

EXERCISE "SCAVENGER"

7

1. Exercise SCAVENGER will be carried out by all available personnel of #2 Coy, P L Fus, between 0800 hrs and 1700 hrs 12 May 43.
2. The purposes of the exercise will be:
  - (a) To practise personnel in gathering of information.
  - (b) To provide information for exercise "LOOKAROUND".
  - (c) To practise personnel on map-using.
  - (d) To test initiative.
3. The area will slightly exceed, but cover completely that laid down in 7-22/4CAD/1 May 43 for the unit. The purpose of exceeding the area is to divide it into six equal arcs, and sub-divide each group arc into five team arcs, and bring in a competitive angle, with prizes (48 & 24 hrs passes) for the two teams making best show, based on (a) an early return, and (b) amount, accuracy and value of information.
4. Each team will be given co-ordinates of two objectives, about which they will obtain information. This information must be as descriptive and complete as possible, and may require some "phenagling" to obtain. Brief sketches will be made of the imm. area of the objectives. These may be buildings, churches, Ry. stns, etc. During the course of the days travelling teams will gather within their given arc, the type of information required in "LOOKAROUND". Each team will be given a slip with a co-ordinate of objectives and arcs, and will be given a Gt. Britain 1/100, 000 Sheet T6 EAST.
5. App 90 O.R's of No. 2 Coy will parade at 0800 hrs in walking out order, and wearing haversacks slung, containing haversack lunches (which will be handed out at breakfast) and gas capes. The parade will be divided into groups and teams, with N.C.O's spread as members of teams.
6. Personnel will be privately asked by Pl. Cmdr to give any money they might have, for which a receipt will be given.
7. The conditions, and information required will be read to the teams, and the exercise in general explained.
8. Teams will make every effort to return to barracks by 1700hrs 12 May 43. Any team failing to do so must give a satisfactory account of the failure.
9. If money is withheld, it will not be used to feed or transport the team.
10. On return, teams will report to No. 2 Coy Office and turn in their information. On Thursday morning each team will submit the Coy Cmdr a written account of their experiences during the exercise.

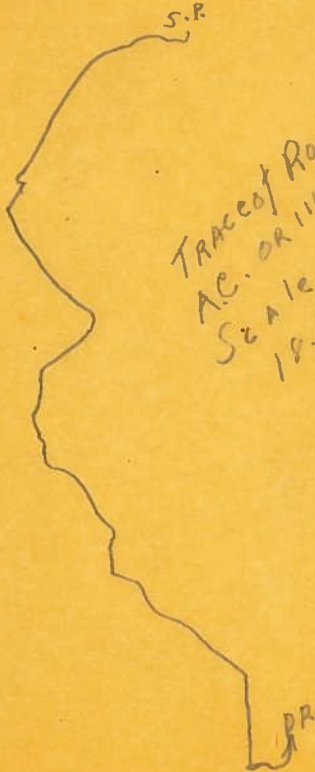

3. SECURITY OF OFFICIAL INFORMATION

The attention of all ranks is directed to Appx "A" to 4 Div Routine Order No: 1338 which is published as an appx to this order.

4. PURCHASE OF FOOD AND TOBACCO BY TROOPS ON THE MARCH

1. Instances have arisen recently where troops on the march on being halted in villages, have been permitted to fall out and purchase food and tobacco in the village shops with the result that no supplies are available for the inhabitants.
2. In such cases, the troops, who are provided with adequate rations and who have further provision made in the canteens run by NAAFI and Auxiliary Service Organizations, are buying and consuming the limited supplies available for the civilian population.
3. Conduct of this nature is not only a breach of march discipline but is also calculated to damage the good feeling which should exist between the Army and the civilian population.
4. O's.C. will ensure that when on the march or in convoy, troops are forbidden to fall out for the purpose of entering the shops of any town or village in which they may be halted.

5. DISCIPLINE-SAFETY PRECAUTIONS TO BE OBSERVED

by troops walking out during hours of darkness.

1. Owing to the regrettable number of accidents, involving loss of life, which have occurred during the hours of "black-out", it is considered desirable that the attention of all ranks should be drawn to the necessity of taking the normal precautions when walking in public thoroughfares at night when off duty or on duty as individuals. It should be pointed out that drivers of vehicles are often unable to see pedestrians, particularly those dressed in khaki, in sufficient time to avert an accident.
2. In places where no footway is in existence and it becomes necessary to walk in a roadway, pedestrians should walk on the right-hand side of the road, i.e., against the oncoming traffic, and not on the left-hand side, where there is always the danger of being run down from the rear by overtaking traffic.
3. All traffic signals must be observed and thoroughfares crossed only at the appointed pedestrian crossings, when these are available.

6. SHORT COURSES FOR CANADIANS

SECURITY OF OFFICIAL INFORMATION

1. All members of a Headquarters, including all signal operators, signal office personnel and drivers of Headquarters cars are reminded that they are employed in a position of trust and are, therefore, under an obligation of secrecy.

2. No military information which may come to a person's knowledge as a result of employment at a Headquarters will be communicated to any person NOT employed at such Headquarters, except when necessary in the performance of duty. Information which may seem quite trivial may possibly give a clue to important military matters, with disastrous results to our forces. Everyone therefore, will make a definite rule NOT to mention any phase of their work to any person or to discuss any phase of their work with another member of the staff, when there is any possibility of being overheard. Particular discretion will be observed when talking on the telephone with regard to military affairs. Signal operators and signal office personnel, likewise all drivers of Headquarters cars, are warned that any conversations regarding military matters they may overhear during the performance of their duties must be treated as secret and confidential.

3. Members of a Headquarters will NOT communicate confidential or secret information to other members of the staff unless it is necessary for the proper performance of their duties.

4. The following are key laws drawn from the Official Secrets Act, 1911 (M.M.L. p. 89) and amended by the Official Secrets Act, 1920 (M.M.L. p. 90) which Acts of the United Kingdom apply to personnel of the Canadian Army (Overseas).

I. A person is guilty of a felony and liable to penal servitude for a term of fourteen years who for any purpose prejudicial to the safety or interests of the State,

- (a) Makes any sketch, photograph, plan, model or note which is calculated to be or might be or is intended to be directly or indirectly useful to the enemy;
- (b) Obtains, records, publishes, or communicates to any other person any secret official code word or pass word or any sketch, photograph, plan model, article or note or other document or information which is calculated to be or might be or is intended to be directly or indirectly useful to any enemy;

II. A person is guilty of a misdemeanour and liable to imprisonment for a term of two years who,

- (a) Having in his possession any code word, pass word, sketch, photograph, plan model, document or information, communicates such code word, pass word, sketch, photograph, plan, model, document or information to any person, other than a person to whom he is authorized to communicate it, or a person to whom it is in the interest of the state his duty to communicate it;
- (b) Uses the information in his possession for the benefit of any foreign power or in any other manner prejudicial to the safety or interests of the State;
- (c) Retains any sketch, photograph, plan, model, article, note or document in his possession or control of when he has no right to retain it or when it is contrary to his duty to retain it, or fails to comply with all directions issued by lawful authority with regard to the return or disposal thereof;
- (d) Fails to take reasonable care of or so conducts himself as to endanger the safety of any sketch, photograph, plan model, article, note, document or information.

PHOTOGRAPHY - CONTROL OF

1. It is notified for information that para. 5 of Defence Regulations provides that no officer or other rank shall, unless acting in the course of duty in His Majesty's Service, make any photograph of, or any part of, any object :-

- (a) In any such area in the United Kingdom as may be specified by order of a competent authority, being an area in relation to which the restriction of photography appears to that competent authority to be expedient in the interests of the defence of the realm, or
- (b) In any prohibited place within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act, 1911, M.M.L., page 895, as amended by the Official Secrets Act, 1920, M.M.L., page 900, that is:-
- (i) Any work of defense, arsenal, navy, military or airforce establishments or station, factory, dockyard, mine, mine-field, camp, ship or aircraft belonging to or occupied by or on behalf of His Majesty, or any telegraph, telephone, wireless or signal station, or office so belonging or occupied, and any place belonging to or occupied by or on behalf of His Majesty and used for the purpose of building, repairing, making or storing any munitions of war, or any sketches, plans, models, or documents relating thereto, or for the purpose of getting any metals, oil, or minerals of use in time of war;
  - (ii) any place not belonging to His Majesty where any munitions of war or any sketches, models, plans or documents relating thereto are being made, repaired, gotten or stored under contract with, or with any person on behalf of his Majesty; and
  - (iii) any place belonging to or used for the purposes of His Majesty which is for the time being declared by order of a Secretary of State to be a prohibited place for the purposes of this section on the ground that information with respect thereto, or damage thereto, would be useful to an enemy; and
  - (iv) any railway, road, way or channel or other means of communication by land or water (including) any works or structures being part thereof or connected therewith, or any place used for gas, water, or electricity works or other works for purposes of a public character, or any place where any munitions of war, or any sketches, models, plans or documents relating thereto, are being made, repaired or stored otherwise than on behalf of His Majesty which is for the time being declared by order of a Secretary of State to be a prohibited place for the purposes of this section, on the ground that information with respect thereto, or the destruction or obstruction thereof, or interference therewith, would be useful to an enemy.

2. It is to be noted that military hospitals, headquarters barracks, billets, camp and quarters are included in the above-mentioned definition of prohibited places.

3. Officers and other ranks, except when they are acting in the performance of their duty, shall not take any photograph of the following subjects as enumerated in para. 1 of the Control of Photography Order (No. 1), 1939. The term duty shall be strictly interpreted by Commanding Officers. The taking of so-called "Unit record pictures" for War Diary or other purposes shall not be regarded as a matter of "duty" except for the Official accredited military photographers on establishments of formation Headquarters.

Control of Photography Order No. 1., 1939, enumerates the following subjects : -

- (a) Any fortifications, battery, searchlight, listening post or other work of defence.
- (b) Any aerodrome or seaplane station.
- (c) Any assembly of any of His Majesty's forces.
- (d) Any barracks, encampment or building occupied or in course of preparation for occupation by any of His Majesty's Forces.
- (e) Any arsenal, factory, magazine or stores for munitions of war, arms, equipment or supplies.
- (f) Any wireless, telegraph, telephone, signal or cable station.
- (g) Any dock, caisson, dockyard, harbour, ship-building works or loading pier.
- (h) Any vessel of war either complete or under construction, or any vessel or vehicle engaged in the transport of supplies or personnel.
- (i) Any aircraft or the wreckage of any aircraft.
- (j) Any building structure, vessel or other object damaged by enemy action.
- (k) Any hospital or station at which casualties, whether civil or otherwise are treated; any ambulance or convoy of injured persons, or injured person.
- (l) Any electricity, gas or water works; or any gasometer or any reservoir, or any oil stores.
- (m) Any assembly of persons for the purpose of transport or evacuation, or any temporary camp or other accommodation or transport vehicles used for the purpose of evacuation.
- (n) Any riotous or disorderly assembly, or premises, or other object damaged in the course of such an assembly.
- (o) Any roads, or railways exclusively connected with works of defence.

4. Where it is desired to obtain, for unit records, photographs of subjects enumerated in para. 1, Control of Photography Order (No. 1), 1939, as above, applications shall be made to the Public Relations Officer of the formation concerned for the services of an official military photographer.

5. Any photograph or photographic negatives or photographic film which any officer, soldier, attached civilian or employee of the Canadian Army Overseas desires to send out of the U.K. will be contained in an envelope or wrapper plainly marked "photograph".

6. Registration of Cameras - All ranks in possession of cameras will register them with the Headquarters of the formation or unit to which they are attached. It will be the responsibility of formation and unit commanders that a list of all ranks in possession of cameras is maintained in their Headquarters.

5. PRECAUTIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN THE USE OF  
ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES

5-A

(1) The normal electricity supply for lighting or power purposes can, under certain circumstances, cause serious injury or death, and it is essential that alterations should not be carried out by unauthorized personnel.

(ii) The danger of injury through shock or burns is greatly increased when electrical appliances such as irons, heaters, hair driers, etc., are used in damp surroundings or in the vicinity of "earthed" metal, such as water pipes or taps, sinks, baths, etc and for this reason socket outlets, for the connection of electrical appliances, will not under any circumstances be installed in bathrooms or wash-houses nor will such appliances be taken into these places.

(iii) An electric shock usually indicates a defect in the system or appliance, and any instances of shock, sustained in W.C.s or requisitioned properties, will be reported immediately to the QUARTERMASTER.

3. LEGAL AID  
3-A

1. The need for a legal aid scheme for soldiers serving in the Canadian Army Overseas has become increasingly apparent. In addition to giving legal advice to soldiers in the United Kingdom, a plan has been devised whereby through the courtesy of the Canadian Bar Association, legal assistance will be furnished, in certain classes of cases, to personnel of the Canadian Army Overseas by members of the legal profession in Canada.
2. This aid is available only in respect of civil legal problems, and is not applicable in disciplinary action, criminal offences, or in any matters, such as pay and allowances, which can be dealt with through other channels. The function of this scheme is advisory as to the legal solution and necessary action. The conduct of litigation will not be undertaken by officers rendering aid. The expense of any action taken by the soldier on such advice is to be borne by him.
3. It is also to be clearly understood by all ranks seeking and acting on such legal aid that any advice or assistance rendered is given and received on the condition that the recipient has no right to compensation against either the Crown or the officer or other person giving the same for any loss or damage suffered as a consequence of any negligence in or arising out of the giving of that advice or assistance.
4. In order that a soldier who requires legal advice may have his case disposed of expeditiously, and in appropriate cases forwarded to Canada for attention by the Canadian Bar Association, the following action will be taken forthwith:-
  - (a) Legal Aid Bureaux will be formed at all formation headquarters and will be under the direction of the legal officer appropriate to that formation.
  - (b) Such Bureaux will consist of a panel of regimental officers selected from serving solicitors, where possible one officer from each unit of the formation. While service on the panel is on a voluntary basis, it is expected that all serving solicitors will offer their assistance.

(To sheet 2)

3. LEGAL AID (cont'd)

(c) The panel of serving solicitors will be maintained by the formation legal officer and the unit commanding officers of units, and each member of the panel, of the names and units of the serving solicitors comprising the panels.

5. Personnel desiring legal advice may be given permission to consult any of the serving solicitors on their respective formation panels. Commanding officers will ensure that every facility is afforded to personnel desiring advice so that they may receive such advice with the least possible delay.

6. The intention behind the Legal Aid scheme is that soldiers will be able to obtain private legal advice on confidential matters. It is therefore contrary to the intention for commanding officers to insist that the officers rendering such legal aid should disclose to them what transpires in the Legal Aid Bureau, in the sense that the details of the cases, in which advice is given to soldiers of their units, should be made known. It cannot be too strongly emphasized that the assistance given to a soldier over his private affairs is kept entirely as a confidential matter between the soldier concerned and his adviser.

7. Detailed instructions for the guidance of formation legal officers and serving solicitors will be issued separately in Pamphlet form.

1. Duty Coy will supply the fire picquet consisting of one N.C.O. and eight men who will remain in barracks. The fire picquet will "fall in" at 1830 hrs in front of the duty Coy orderly room to be inspected by the duty Officer, at which time the fire orders will be read to them by the Duty Officer.

2. There will be two fire points per 12 tents, one fire point for isolated tents of two or more, one fire point per marquee and cook-house. The said fire points will consist of two stirrup pumps, one sand and three water containers painted white with F-I-R-E in red lettering. These fire points will be located by the Unit Fire Prevention Officer.

3. All Coys will post in a prominent place a list showing the various fire points (location of fire equipment). This list must be brought to the notice of all personnel quartered in the unit lines.

4. A fire alarm (a piece of iron with hammer) should be placed by all Coys in a prominent place to be sounded by the person discovering the fire.

5. Fire fighting equipment is to be used for no other purpose than fire fighting and is to be removed from its allotted place without authority of the Unit Fire Prevention Officer.

6. DISCOVERY OF FIRE - Any of the personnel discovering the fire will shout "FIRE" raise the alarm-attack the fire with hand appliances. The guard commander will sound the alarm-turn out the fire picquet. If N.C.O. in charge of fire picquet decides that he is unable to extinguish the fire himself or tried to extinguish it and failed to do so he will take instant action by calling the fire brigade at Blackdown - Tel - No. Deepcut 145-Ex. II

The fire picquet will "Fall in" in front of the Bn Orderly Room in charge of the fire picquet N.C.O. They will then immediately proceed to the scene of the fire.

FIRE PICQUET DRILL - (Hand-pump Drill) Men for hand pump drill will fall in in single file and number off in fours. Each four forms a crew. A hand pump and three buckets are placed in front of the picquet. The hand pump to the right.

"FIRST CREW FALL IN - DOUBLE: Crew double smartly into position, No 1 behind the hand pump. Nos 2, 3 and 4 behind the buckets.

"HAND PUMP DRILL-ACTION: No. 1 takes the pump and doubles to within striking distance of fire followed by Nos. 2, 3 and 4 who place buckets in line behind No. 1. No 1 hands the pump to No. 2 runs forward and directs the jet at the seat of the fire, No. 2 places the pump in the bucket and starts pumping with short quick strokes. When No. 2's bucket is nearly empty, No. 3 refills it from his bucket from the right, placing the empty bucket to the left and behind No. 2 he then takes over the pumping by first placing his right foot on the stirrup and then taking over the handle, the pumping being maintained throughout. No. 2 doubles away with the empty bucket to the nearest source of supply, refills it and falls in against No. 4. This process of changing is carried on until the fire is extinguished.

7. Available personnel quartered in tented area will assist fire picquet by acting as extra fire picquet to extinguish the blaze.

8. Smoking in the Unit Vehicle Park is strictly prohibited.

9. Fire instructions will be posted in the Bn O.R., Coy Office all Coy notice boards and in the guard room.




