Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

1. A War Diary is **SECRET**.

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.

4. Post-war disposal will be as under:

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mobn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

(i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary.

(ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.

(iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.

(iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:— Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

(v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.

(vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

1. *Titles and Numbering of Files.*

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned

2. *Date reference.*

In giving communications a reference number, it is convenient to use the date system of four figures indicating day and month, e.g. 0102 for 1st February; 3010 for 30th October.

3. *Combined Numeration.*

If the systems outlined in paras 1 and 2 are combined, by placing the four date figures under the subject file numbers, a simple and informative method of reference results, thus

$$\begin{array}{r} 2-6-1 \\ \hline 0804 \end{array}$$

might be immediately identified as a communication dealing with replacement of gas masks, dated 8th April.

NOTE.—This method is not applicable to signal messages, A.F.C. 2128, which bear serial numbers 1 to 9999. The use of dashes eliminates confusion between serial numbers and file numbers.

4. *Documents for Preservation.*

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

5. *Correspondence in the Field.*

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.

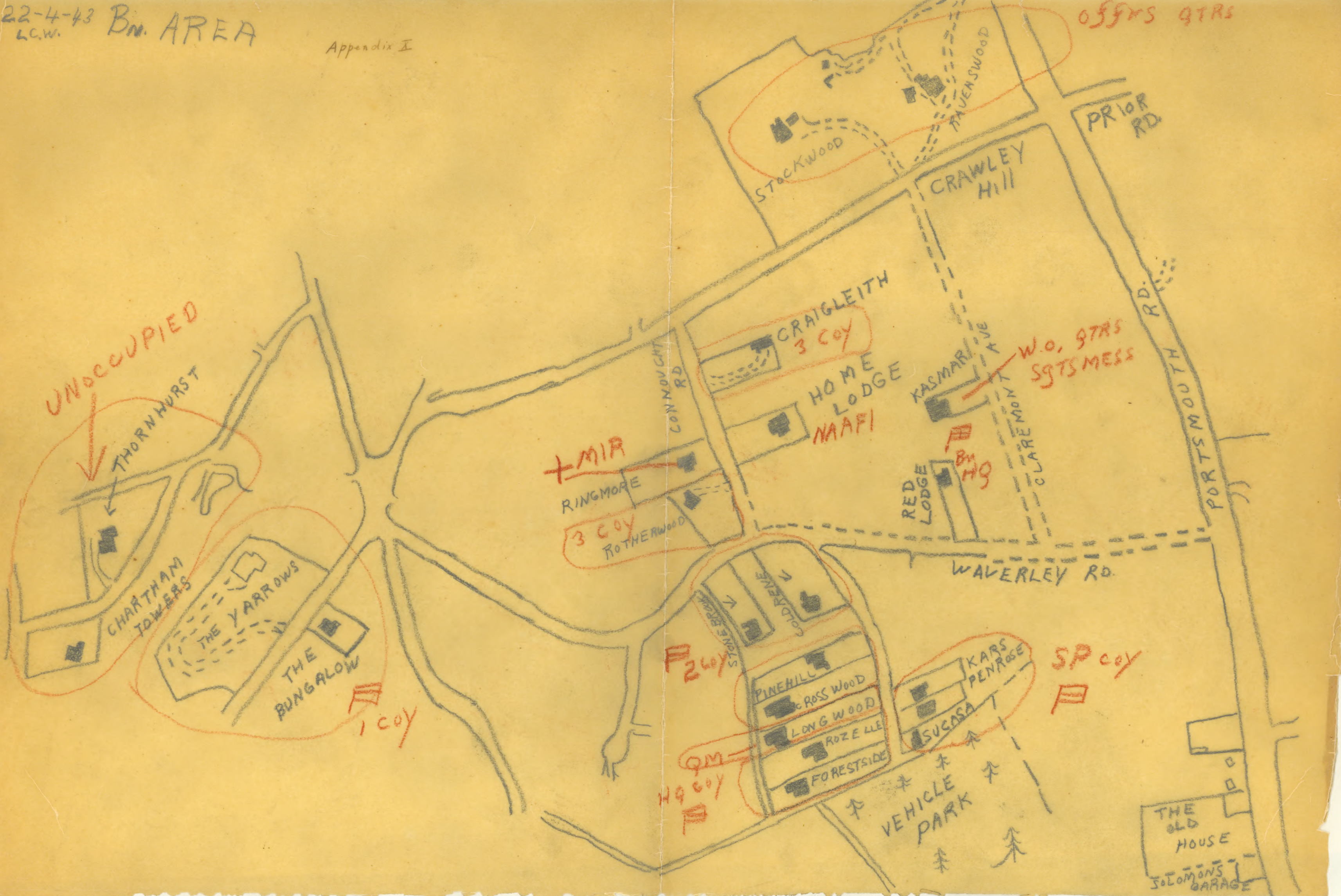

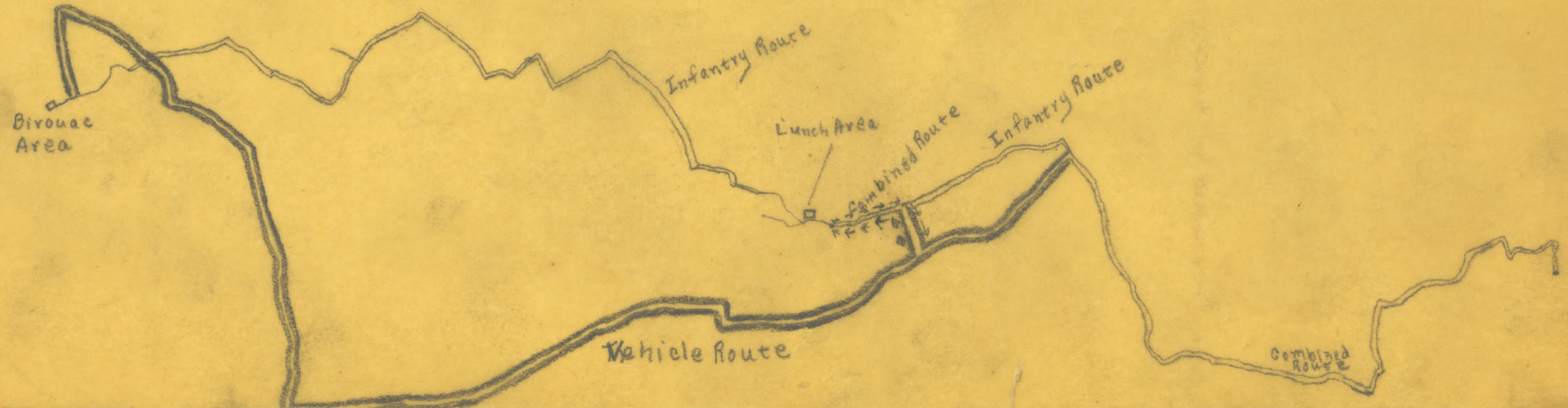

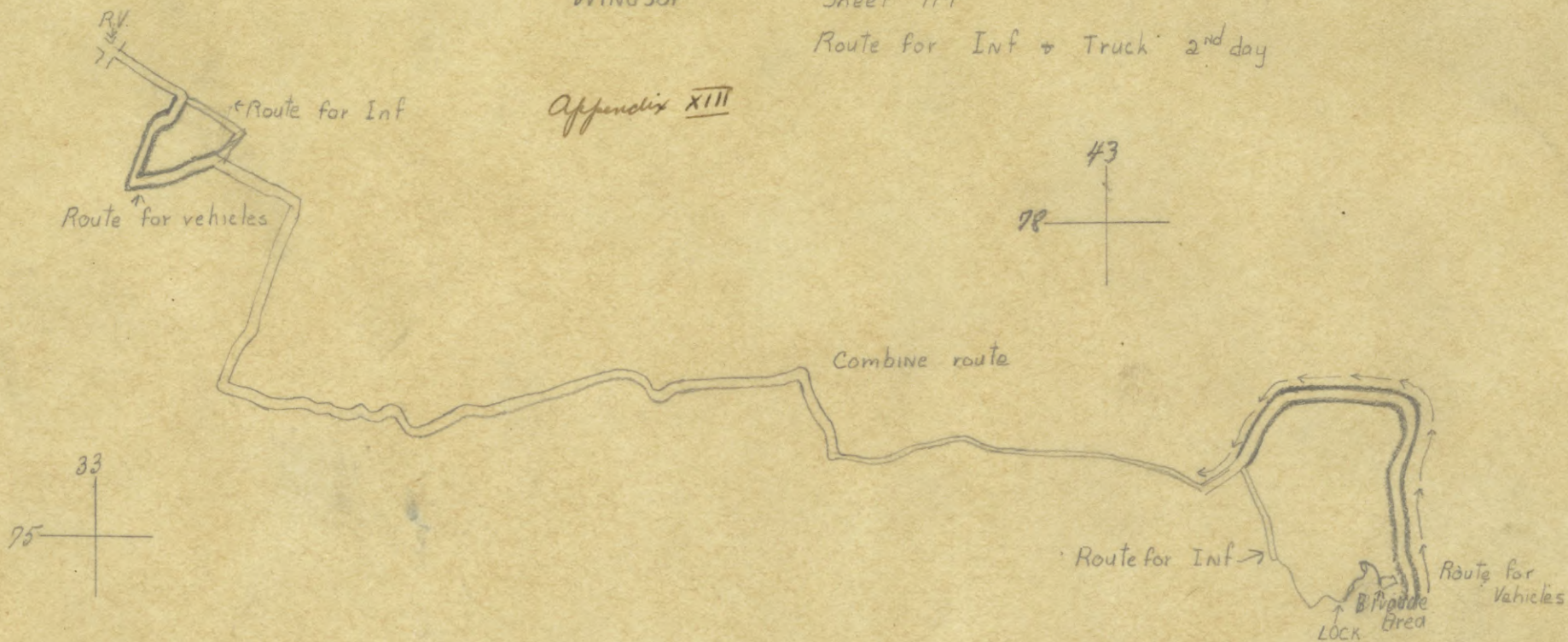

In the meantime we greatly appreciate the courtesies and hospitality of the citizens of Halifax in England and trust that this visit will forge yet another link in that chain of friendship which joins our two cities.

A delegation of two officers and 20 other ranks left the unit lines 8 Apr 43 and proceeded by train through London to Halifax, Yorkshire, on a good-will tour. Correspondence for the official visit was carried on between Lieut.-Col. H.S. Robinson and Mayor Oddy, as well as the president of the Halifax Rotary Club.

On arrival at the railway station in Halifax, the army party was welcomed officially by the mayor and president of the Rotary club, and went to an hotel to a banquet, the ~~hon~~ guests of the service organization. At the banquet, the members of the unit were introduced to the residents of the city with whom they were to live for the duration of their stay.

An interesting note on the evening's entertainment was a statement by the president of the club that the gong used to call the gathering to order was a gift of the Rotary club of Halifax, Nova Scotia.

After a great night's sleep between white sheets on the softest beds many of the boys had slept on in nearly four years, the group was taken on a short tour of the historic market-place on 9th Apr 43. They then were escorted in small groups through a large woollen mill. Immediately following an official welcome by the Mayor at the city hall at noon and a banquet ~~there~~, the City Water Works committee whisked the party and their hosts off in two large buses on a tour of the water supply, a trip which enabled the boys to get a good picture of the surrounding countryside. Strangely enough, at the home at the water works, there was no water, so everybody had to drink

either whiskey or beer. On the return to the city, the party was again the guests of the Rotary club at tea in one of the city's restaurants and during the evening were entertained at a dance conducted by the Army units stationed in the city.

On 10th Apr, the morning was left open, so that the hosts of the various guests could take them through their own factories, business houses or plants, some of which were engaged in important war work. Other members of the party accepted the invitation of the garrison adjutant and attended a smart inspection of a local unit.

After a lunch with the civic authorities, the visitors attended an English soccer match. The boys from the unit got a lesson in the game--and so did the Halifax team. Huddersfield beat them, 2-0. In the evening, the army group again were the guests of the Rotary, at a stage show.

The following day, Sunday, the members of the unit were again the guests of their individual hosts and spent the time in many different ways. Some did a little sight-seeing, on foot, others played golf and a few just got a little exercise in elbow bending.

On 12th Apr 43, after a final farewell address by Mayor Oddy, the group left to return to the unit, ~~bringing~~ bringing with them a very high regard for the hospitality and friendliness of the people of Yorkshire. During their stay, all enjoyed at least once, a taste of real home-produced Yorkshire pudding. Speaking on behalf of the citizens of the city in general, the mayor said that Halifax, Yorks, would be only too glad to see many other members of the unit on their leaves.

Providing an interesting touch to the entire visit was the fact that two photographers from Canadian Army Headquarters, somewhere in England, arrived on the scene and followed the group about ~~thru~~ throughout the entire trip. One photographer made a news reel of the affair, and copies of the film will have by now been sent to Halifax, Nova Scotia, the unit and the Rotary club in Halifax, York, as well as the city hall there.

The other photographer took many still pictures which will be presented shortly to the unit and be kept in army files to commemorate the enjoyable break in the routine of army existence.

Appendix 'A' to Part I Daily Order No. 159 dated 22 Apr 43.

1. Each Coy will have a fire picquet of one NCO and seven men who will remain in barracks at night and receive instructions each evening at blackout time. Fire picquet for day will be detailed from personnel working in bldg.
2. There will be two fire points in each building occupied by personnel. The said fire points in each building will consist of one ladder, two stirrup pumps, one sand bag, three water containers painted white with F-I-R-E in red lettering. These fire points will be located by the Unit Fire Prevention Officer.
3. All the Coys will post in a prominent place a list showing the various fire points (location of fire equipment). This list must be brought to the notice of all personnel quartered in house.
4. A fire alarm (an iron triangle with hammer if possible to obtain) should be placed by all Coys in a prominent place to be sounded by the person discovering fire.
5. Fire fighting equipment is to be used for no other purpose than fire fighting, nor is it to be removed from its allotted position without authority of the Unit Fire Prevention Officer.
6. ✓ If NCO in charge of fire picquet immediately decides that he is unable to extinguish fire himself or has tried to extinguish it and failed to do so, he will take instant action by calling the Camberley Fire Department at Camberley 1254. If not near a civilian phone - the call to the Fire Department will be made by Don V to signaller on duty at Bn HQ who will call the Fire Department.

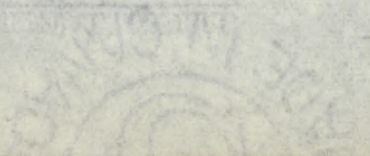

SECURITY OF OFFICIAL INFORMATION

1. All members of a Headquarters, including all signal operators, signal office personnel and drivers of Headquarters cars are reminded that they are employed in a position of trust and are, therefore, under an obligation of secrecy.

2. No military information which may come to a person's knowledge as a result of employment at a Headquarters will be communicated to any person NOT employed at such Headquarters, except when necessary in the performance of duty. Information which may seem quite trivial may possibly give a clue to important military matters, with disastrous results to our Forces. Every one, therefore, will make a definite rule NOT to mention any phase of their work to any person or to discuss any phase of their work to any person or to discuss any phase of their work with any other member of the staff, when there is any possibility of being overheard. Particular discretion will be observed when talking on the telephone with regard to military affairs. Signal operators and signal office personnel, likewise all drivers of Headquarters cars, are warned that any conversation regarding military matters they may overhear during the performance of their duties must be treated as secret and confidential.

3. Members of a Headquarters will NOT communicate confidential or secret information to other members of the staff unless it is necessary for the proper performance of their duties.

4. The following are relevant extracts from the Official Secrets Act 1911 (M.M.L. p. 895) as amended by the Official Secrets Act, 1920 (M.M.L. p. 900) which Acts of the United Kingdom apply to personnel of the Canadian Army (Overseas).

I. A person is guilty of a felony and liable to penal servitude for a term of fourteen years who for any purpose prejudicial to the safety or interests of the State,

- (a) Makes any sketch, photograph, plan, model or note which is calculated to be or might be or is intended to be directly or indirectly useful to the enemy;
- (b) Obtains, records, publishes, or communicates to any other person any secret official code word or password, or any sketch, photograph, plan, model, article or note or other document or information which is calculated to be or might be or is intended to be directly or indirectly useful to any enemy;

II. A person is guilty of a misdemeanour and liable to imprisonment for a term of two years who,

- (d) Fails to take reasonable care of or so conducts himself as to endanger the safety of any sketch, photograph, plan, model, article, note, document or information.

1. It is notified for information that para 5 of Defence Regulations provides that no officer or other rank shall, unless acting in the course of duty in His Majesty's Services, make any photograph of, or of any part of, any object:-

(a) In any such area in the United Kingdom as may be specified by order of a competent authority, being an area in relation to which the restriction of photography appears to that competent authority to be expedient in the interests of the defence of the realm, or

(b) In any prohibited place within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act, 1911; M.M.L.; page 895, as amended by the Official Secrets Act, 1920, M.M.L., page 960, that is:-

(i) Any work of defence, arsenal, navy, military or air force establishment or station, factory, dockyard, mine, minefield, camp, ship or aircraft belonging to or occupied by or on behalf of His Majesty, or any telegraph, telephone, wireless, or signal station, or office so belonging or occupied, and any place belonging to or occupied by or on behalf of His Majesty and used for the purpose of building; repairing, making or storing any munitions, or sketches, plans, models or documents relating thereto, or for the purpose of getting any metals, oil, or minerals of use in time of war;

(ii) Any place not belonging to His Majesty where any munitions of war or any sketches, models, plans or documents relating thereto are being made, repaired, gotten or stored under contract with, or with any person on behalf of His Majesty, or otherwise on behalf of His Majesty; and

(iii) any place belonging to or used for the purpose of His Majesty which is for the time being declared by order of a Secretary of State to be a prohibited place for the purposes of this section on the ground that information with respect thereto, or damage thereto, would be useful to an enemy; and

(iv) any railway, road, way or channel, or other means of communication by land or water (including any works or structures being part thereof or connected therewith), or any place used for gas, water, or electricity works or other works for purposes of a public character, or any place where any munitions of war or any sketches, models, plans or documents relating thereto; are being made, repaired or stored otherwise than on behalf of His Majesty which is for the time being declared by order of a Secretary of State to be a prohibited area for the purposes of this section, on the ground that information with respect thereto; or interference therewith, would be useful to the enemy.

2. Photography - Control of (Cont'd)

2. It is to be noted that military hospitals, headquarters, barracks, billets, camp and quarters are included in the above-mentioned definition of prohibited places.

3. Officers and other ranks, except when they are acting in the performance of their duty, shall not take any photograph of the following subjects as enumerated in Para. 1 of the Control of Photography Order (No. 1), 1939. The term duty shall be strictly interpreted by Commanding Officers. The taking of so called "Unit record pictures" for War Diary or other purposes shall not be regarded as a matter of duty, except for the official accredited military photographers on establishments of formations headquarters. Control of Photography Order (No. 1) 1939, enumerates the following subjects:-

- (a) Any fortification, battery, searchlight, listening post or other work of defence.
- (b) Any aerodrome or seaplane station.
- (c) Any assembly of any of His Majesty's forces.
- (d) Any barracks, encampment or building occupied or in course of preparation for occupation by any of His Majesty's forces.
- (e) Any arsenal, factory, magazine or stores for munitions of war, arms, equipment or supplies.
- (f) Any wireless, telegraph, telephone, signal or cable station.
- (g) Any dock, caisson, dockyard, harbour, ship-building works or loading.
- (h) Any vessel of war either complete or under construction, or any vessel or vehicle engaged in the transport of supplies or personnel.
- (i) Any aircraft or the wreckage of any aircraft.
- (j) Any building structure, vessel or other property damaged by enemy action.
- (k) Any hospital or station at which casualties, whether civilian or otherwise are treated; any ambulance or convoy of injured persons, or any injured person.
- (l) Any electricity, gas or water works, or any gasometer or reservoir, or any oil store.
- (m) Any assembly of persons for the purpose of transport or evacuation, or any temporary camp or other accommodation or transport vehicles used for the purpose of evacuation.
- (n) Any riotous or disorderly assembly, or premises, or other property damaged in the course of such an assembly.
- (o) Any roads or railways exclusively connected with works of defence.

4. Where it is desired to obtain, for unit records, photographs of subjects enumerated in para. 1, control of photography order (No. 1), 1939, as above, applications shall be made to the Public Relations Officer of the formation concerned for the services of an official military photographer.

5. Any photograph or photographic negative or photographic film which any officer, soldier, attached civilian or employee of the Canadian Army Overseas desires to send out of the United Kingdom will be contained in an envelope or wrapper plainly marked "photograph".

6. Registration of cameras - All ranks in possession of cameras will register them with the Headquarters of the formation or unit to which they are attached. It will be the responsibility of formation or unit commanders that a list of all ranks in possession of cameras is maintained in their Headquarters.

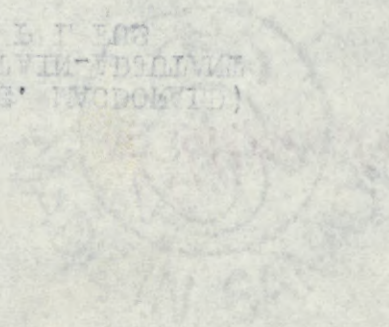
