WAR DIARIES, CANADIAN ARMY

Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

1. A War Diary is **SECRET**.

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. (Can.) Para. 1530.) Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.

4. Post-war disposal will be as under:

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mobn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii.)

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and

issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary. *Copies* should, whenever available, be attached as appendices to the Duplicate and Triplicate copies of the War Diary.

- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:—Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies, etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

- (v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.
- (iv) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders should be attached to triplicate copy only and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

1. *Titles and Numbering of Files.*

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned.

2. *Date reference.*

The method outlined in F.S.R., Vol. II, Appendix IV, will be used for all purposes, e.g. 2 Feb 40.

3. *Documents for Preservation.*

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

4. *Correspondence in the Field.*

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of

action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.







2. DAMAGE TO EQPT BY THE USE OF UNAUTHORIZED CHARGES
 2-A

1. The practice of using other charges than those authorized in the Range Tables of guns or mortars will cease forthwith. If, after the date of this order any unit is found to be continuing this practice or if it is confirmed from examination of damaged eqpts that unauthorized charges have been used, disciplinary action will be taken against the unit concerned.

2. The use of unauthorized charges has been prevalent in the vases of mortars 3". The following are the charges authorized and no other will be used.

1. CENSORSHIP - POSTCARDS & PHOTOGRAPHS

1. The following extracts from Brit Mil Censorship regs will come into force immediately and will amend 1 CRO 35/44 and 1 CRO 43/44 insofar as anything contained herein contravenes those orders.

"PICTURE POSTCARDS"

(a) Picture postcards will be subject to the same censorship regs as applicable to ordinary mail. They will be suppressed by franking offrs if they may in any way disclose the writer's present or past location or the route by which movements of the writer's unit have taken place. Picture postcards showing an indentifiable place or view in ITALY will not be mailed.

(b) Any ref in comm to postcards previously sent or to be sent which, when considered with the postcard or separately, violates military censorship regs, is prohibited.

"FIDMS"

(a) Photographs, films prints and all similiar photographic materials will be subject to the same censorship regs as applicable to ordinary mail. In addition, the following classes of photographic materials will not be sent through the mail.

(1) Pictures which reveal any kind of military infm. Pictures mailed will be purely personal in nature with no indentifiable backgrounds.

(2) Undeveloped exposed films.

(b) Photographs or pictoral matter of any kind, from whatever source they may have been obtained, will not be despatched to neutral or enemy countries.

(c) Any ref in comm to photographs previously sent or to be sent whic, when considered with the photographs or separately violates military censorship regs, is prohibited.

(d) All negatives and prints not passed by the sensor will be disposed of as directed by the Allied C-in-C, Mediterranean Theatre of Operations.

(1 CRO 116/2 Mar 44)

2. DAMAGE TO TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH POLES.

1. In the past few weeks serious damage has been caused to the overhead telephone and telegraph routes by the following causes.

(a) The deliberate shooting at insulators with small arms by tps.

(b) The inadvertent destruction by our own artillery through siting guns with the overhead routes in the line of fire.

(c) Deliberate cutting down of telegraph poles for convenience of siting AA Guns.

(d) Deliberate cutting down of poles for use as firewood or for unofficial construction of one kind or another.

(e) Inadvertent knocking down by MT of poles placed close to the road.

2. In every case vital line comm have been interrupted for several hours. It is literally true to say that more damage to restored overhead routes has been caused by our own tps and our co-belligerent than by the enemy.

3. It is important that further damage be prevented as far as possible to all civilian telephone routes. Lines though damaged and not now in use will probably be rebuilt for main military comm routes.

(1 CRO 117/2 Mar 44)

3. THE CARRIAGE OF CIVILIANS IN MIL VEHS

1. Civilians may be carried in WD vechs in the following circumstances:-

(a) When in possession of a properly authorized pass to travel from AMG or FS as set forth in 1 CRO 42/6 Feb 44.

(b) If employed as a civilian labour, when the driver is authorized by an ofrr of the employing unit to carry such persons to and from work.

2. It is essential that this order be strictly observed, not only on account of the consequences of possible accidents involving civilians whose carriage is not authorized, but also for security reasons. Fd Security exercises control over the movement of all civilians within the battle zone and indiscriminate travel is not allowed. The work of preventing this travel is made much heavier if drivers do not obey this order.

(1 CRO /118/2 Mar 44)

3. RLY PREMISES AND PROPERTY

1. ARO:306 Of:1943, in order to safeguard rly property both for its rehabilitation and safe-continuance, laid down in part.

(a) That no plant, machinery, stores bldgs or property of rlys would be removed or in any way damaged.

(b) That no engineering work or alterations to property or bldgs be carried out without permission of Mov an Tn.

2. Two examples of non-compliance with consequent risk to the maint of the Army, are quoted below.

Rly Premises and Property (Cont'd)

(a) A number of unauthorized and dangerous level crossings have recently been constructed between CASALBORDINO and TORINO DI SANGRO.

(b) Reports have been received from the Italian Permanent War Staff of the removal by mil personnel of sleepers. In one case old sleepers placed in the ground to protect the rly line from sand storms were removed. In another case new sleepers laid for reconstruction of the rly line were also removed.

3. In future, fmns or units requiring rly constr or alterations and/or transportation stores, will submit demands to their superior HQs who will, in turn pass to Mov and Tn, Rear Eighth Army, with their recommendations.

4. These orders will be strictly observed and disciplinary action will be taken against all offenders.

2. DISCIPLINE - DRIVERS MT

2. This is a standing order for allied forces within this theatre of ops and will be adhered to by all fmns and units of 1 Cdn Corps at all times.

5. REPAIR OF ARMS - SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

1. Due to the possibility of serious accidents it is imperative that NO live amm of any type is permitted to be brought in or near a place of repair of small arms.

2. An order to this effect will be clearly posted in every such place of repair.

6. AMN SEGREGATION

1. Bombs-MI 4-1-1, 4-1-2, 4-1-3 and Smoke, were originally secured to the Tail Unit with RD Cement.
2. After 1st Nov 1942 the same units were secured with a shakeproof washer.
3. It is emphasized that finally secured tail units without the shakeproof washer are quite safe to fire.
4. Stocks will however be inspected for bombs manufactured before NOV 42 and any found will be examined to determine whether the shakeproof washer has been fitted or not.
5. Bombs not fitted with the shakeproof washer will be segregated and quantities will be reported to this HQ.

7. PETROL - SUPPLY IN RETURNABLE CONTAINERS

1. The sup of returnable pet containers (Jerricans and Americans) available to 1 Cdn Corps is sufficient only if they are carefully conserved and quickly returned in good condition to PPs for refilling.
2. Consequently the sup of pet in returnable containers in all pet installations op by fms or units under comd 1 Cdn Corps will be on a can-for-can basis: i.e., an empty container will be returned for each full one drawn.

8. MARKING OF WATER CONTAINERS

1. Instances have recently occurred of petrol in container s being put on stoves, in mistake for water, with disastrous results.
2. All water containers will be clearly marked with a large "W" and NO improvised containers not so marked will be put over stoves or heating appliances without first being identified as containing NO petrol or kerosene.

9. AIR MAIL LETTERS CARDS

1. It is expected that a sup of air mail letters forms will be available early in April.
2. These cards will be available for sale at all FPOs with three-penny stamp affixed.
3. Purchase will be limited to a maximum of six to one person at any one time.
4. On arrival of new forms present S&T holdings of forms will be turned over in bulk to fms postal for distribution as outlined above.
5. Present weekly issue will be discontinued.
