if more conveniently situated).
3. When blankets cannot be disinfected for immediate return to the Unit, arrangements have been made for the Medical Unit to reimburse the unit concerned, by the issue of corresponding number of blankets from their stores. The unit blankets will then be taken into store by the Medical Unit upon completion of disinfection or disinfection.

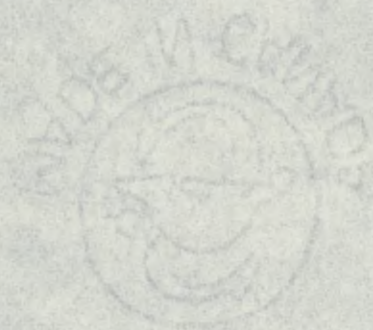
