**Instructions for Compilation and Despatch**

**1. A War Diary is SECRET.**

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.

4. Post-war disposal will be as under:

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

TriPLICATE—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mdn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary.
- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:—  
Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

(v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed.  
Meteorological notes.

(vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

## UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

### 1. Titles and Numbering of Files.

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned.

### 2. Date reference.

In giving communications a reference number, it is convenient to use the date system of four figures indicating day and month, e.g. 0102 for 1st February; 3010 for 30th October.

### 3. Combined Numeration.

If the systems outlined in paras 1 and 2 are combined, by placing the four date figures under the subject file numbers, a simple and informative method of reference results, thus

might be immediately identified as a communication dealing with replacement of gas masks, dated 8th April.

NOTE.—This method is not applicable to signal messages, A.F.C. 2128, which bear serial numbers 1 to 9999. The use of dashes eliminates confusion between serial numbers and file numbers.

### 4. Documents for Preservation.

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

### 5. Correspondence in the Field.

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.

SECURITY OF OFFICIAL INFORMATION

1. All members of a Headquarters, including all signal operators, signal office personnel and drivers of Headquarters cars are reminded that they are employed in a position of trust and are, therefore, under an obligation of secrecy.
2. No military information which may come to a person's knowledge as a result of employment at a Headquarters will be communicated to any person NOT employed at such Headquarters, except when necessary in the performance of duty. Information which may seem quite trivial may possibly give a clue to important military matters, with disastrous results to our forces. Everyone therefore, will make a definite rule NOT to mention any phase of their work to any person or to discuss any phase of their work with another member of the staff, when there is any possibility of being overheard. Particular discretion will be observed when talking on the telephone with regard to military affairs. Signal operators and signal office personnel, likewise all drivers of Headquarters cars, are warned that any conversations regarding military matters they may overhear during the performance of their duties must be treated as secret and confidential.
3. Members of a Headquarters will NOT communicate confidential or secret information to other members of the staff unless it is necessary for the proper performance of their duties.
4. The following are relevant extracts from the Official Secrets Act, 1911 (M.M.L. p. 895) and amended by the Official Secrets Act, 1920 (M.M.L. p. 900) which Acts of the United Kingdom apply to personnel of the Canadian Army (Overseas).
  - I. A person is guilty of a felony and liable to penal servitude for a term of fourteen years who for any purpose prejudicial to the safety or interests of the State,
    - (a) Makes any sketch, photograph, plan, model or note which is calculated to be or might be or is intended to be directly or indirectly useful to the enemy;
    - (b) Obtains, records, publishes, or communicates to any other person any secret official code word or pass word or any sketch, photograph, plan model, article or note or other document or information which is calculated to be or might be or is intended to be directly or indirectly useful to any enemy;
  - II. A person is guilty of a misdemeanour and liable to imprisonment for a term of two years who,
    - (a) Having in his possession any code word, pass word, sketch photograph, plan model, document or information, communicates such code word, pass word, sketch, photograph, plan, model document or information to any person, other than a person to whom he is authorized to communicate it, or a person to whom it is in the interest of the state his duty to communicate it;
    - (b) Uses the information in his possession for the benefit of any foreign power or in any other manner prejudicial to the safety or interests of the State;
    - (c) Retains any sketch, photograph, plan, model, article, note or document in his possession or control of when he has no right to retain it or when it is contrary to his duty to retain it, or fails to comply with all directions issued by lawful authority with regard to the return or disposal thereof;
    - (d) Fails to take reasonable care of or so conducts himself as to endanger the safety of any sketch, photograph, plan model, article, note, document or information.

PHOTOGRAPHY - CONTROL OF

1. It is notified for information that para. 5 of Defence Regulations provides that no officer or other rank shall, unless acting in the course of duty in His Majesty's Service, make any photograph of, or any part of, any object :-

- (a) In any such area in the United Kingdom as may be specified by order of a competent authority, being an area in relation to which the restriction of photography appears to that competent authority to be expedient in the interests of the defence of the realm, or
- (b) In any prohibited place within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act, 1911; M.M.L., page 895, as amended by the Official Secrets Act, 1930, M.M.L., page 900, that is:-
- (i) Any work of defense, arsenal, navy, military or airforce establishments or station, factory, dockyard, mine, mine-field, camp, ship or aircraft belonging to or occupied by or on behalf of His Majesty, or any telegraph, telephone, wireless or signal station, or office so belonging or occupied, and any place belonging to or occupied by or on behalf of His Majesty and used for the purpose of building, repairing, making or storing any munitions of war, or any sketches, plans, models, or documents relating thereto, or for the purpose of getting any metals, oil, or minerals of use in time of war;
  - (ii) any place not belonging to His Majesty where any munitions of war or any sketches, models, plans or documents relating thereto are being made, repaired, gotten or stored under contract with, or with any person on behalf of his Majesty; and
  - (iii) any place belonging to or used for the purposes of His Majesty which is for the time being declared by order of a Secretary of State to be a prohibited place for the purposes of this section on the ground that information with respect thereto, or damage thereto, would be useful to an enemy; and
  - (iv) any railway, road, way or channel or other means of communication by land or water(including) any works or structures being part thereof or connected therewith, or any place used for gas, water, or electricity works or other works for purposes of a public character, or any place where any munitions of war, or any sketches, models, plans or documents relating thereto, are being made, repaired or stored otherwise than on behalf of His Majesty which is for the time being declared by order of a Secretary of State to be a prohibited place for the purposes of this section, on the ground that information with respect thereto, or the destruction or obstruction thereof, or interference therewith, would be useful to an enemy.

2. It is to be noted that military hospitals, headquarters, barracks, billets, camp and quarters are included in the above-mentioned definition of prohibited places.

3. Officers and other ranks, except when they are acting in the performance of their duty, shall not take any photographs of the following subjects as enumerated in para. 1 of the Control of Photography Order (No. 1), 1939. The term duty shall be strictly interpreted by Commanding Officers. The taking of so-called "Unit record pictures" for War Diary or other purposes shall not be regarded as a matter of "duty" except for the Official accredited military photographers on establishments or formation Headquarters.

Control of Photography Order No. 1, 1939, enumerates the following subjects : -

- (a) Any fortifications, battery, searchlight, listening post or other work of defence.
- (b) Any aerodrome or seaplane station.
- (c) Any assembly of any of His Majesty's forces.
- (d) Any barracks, encampment or building occupied or in course of preparation for occupation by any of His Majesty's Forces.
- (e) Any arsenal, factory, magazine or stores for munitions of war, arms, equipment or supplies.
- (f) Any wireless, telegraph, telephone, signal or cable station.
- (g) Any dock, caisson, dockyard, harbour, ship-building works or loading pier.
- (h) Any vessel of war either complete or under construction, or any vessel or vehicle engaged in the transport of supplies or personnel.
- (i) Any aircraft or the wreckage of any aircraft.
- (j) Any building structure, vessel or other object damaged by enemy action.
- (k) Any hospital or station at which casualties, whether civil or otherwise are treated; any ambulance or convoy of injured persons, or injured person.
- (l) Any electricity, gas or water works; or any gasometer or any reservoir, or any oil stores.
- (m) Any assembly of persons for the purpose of transport or evacuation, or any temporary camp or other accommodation or transport vehicles used for the purpose of evacuation.
- (n) Any riotous or disorderly assembly, or premises, or other object damaged in the course of such an assembly.
- (o) Any roads, or railways exclusively connected with works of defence.

4. Where it is desired to obtain, for unit records, photographs of subjects enumerated in para 1, Control of Photography Order No. 1, 1939, as above, applications shall be made to the Public Relations Officer of the formation concerned for the services of an official military photographer.

5. Any photograph or photographic negatives or photographic film which any officer, soldier, attached civilian or employee of the Canadian Army Overseas desires to send out of the U.K. will be contained in an envelope or wrapper plainly marked "photograph".

6. Registration of Cameras - All ranks in possession of cameras will register them with the Headquarters of the formation or unit to which they are attached. It will be the responsibility of formation and unit commanders that a list of all ranks in possession of cameras is maintained in their Headquarters.

1. Protection against gas is the responsibility of the individual - for vapour adjust facepiece, for liquid or spray carry out personal decontamination.
2. If the camp is sprayed with blister gas, each individual must protect himself by applying P.D. If however, he becomes drenched with blister gas, he should go to the gas cleansing centre and be decontaminated by the staff.
3. If the camp is bombed by blister gas, those who have been splashed by the liquid will report to the Gas cleansing centre.
4. If the camp is bombed by any other gas, do not go to the G.C.C. but gain protection with the facepiece immediately.
5. Choking gases are lethal - protection must be gained in 15 seconds or casualties will result. Remember - 15 seconds!
6. The Gas Cleansing Centre(back of NAAFI) is clearly marked as such by a visible sign and entrance and exit signs are also in place.
7. The Staff of the Gas Cleansing Centre know their job so simply report to them and they will look after you.
8. Unexploded bombs will immediately be reported at once to the Unit Orderly Room or Gas Officer(Lieut. F.A. Neal) who will deal with them through the proper channels.
9. When and if the enemy uses gas of any kind, dress for all ranks will be helmets, eyeshields and capes.

- (b) ON AIR RAID WARNING "ALERT" - By day, A.D. Officer will go  
to Comd Post and A.D. Personnel outside barracks will return.  
Lookouts will take up their stations. Other personnel continue  
normal duties.  
ON AIR RAID WARNING "ALERT" - By night, A.D. Officer, Air Raid  
Wardens, Lookouts, Intercomm party and runners will go to their  
posts. All other v.P.A.D. personnel remain in bed. Lookouts and  
Air Raid Wardens will patrol their areas till the "WHITE" Signal  
(All Clear). When Air Raid Warning sounds at night, sentries or  
lookouts will pass the warning on by a series of short whistle  
blasts. On the alarm being given, the A.D. Officer will ensure that  
all A.D. Personnel proceed to their posts. Personnel in the open

will wear steel helmets and respirators at the front. They will take cover at the discretion of the A.D. Officer.

(c) The Regt'l Fir Party - consisting of one NCO and 8 ORS will mount at 1900 hrs daily. They will be instructed as the Unit Fire Picquet and will be confined to Barracks during their weeks tour of duty. All ranks should know the location of fire-fighting equip.

(d) Other A.D. Personnel are not confined to bks but will return on an alert being sounded.

(e) On receipt of Air Raid "All Clear" if any bombs have been dropped, a recce will be made of the camp so a report can be made to Bde HQ.

6. SYSTEM OF ALARMS - The civilian system will be utilized and spread by the camp sentries by whistle.

7. ACTION BY TROOPS - (a) Action will vary with Day or Night raids. Commanders on the spot will take charge at once and give orders for immediate action.

(b) DISPERSION - This is a key point and must be observed and practised. Any body of troops adequately dispersed presents a poor target and obviates the possibility of a large number of personnel being harmed by one bomb. Concentrations in messes, lecture-rooms, etc, will disperse and proceed to quarters, slit trenches or other cover as ordered. Soldiers in towns will get away from main streets. Those near Bks return.

(c) Use of slit trenches - Tps will not normally use slit trenches about camp. However, if things look dangerous, the officer in command will make the decision to use the slit trenches.

(d) If Air Attack seems imminent by day, comds., will see that all tps in open wear steel helmets with respirators at the alert. By night there will be no movement except by A.D. Personnel.

8. LIGHTING RESTRICTIONS - Blackout hours appear in daily Orders - they will be strictly observed.

9. OFFICERS - In the event of a bad Air Raid, Officers should see that they distribute themselves among the men in order to encourage them, etc, and help maintain discipline and morale.

10. DETECTORS GAS, SPRAY - Sentries in veh park will check detectors spray every ten minutes during an Air Raid and report any discolouration to the Comd Post.

11. DETAILED ORDERS - (a) Detailed orders for A.D. personnel are shown in attached appendices. Copies of these appendices will be placed in each post or centre.  
(b) Appendices are (A) Duties of A.D. Offr; (B) F.A.P. Staff;  
(C) F.A. Party, (D) Wounded Cleansing Centre Staff, (E) Gas Defence Staff, (F) Unit Rescue Party, (G) Unwounded Cleansing Centre.

## APPENDIX "A" --- POSSINGWORTH PARK AIR DEFENCE SCHEME

### A.D. OFFICER - DUTIES

#### LOCATION AND POST - A.D. HEADQUARTERS.

- DUTIES (1) During Air Raid he will mark on the intelligence map the location and type of damage in his area, and inform Bde H.Q. immediately any incident occurs.  
(2) By telephone and orderly runner he will guide the work of rescue, firefighting, repair, etc. He will keep in constant touch with the situation and be prepared to report on it to his commander at any time.  
(3) After "Raiders Past" message he will carry out a rapid reccce of the Area to ascertain the damage done and whether detectors, gas spray have turned colour.  
(4) After a raid he will prepare an intelligence report covering details of casualties, damage done etc.  
(5) He will keep in touch with neighbouring units with a view to co-operation and will pass on to them information concerning gas, decontamination or other matters which may affect them.  
(6) He will see that Cleansing Centres, Gas Defence Centres, Fire-Fighting set-up, etc., are held in a state of readiness at all times and are at all times prepared for an emergency use.  
(7) To inspect the A.D. personnel at 1900 hrs each day if he considers it necessary on the strength thereof and the knowledge of duties.

## APPENDIX "B" --- POSSINGWORTH PARK AIR DEFENCE SCHEME

### FIRST AID POST

LOCATION - Medical Inspection Room.

Strength of Staff - 1 N.C.O. and 4 O.R.

DUTIES - To proceed to the casualties as rapidly as possible, render such first aid as is urgently required i.e., to dress a hemorrhage, apply splints to fractures, dressings to wounds etc., They will remove gas contaminated clothing and equipment, direct or carry casualties to the F.A.P.

## APPENDIX "D" --- POSSINGWORTH PARK AIR DEFENCE SCHEME

### WOUNDED CLEANSING CENTRE

LOCATION - M.I.R.

Strength of Staff - 1 N.C.O. and 1 O.R.

EQUIPMENT Personal - light A/G suits, rubber knee boots, gloves and respirators at the alert unless gas smelt. The O.R. in charge of bleach treatment and eye douche will wear eyeshields, light A/G suit, and rubber boots with his respirator near at hand. The O.R. in charge of issue clothing will wear ordinary clothing.

DUTIES - The N.C.O. is the official in charge of the Cleansing Centre and is responsible in a state of emergency (i.e. Air Raid), that the Centre is ready for instant use. He will supervise generally the "dirty" side of the Clean and Dirty line, detailing each person for the requisite treatment and ensuring that contaminated clothes are placed in A/G bags as soon as possible. After the centre has been used he will arrange for the despatch of clothing and equipment to be decontaminated and for return of valuables to the owners. He will supervise the decontamination of the Centre, replacement of necessary clothing and equipment and replenishment of bleach pastes etc. He will receive them in a bag with identifying number, giving the owner a duplicate tallying number. The O.R. will be detailed in charge of bleach treatment and shower baths, will issue towels and give eye douche treatments.

He will be responsible for the issue of fresh clothing, etc., to decontaminated personnel.

#### APPENDIX "E" -- POSSINGWORTH PARK AIR DEFENCE SCHEME

##### GAS DEFENCE CENTRE

LOCATION - Q.M. Stores.

Strength of staff - 1 N.C.O. and 5 O.R. If called to a task, will dress in under clothes and A/G clothing held in readiness for them. The leader of each squad will ensure that personnel are properly dressed. Squads will perform such tasks as are assigned to them by A.D. Officer. These may include the railing or roping off of contaminated bldgs., or areas general decontamination of bldgs., equipment, materials, etc. On completion of such tasks, squads will return to Gas Defence Centre and there carry out such decontamination as may be necessary. As soon as possible the N.C.O. will supervise the decontamination of all tools and stores and their return to stores. The N.C.O. is in charge of the Defence Centre and will supervise Staff and equipment. Responsible that Gas Defence Centre is ready for immediate use in case of emergency, that contaminated clothing is placed in A/G bags for despatch to proper authorities. One O.R. will supervise cleansing room. He will assist in bleach treatment. One O.R. will supervise procedure and issue of clean clothes. One O.R. will act as storeman for decont. of tools and equipment.

#### APPENDIX "F" -- POSSINGWORTH PARK AIR DEFENCE SCHEME

##### RESCUE PARTY

LOCATION - Q.M. Stores.

Strength - 1 N.C.O. and 6 O.R. will be equipped with shovels, picks, crowbars, etc. for rescuing trapped personnel from bombed buildings. They will wear ordinary dress unless ordered otherwise.

#### APPENDIX "G" -- POSSINGWORTH PARK AIR DEFENCE SCHEME

##### UNWOUNDED CLEANSING CENTRE

LOCATION - Bathouse (H.Q. Coy).

Strength - 1 N.C.O. and 1 O.R. to supervise personnel in carrying out their own personnel decontamination.

#### APPENDIX "H" -- POSSINGWORTH PARK AIR DEFENCE SCHEME

##### LOOKOUTS

LOCATION - Usual Camp Guard sentry posts.

Duties - To report to command post damage by H.E. bombs-- position and extent of damage. To take steps to deal with incendiary bombs by notifying fire picquet or occupants of buildings. To report locality and extent of fires to both fire party and command post. Duties will be performed by one sentry from each post as one must at all times be on the post. This is made possible by doubling the guard.
