Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

1. A War Diary is SECRET.

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.

4. Post-war disposal will be as under:

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

TriPLICATE—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mdn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary.
- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions*, *Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:— Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications*, both written and verbal, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and reports rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

(v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.

(vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, see. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

1. Titles and Numbering of Files.

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned.

2. Date reference.

In giving communications a reference number, it is convenient to use the date system of four figures indicating day and month, e.g. 0102 for 1st February; 3010 for 30th October.

3. Combined Numeration.

If the systems outlined in paras 1 and 2 are combined, by placing the four date figures under the subject file numbers, a simple and informative method of reference results, thus

might be immediately identified as a communication dealing with replacement of gas masks, dated 8th April.

NOTE.—This method is not applicable to signal messages, A.F.C. 2128, which bear serial numbers 1 to 9999. The use of dashes eliminates confusion between serial numbers and file numbers.

4. Documents for Preservation.

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

5. Correspondence in the Field.

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.



2. Stocks of these cards are made available by the Postal Orderly and Coy Comds will bring to the attention of all ranks the necessity of filling out these cards before being SOS, att or attending a course where the duration is over 21 days.

2. COURTS MARTIAL

It is noted that in many courts-martial proceedings involving charges of desertion and absence without leave the evidence of termination of absence is not in proper form.

2. Attention is directed to Overseas RO 2371 (available at Bn Ord Room) which prescribes the type of evidence required in such cases. Certificates of arrest or surrender prepared in accordance with Overseas RO 2371 may be presented to the officer taking the summary of evidence, or to the Court by the Adjutant of the unit or other officer having custody of the regimental books without the necessity of calling as a witness, the person by whom the accused was apprehended or to whom he surrendered.

3. AFB 252 and similar documents though sufficient for the purposes of the summary of evidence so long as the officer taking the summary complies with FP 4(G), are NOT admissible at the trial in cases where an accused pleads not guilty.

3. EMERGENCY CHOCOLATE RATIONS

All ranks will turn in their Emergency Chocolate Rations, either to the Med Officer or their coy Quartermaster before proceeding to Hosp.

4. DISCIPLINE

1. (a) On 16 Mar 44, B61471 Tpr Elizah Enoch BACON, 5 Cdn Armd Regt (8NBH), was tried by FGCM on a charge under AA Sec 6(2)(h) - being a sentinel, left his post before being regularly relieved.
(b) He was found guilty and sentenced to fifteen months' imprisonment with hard labour.
2. (a) On 22 Mar 44, A11846 Pte James Aloysius HARRINGTON, Perth R, was tried by FGCM on a charge under AA Sec 18(2) - by discharging his rifle, wilfully injured himself by shooting his left hand, with intent thereby to render himself unfit for service.
(b) He was found guilty and sentenced to be imprisoned with hard labour for eighteen months.
3. (a) On 22 Mar 44, F55421 Pte William REARDON, C B Highrs, was tried by FGCM on a charge under AA Sec 8(2) - offering violence to his superior offr in that he attempted to strike with his fists the body of Lt D G L Fraser.
(b) He was found guilty and sentenced to be imprisoned with hard labour for one year.

4. DISCIPLINE (cont'd)

4. On 22 Mar 44, F89879 Pte Francis Elliott KENNEDY, C B Highrs, was tried by FGCM on a charge under AA Sec 15(1) - AWL for 9 days, 1 hr, 30 mins.

He was found guilty and sentenced to be imprisoned with hard labour for six months.

5. (a) On 23 Mar 44, F33125 Pte Francis David PIERCY, C B Highrs, was tried by FGCM on a charge under AA Sec 6(2)(e) - when a sentinel was asleep on his post.

(b) He was found guilty and sentenced to be imprisoned with hard labour for two years.

6. (a) On 23 Mar 44, F78951 Pte Francis WALKER, C B Highrs, was tried by FGCM on the following charges:

- (i) AA Sec 15(1) AWL
- (ii) AA Sec 19 Drunkenness
- (iii) AA Sec 15(1) AWL
- (iv) AA Sec 6(2)(e) When a sentinel was asleep on his post.

(b) He was found guilty and sentenced to be imprisoned with hard labour for two years.

5. ENEMY AIR ACTIVITY

1. The almost complete absence of any enemy air interference against Cdn tps in the CMF has resulted in the presumption that the German Air Force is negligible in this theatre of ops and a consequent slackening of all camouflage drill has resulted.

2. This presumption is completely false and on the 5 Army front, Allied tps are subjected to considerable attention from Luftwaffe.

3. Lax camouflage discipline results in locations and concentrations of tps being seen by enemy recce planes which in turn brings down enemy arty fire, or, more seriously still the element of surprise, so essential in any Comd's plan, is lost and not only are casualties unavoidable but the success of the op as a whole is jeopardized.

4. Camouflage is a weapon of either defence or attack. Camouflage is protection and that is enforced is the duty of the individual -- the unit -- the formation.

5. The priority of normal camouflage is:-

- (i) Good siting.
- (ii) Good track plan strictly enforced.
- (iii) Camp behaviour in bivouac - check on: fires - smoke - laundry - dispersal - unnecessary massing of tps at meal parades etc.

6. (a) Formation and unit HQ must be concealed as far as possible.

(b) Particular attention will be paid to the camouflage of ARMOUR when in lager.

(c) Concealment during road movement in the forward areas will be stressed.

7. Unit Comds will hereafter ensure that camouflage drill and behaviour is strictly enforced within their unit.

6. BRASS CASE .45 AMM

(1) Brass case .45 amm not manufactured by WRA may now be used until existing stocks are exhausted.

7. ENEMY ESPIONAGE

1. Attention is drawn to the following measures which are in force to combat enemy espionage and sabotage activity. They necessitate the fullest co-operation from all tps:-

(a) All refugees coming from enemy territory must be rounded up by forward troops and evacuated under guard through PW channels to the Army PW Cage, where the Refugee Interrogation Post (RIP), directed by GSI(b), will have all refugees security checked and searched. In addition information of I(a) interest is also extracted at this point. It is of utmost importance that refugees from enemy territory be evacuated under guard in the same manner as PW.

(b) In the forward operational areas all troops must be on the look-out for civilians circulating unnecessarily, behaving in a suspicious manner, etc. Such civilians must be arrested and sent to the RIP under guard. Indiscriminate employment of civilians provides one of the best covers for the activities of enemy agents. It is of utmost importance that individual civilians employed by units be checked by FSS.

(c) In rear of the foremost operations' area and throughout the army area is a network of civilian movement control posts directed by FSS, and manned by Italian Civil Police or civilian volunteers acting as Auxiliary Police. CMP and troops must assist such control posts in the execution of their duty. For instance, one of their tasks is to examine the credentials of civilians travelling in ND transport and to arrest those who are on such transport without authority. This can only be done with the assistance of CMP and Allied troops. The maintenance of this network of control is dependent on the co-operation of AQs of Formations and AMG. GSI(b) and FSS must be given all possible assistance in this respect.

2. Personnel of Field Security sections are the experts on counter-espionage and are supplied with sufficient information by GSI(b) on enemy agents to put them in a position to determine whether or not suspicious characters referred to them are in fact spies or not. If in doubt about any civilian, FSS should be referred to.

8. DISCIPLINE

1. The attention of all ranks is drawn to the continued unauthorized removal of Army Eqpt from disabled vechs, dumps and quarters.

2. It is pointed out that this constitutes a menace to the efficient supply of spares to the army in that this eqpt must be replaced from stocks in the UK, which is a serious problem due to:-

- (a) Limited shipping facilities.
- (b) Considerable time-lag between the date of submitting indents to receipt of articles in this theatre.

3. The practice of hoarding, misappropriation, theft and pilfering of Army Eqpt is a serious offence and in future disciplinary action will be taken against any offrs or ORs who are found to have taken eqpt belonging to other units without proper authority.

4. It is the duty of all ranks to report immediately particulars and location of any abandoned eqpt or any vechs left unattended. It will be the responsibility of the person to whom the report is submitted to ascertain ownership or take necessary steps to have eqpt in question turned into the nearest dump.

5. CAPTURED ENEMY MATERIAL

- (a) Responsibility: It is the responsibility of all commanders in the Field to collect, safeguard and evacuate all types of captured enemy material.
- (b) Priority: The first priority for the evacuation and disposal of all captured material will be for technical intelligence purposes, e.g. technical examination and research.
- (c) Procedure:
- (i) New types of enemy equipment will be reported immediately by unit intelligence officers to the intelligence officer of the next higher formation who will in turn report through normal intelligence channels to HQ Technical Intelligence North Africa and Central Mediterranean, AFHQ. Wherever possible, this channel will also be used for the evacuation of items of interest to technical intelligence staffs. Where swift evacuation through intelligence channels is not practical (i.e. in the case of heavy equipment such as tanks and large calibre guns) new specimens of interest will be adequately safeguarded and the exact location of the equipment will be reported immediately by the unit intelligence officer to the intelligence staffs of the next higher formation and thus eventually to AFHQ. Brief details and, if possible, photographs of the equipment will also be obtained by the unit intelligence officer and forwarded through these channels.
- (ii) Captured enemy ammunition and explosives of all types will be handled in strict accordance with GMD 506/43, republished in GRC 666/43.
- (iii) Captured enemy material which is not required for technical examination and research will be handed over to Ordnance and in the case of rations and petrol to RASC. These services will make returns to Captured Enemy Material Section at HQ Allied Armies in Italy.
- (d) Retention of Captured Material: The unauthorized retention of any captured material is a punishable offence. Captured material is the property of the Allied Forces and not that of the individual or unit into whose hands it may fall.
- (e) Removal of Captured Material from this Theatre: The removal from the theatre of captured enemy material of any description without written authority issued in accordance with policies established by the A.C. of S, G-3 AFHQ, is strictly forbidden.

1. INJURIES RESULTING FROM PETROL FIRES

(a) Fifteen per cent of the injuries to soldiers in this theatre (other than wounds received in action) are caused by burns from petrol fires. The great majority of these are the result of negligence on the part of individuals who fail to appreciate the dangerously inflammable nature of petrol when used as fuel.

(b) Attention will be drawn in formation and unit orders to the danger of using petrol cookers without proper precautions. In all cases where injuries from petrol fires are shown to be the result of negligence whether on the part of the injured man or of another, disciplinary action will be taken.

2. SALUTING

(a) When two or more other ranks are walking out and pass an officer or officers, all the other ranks will salute as laid down in the manual of Elementary Drill (All Arms), 1935, Sec 74.

(b) A salute made to two or more officers in a street or other public place out of doors will be returned by all the officers saluted. In camps, unit lines or on parade, the salute will be returned by the senior officer only.

(c) When two or more British officers meet an Allied officer or officers, all British officers will either salute or acknowledge the salute of the Allied officers, as the case may be. The rank of the British or Allied officers is immaterial.

The badges of rank of Allied Military Forces should be studied by all ranks.

(d) All ranks will salute officers of higher rank in cars which display authorized flags or stars. The latter distinguishing signs, which are covered when the officer is travelling, consist of red material on plates with one or more stars according to rank displayed on the front and rear of the car.

(e) Saluting dates from the time of armour, the salute representing the motion of a knight raising the visor of his helmet with the open hand to the front showing that, though raised, it contained no missile.

The practice of combining "eyes right" or eyes left with the salute originated from the olden days, when it was the privilege of men-at-arms to look their superiors in the face, while others must pass with downcast eyes.

The salute therefore is a recognition of comradeship and mutual trust between men-at-arms; it is, at the same time, an acknowledgment of discipline and has become a visible indication of common allegiance which all ranks owe to the Crown and its service.

The standard of saluting is, therefore an indication of the esprit-de-corps of units and formations. History, and the experience of the present war, have proved that high esprit-de-corps and good discipline increase the military efficiency of units and formations.

The recognition of comradeship and mutual trust inherent in the salute must be mutual and not one-sided, e.g. both parties must look each other in the eyes, and officers receiving the salute must return it in a smart, soldierly and orthodox manner. The slovenly return of a salute cannot but breed slovenliness. The officer will, therefore, return the salute in a proper manner and will invariably look the giver in the eyes.

(f) Officers and soldiers, on detachment, will show by the standard of their saluting their determination to maintain with pride the reputation of their unit, corps and formations.

3. SECURITY

(a) During recent months the enemy has been sending large numbers of espionage and sabotage agents into ALLIED occupied territory disguised as refugees. Accordingly, the following measures will be enforced to combat this activity:-

(i) All refugees coming from enemy territory will be rounded up by forward troops and evacuated under guard to PW cage in the same manner as PW.

(ii) In the forward operational areas civilians who are observed to be circulating unnecessarily, or behaving in a suspicious manner, will be arrested and handed over to 2 NZ DIV FS SEC which is located with MAIN HQ 2 NZ DIV.

(iii) All civilian labour must be checked by FS Secs before employment.

(iv) ITALIAN Civil Police and volunteers acting as Auxiliary Police, whose duty it is to examine the credentials of civilians moving in rear areas, will be given every assistance.

(b) It is emphasised that these counter-measures necessitate the fullest co-operation of all troops. Personnel of FS Secs are in a position to determine whether civilians are genuine or not, and any doubtful case should be referred to them.

4. CENSORSHIP

(a) Troops may now state in letters home that they have witnessed the eruption of VESUVIUS provided that:-

(a) The subject is NOT discussed in Green Envelope letters.

(b) No dates are mentioned.

(c) The writer's unit or HQ is not linked in any way with his personal account other than by correct return address at the head of the letter, e.g. it is not permissible for the writer to state that his unit or HQ was either far from or near to the eruption.

APPX "A"

MALARIA STANDING ORDERS

1. Responsibility for Malaria Control

The comd of any unit or det will be responsible for malaria control within his unit. He will satisfy himself that full anti-malarial precautions are taken at all times. Tech advise will be given by Div Malaria Offr, and RMO.

2. Siting of Camps

Camps or bivouac areas will not be situated along the bed of rivers, but, where possible on high ground and away from centers of population.

3. Duties of a Malaria Squad

(a) Isolated buildings, where used, will be sprayed before entering. All buildings, tents and stables in unit area and with one mile radius will be sprayed as soon as possible after arrival, and these close to unit lines sprayed daily thereafter. All spraying will be carried out by unit anti-malarial squads.

(b) Ground depressions, shell holes, slit trenches and ruts if holding water will be drained or filled to above water level. As a temporary measure they may be oiled. Receptacles which may hold water will be disposed of immediately.

(c) Cisterns or Wells will be treated with pet once a week and the pet allowed to evaporate. Half a cigarette tin full per week is sufficient. If applied in the evening water may be used the following morning.

(d) Control problems that cannot be dealt with by unit will be reported to OC II Fd Hyg Sec RGAMC and will be dealt with by AMCU.

4. Personnel Protection

(a) Nets - Nets will be erected one hr before sundown. Personnel will make sure no mosquitos are caught inside, and that edges are sealed to the ground or tucked under blankets. Tears or holes in netting will be repaired immediately. This is an individual responsibility. Unit inspection of nets will be made once a week by an offr, and daily by an NCO.

(b) Clothing Sleeves will be rolled down and long trousers worn from sunset to sunrise. Trousers will be tucked into socks or anklets or puttees worn.

(c) Veils and Gauntlets - Where operationally possible veils and gauntlets will be worn by guards and sentries from sunset to sunrise.

(d) Repellant - Repellant will be used by personnel on all exposed parts of the body, from sunset to sunrise when not protected by nets. Personnel will ensure that a sufficient sup of repellent is carried at all times.

5. Mepacrine

(a) One tablet will be taken daily by all personnel, seven dys a week.

(b) Where possible it will be taken under supervision of an offr. Where this is not possible a senior NCO will supervise the Mepacrine px parade.

(c) Personnel on det duty or on leave will carry sufficient Mepacrine, and take one tablet daily.

1. MALARIA PRECAUTIONS

The Malaria season occurs between 1 May and 31 Oct. Between the above dates the following orders will be in force:

- (1) ALL RANKS will observe the following PERSONAL PRECAUTIONS:-
- a) Between sunset and one hour after sunrise sleeves will be rolled down and slacks worn. Mosquito repellents will be smeared on all exposed surfaces of the body every six hours when not protected by a net.
 - b) Mosquito nets will be used to sleep in at night. These will be properly maintained, erected and utilised. When, for operational reasons, it is not possible to use a net, repellent and a veil will be used.
- (2) LIEUT V G JACKS is detailed as unit Malaria Officer.
- (3) Each coy will detail forthwith one NCO and 3 ORs as full time malaria squads. Such squads will not be employed on other duties. Each coy will also detail one NCO and 3 ORs as reserve squads.
- (4) Both regular and reserve squads will report to the MO at times appointed by him for trng.
- (5) Duties of coy malaria squads are as detailed in APPX "A" to Unit Part I Order No 23 dated 25 Apr 44, which appx along with this order will be read to all ranks at least once each week until the unit is fully malaria conscious.
- (6) Unit malaria officer is responsible for the following:-
- a) supervision of malaria squads.
 - b) inspection of anti malaria eqpt which consists of the following items:- civouac tents, mosquito nets, veils, gauntlets and sprayers.
 - c) supply to coys of mepacrine, lysol, Malariol, repellent and Paris Green.
 - d) eradication of breeding grounds within the area.
 - e) destruction of adult mosquitos in Unit area.
 - f) maintenance of mepacrine register, hereafter mentioned.
 - g) reporting weekly to the CO on the state of eqpt and anti malaria efficiency.
- (7) The MO will be responsible for trng the squad and will advise the malaria offr in his duties.
- (8) Mepacrine
- a) Each coy will keep a mepacrine register by platoons. This register will be marked daily by the offr or senior off NCO observing the taking of mepacrine tablets and will be kept in such form that it can be turned in weekly to the M.O. Satisfactory explanations for blank entries (i.e. leave, course etc) will be made to the MO when weekly report submitted. Personnel proceeding on leave or course will be issued with one tablet for every day of their absence.
 - b) Mepacrine will be taken daily under the personal supervision and observation of an offr or senior NCO after the evening meal and followed by a glass of tea or water.

2. RED CROSS FLAG

- 1) As the procedure to be adopted when enemy are seen in no-man's land under cover of the Red Cross is not clear, the following general instructions are issued for future guidance.
- 2) It must be clearly understood that protection of the Red Cross flag to certain people and for certain purposes must be scrupulously observed by our troops. The tending and evacuation of wounded from no-man's land under cover of the Red Cross is allowed and must be observed. Incidents have occurred which have shown that the enemy has acted in a correct fashion under cover of the Red Cross, and it has been reported that they have on occasion returned wounded to our lines in this way. For this they must be respected.
- 3) On the other hand, incidents have occurred when the enemy have taken advantage of the Red Cross and have acted not only in a suspicious manner, but have actually committed hostile acts under cover of a Red Cross Flag.
- 4) All troops will therefore be particularly on their guard when they see the enemy using a Red Cross Flag, and the enemy will be kept continually covered by our weapons.
- 5) If the enemy acts in a suspicious manner while he is collecting his wounded under cover of the Red Cross Flag, and takes advantage of this legitimate use of it to commit a hostile act or even to reconnoitre, it is the responsibility of the post commander to open fire.
- 6) No scruples will be allowed to stand in the way of opening fire when it is quite clear that the enemy is abusing the Red Cross.

3. PARLEMENTAIRES AND FLAGS OF TRUCE

- 1) As the procedure to be adopted should enemy approach our lines under cover of a white flag is not clear to the forward troops, the following general instructions are issued for guidance. Detailed instructions on the legal aspect are being issued separately to formations.
- 2) By the rules of war, the enemy is entitled at any time to send a "parlementaire" under cover of a white flag to our lines, and provided the action of the parlementaire is correct, he is entitled to immunity and must be treated with courtesy.
- 3) The principal conditions which a parlementaire must observe are that he must be accompanied by not more than three other persons, and that he must approach our lines slowly and deliberately with a white flag prominently displayed. If the enemy continues firing during the advance of the parlementaire, then fire may be returned, provided that care is taken not to hit the parlementaire and his party. Great care must be exercised by the post which the parlementaire approaches to ensure that the enemy does not attempt to take advantage of his position. He will be directed to approach the post in the most suitable way covered by the weapons in the post. On arrival, he will be asked to produce his credentials, authorising him by the enemy to be a parlementaire. This document must be signed by a high ranking enemy officer (corps commander or above) and state the reasons for which the parlementaire has approached our lines. As a post commander will probably have difficulty in ascertaining whether this authorisation is in order, he will in all cases at once report the arrival of the parlementaire to higher authority, and will send the authorisation for scrutiny. Receipt for this authorisation will be given to the parlementaire, but the receipt will not disclose the unit or formation of the person who signs it. Pending further orders, the post commander will detain the parlementaire and his party where they can see nothing of our dispositions and they may be blindfolded if necessary. The party will, however, be treated with courtesy. If the authorisation is found to be in order, the party will be conducted to the rear blindfolded, and arrangements will be made by HQ AAI for their return to the enemy lines in due course. If the authorisation is found to be incorrect, the party will be treated as prisoners of war.

3. PARLEMENTAIRES AND FLAGS OF TRUCE - (Con'd)

4) It is stressed that the protection of a white flag will only be afforded to enemy who approach one of our posts slowly and deliberately and who obey all our directions. Protection will not be afforded to enemy who are seen in no-man's land with a white flag unless they conform strictly to the conditions prescribed above.

(AAI RO No. 56 of 14 Apr 44)





PRELIMINARY TRACK DIAGRAM



Patrolling

- 1 Owing to the wide frontages and the extremely difficult nature of the country on our present front the coordination of patrolling will be on a Bn level.
- 2 Bn Comds will decide upon a policy of patrolling and will issue the outline plan for seven to ten days in advance. Copies of the Bn patrol policy and the outline plan are to be submitted to Bde HQ for info of flanking Bns.
- 3 Coy Comds will prepare their detailed plans based on the Bn outline plan and these detailed plans will be coordinated by Bn. Personnel of all patrols must be briefed well in advance of the patrol going out. Where possible, patrol comds should be given a free hand, provided the info desired is obtained or the action required is carried out.
- 4 It is thought that it is not yet fully realized by junior officers and NCOs who may be in cmd of patrols that duplication of routes, time, destination, role, etc. of patrols of the night before, or even of two or three nights before, is asking for trouble. A great deal of thought must be given to ways and means of confusing the enemy as to the intention of the patrol. A standing patrol must NEVER be sent to the same place by the same route two nights running. Every effort should be made so that a different place and a different route is used each time.
- 5 If casualties, including fatal casualties, occur during patrols, the following procedure will be followed:
- Wounded casualties MUST be brought back if humanly possible and providing there is not a risk of further heavy casualties.
 - Fatal casualties should be brought in if possible and providing there is not a risk of further casualties. If the distance to own lines is great, then the body should be removed several hundred yards nearer our own lines. This should allow for the body to be brought in at a later date without risk of enemy ambush.
 - It would be an unjustifiable risk to send a party out the following night to recover a body that had not been removed several hundred yards from where the casualty occurred.
 - The senior member of the patrol must always be the judge as to what action is to be taken in case of casualties. The above principles must be known by all members of the patrol before going out.
- 6 When briefing patrols, it is safer to assume they know nothing about patrolling and therefore give them very full instructions, than it is to assume they know a lot, and therefore give them little direction.
