## WAR DIARIES, C.A.S.F.

### Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

1. A War Diary is **SECRET**.
2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.
3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.
4. Post-war disposal will be as under:
  - Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.
  - Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.
  - Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.
5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mobn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:
  - (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary.
  - (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
  - (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
  - (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:—
    - Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

- (v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meteorological notes.
  - (vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.
  7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.
  8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.
  9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.
- NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

## UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

### 1. *Titles and Numbering of Files.*

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned

### 2. *Date reference.*

In giving communications a reference number, it is convenient to use the date system of four figures indicating day and month, e.g. 0102 for 1st February; 3010 for 30th October.

### 3. *Combined Numeration.*

If the systems outlined in paras 1 and 2 are combined, by placing the four date figures under the subject file numbers, a simple and informative method of reference results, thus

$$\begin{array}{r} 2-6-1 \\ \hline 0804 \end{array}$$

might be immediately identified as a communication dealing with replacement of gas masks, dated 8th April.

NOTE.—This method is not applicable to signal messages, A.F.C. 2128, which bear serial numbers 1 to 9999. The use of dashes eliminates confusion between serial numbers and file numbers.

### 4. *Documents for Preservation.*

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

### 5. *Correspondence in the Field.*

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.



1. AIR LETTERS AND GREEN ENVELOPES - BASE CENSORSHIP

(a) In future all ORS Air Letters will be subject to the same censorship regs as ordinary Green Envelopes. They will not be unit censored.

Offrs will continue to frank their own Air Letters as at present.

(b) Where ordinary Air Letters are used the Green Envelope certificate will be overprinted on the back under frank or unit arrangements, or written on by the sender.

(c) The postage rate remains at 3d., and the scale of issue will continue at three Air Letters per man per two weeks.

(d) The scale of issue of Green Envelopes is reduced to one per man per two weeks.

2. HITCH-HIKING

Owing to the volume of traffic on rds, and the delays and congestion caused by halting vehs, hitch-hiking will cease forthwith.

3. BREACHES OF CENSORSHIP

(a) Cases have recently been brought to notice that officers travelling to UK by air have taken home with them, on behalf of other officers, mail which had not been passed by the Base Censor in this theatre.

(b) This is contrary to censorship regulations. These regulations which form an appendix to 1 CRO 35 of 1944, state specifically:-

"It is forbidden to transmit or carry private correspondence for posting or delivery outside this theatre unless such communications have been examined and passed by Base Censor. Unit censorship and the fixing of the Unit Censor Stamp is not sufficient.

(c) On leaving this theatre all ranks may be required to sign a certificate as follows:-

"I hereby certify that I am not carrying out of this theatre any personal communications or documents which have not been passed by a Base Censor. I further certify that all such matter carried bears the impression of the official Base censorship stamp".

(d) Mail carried in contravention of these orders is intercepted in the UK either at the arrival Airport or in transit. It is then examined and returned to this theatre, opened.

(e) Officers who carry such mail and those who send mail home are contravening security orders and are liable to disciplinary action unless the mail has first been examined and passed by Base Censor.

4. DISPOSAL OF KIT

Sick and Wounded Personnel.

Att as Appendix "A" to this order are instruction re: the m/n as published in CRO No 248 d/4 May 44.



5. EMPLOYMENT OF CIVILIAN LABOUR AND ITALIAN MILITARY PERSONNEL

1. It is expected that increasing numbers of "planted" agents will be left by the retreating enemy.

2. The casual employment of civilians as cooks, mess orderlies, etc without reference to security authorities, and the issue of Allied military uniforms to other than members of the Allied Forces provides excellent opportunities for enemy agents. One agent captured recently had been employed for a number of weeks by a unit in NINEITH Army area.

3. ARO 169 as follows, is applicable to 1 Cdn Corps:

"1. It has been noted that units are recruiting civilian labour and individual Italian soldiers and permitting them to accompany the unit when it moves from one locality to another.

2. Any unit employing civilians, who have not been officially recruited, will arrange for their immediate return to their homes.

3. Any unit employing Italian military personnel other than those of a recognized Italian Pioneer Coy or Italian Military Labour unit, will arrange for their immediate return to the Italian Transit Camp at VAIRANO.

4. Any unit which considers that the retention of Italian military or civilian personnel is justified, will make the necessary application to DDL, EIGHTH Army. Authority will only be granted for their retention in very exceptional cases and where absolute necessity is proved."

4. Any breaches of this order will be reported and may be published in AROs.

6. CENSORSHIP - RELEASE

1. Reference may be made to participation in the battle of CASSINO up to and including 18 May 44, subject to strict observance of censorship regulations governing account of battle experience, as reproduced in para 2 hereunder.

2. In connection with any mention of individual and personal participation in such operations, the following rules will be observed by all ranks, and unit censors will be held responsible for an intelligent interpretation thereof:

(a) No geographical locality other than the sector authorized will be identified eg in this the F GARI may be mentioned, but not the names of villages, etc, on or near the river.

(b) When there is a limiting date, troops whose participation in the operation commenced after the limiting date, may NOT mention participation.

(c) No military formation or unit (even the writer's own) will be identified except by correct return address.

(d) No mention of participation in the above operations is permitted.

(i) In green envelope mail and privilege air letters.

(ii) In letters addressed to countries other than the United Kingdom, Eire, British Empire, Continental United States of America.

(iii) In telegrams.

3. Particular attention will be paid to para 2 (b) above.

## APPENDIX "A"

### Disposal of Kit Sick and Wounded Personnel

1. Kit and effects of personnel reported DEAD, MISSING, INTERNED or PW will continue to be disposed of in accordance with Part III SPM, Sec 10, and detail instruction issued by O2E.

2. The following procedure, based on the authorized holding of one kit bag by each OR, covering evacuation and handling of kits for SICK and WOUNDED personnel, hereinafter referred to as casualties, will be taken into use forthwith.

#### ACTION BY UNITS

3. (a) Casualties will be evacuated with articles of personal clothing and small kit only. Normally the casualty will carry with him the following items. Haversack containing, mess tin, knife, fork and spoon, drinking cup, shaving, washing kit, respirator and tooth brush.
- (b) Remainder of kit will be turned into unit stores. In cases of light sick personnel kit may be held up to fourteen days.
- (c) All items of Ord Sup and Eqpt except personal clothing and necessaries, but incl second suit Battle dress if in possession will be sorted and withdrawn into unit stores. Where such stocks accumulate above normal holding, they will be returned through Ord Channels.
- (d) An inventory of remaining articles incl personal effects certified by an offr will be taken and enclosed in the kit bag which will be plainly labelled showing Regtl No, Rank, Name, Unit and article. Unit will retain one copy of the nominal roll.

#### ACTION BY MFO

- (a) Cdn MFO at 1 Cdn Corps Hft Camp will fwd Kits to No 3 Cdn Kit Disposal Unit.

#### ACTION BY 3 CDN KIT DISPOSAL UNIT

- (a) On receipt of kits a numbered card will be created and maint in a Card Index, for the kit of each casualty.
- Card will show: Regtl No, Rank, Name, Description of article/s Received from (Unit), issued (to be completed when kit is issued).
- (b) Inventory will be checked, initialled if in agreement or a Kit Inventory Discrepancy Report proforma will be completed, one copy fwd to OC, unit concerned, one copy to Cdn MFO and one copy retained where differences exist.
- (c) Kit will be stored in numerical order in accordance with Card Index Number.
- (d) Nominal rolls will be submitted DAILY to O2E for cas tracing.
- (e) Nominal rolls marked FDS, CCS or UNKNOWN will be resubmitted to O2E at four day intervals for retracing.
- (f) Individual notice cards will be despatched by POST or DRLS to personnel in BASE UNITS, HCSPS, or CONV DEPOTS. Cards will NOT be sent to Medical Installations fwd of BASE HCSPS or to Fd Units unless O2E records show that the casualty has been discharged from a fwd Medical Unit.

4. Issues of kit by 3 Cdn Kit Disposal Unit will be made as follows:

TO: BASE MEDICAL INSTALLATIONS:

- (a) Issues will only be made to Hosps and conv Depots on the request of OC who will submit a nominal roll in duplicate showing Regtl No, Rank, Name, Unit and Notice Card Number, if known, to 3 Cdn Kit Disposal Unit.
- (b) Kits will be made available 24 hrs after request is received and will be delivered under arrangements of 1 CBRGP. O'AC will only request kit that is required by individual.
- (c) Kits of deceased personnel will be fwd direct to Cdn OZE in accordance with previous instructions.

TO: RFT BNS

- (a) OSC Rft Bns will submit daily to 3 Cdn Kit Disposal Unit nominal rolls of all personnel to be from Medical Installations.
- (b) O3 Rft Bn will be advised when kits are available and kits will be collected by Unit trav.
- (c) When kits of personnel are required immediately special arrangements may be made with 3 Cdn Kit Disposal Unit.

TO: MD UNITS

- (a) On request or on being advised by OZE that a cas has been discharged from a Med Unit and is with a Fd Unit, kits will be tagged by 3 Cdn Kit Disposal Unit showing Regtl No, Rank, Name and Unit and fwd to Cdn MFO at Cdn Corps Rft Camp. Move of kit will be under arrangements of 1 CBRGP in conjunc with DADM, 1 Ecol.
- (b) Three copies of a nominal roll, showing Regtl No, Rank, Name, and unit will accompany kits for each unit. One copy to be receipted by Cdn MFO on delivery and returned to No. 3 Cdn Kit Disposal Unit.

TO: UK

- (a) All kits for return to UK as unaccompanied baggage, will be listed under three headings, i.e.,  
LIST "A" - Personnel returned by Air.  
LIST "B" - Personnel returned on Hosp Ship.  
LIST "C" - Personnel returned on previous drafts.
- (b) No. 3 Cdn Kit Disposal Unit will segregate kits in accordance with above headings, and will tag kits as under:

- (d) 1 CBRGP will be responsible for the collection of all unaccompanied baggage from No 3 Cdn Kit Disposal Unit and will render



1. CANIBALIZATION OF TANKS

Instances have arisen during recent ops of personnel stripping eqpt from disabled tanks. In future offenders will be subject to severe disciplinary action and will be required to pay cost of all damage caused thereby.

2. ANTI-MALARIA PRECAUTIONS

Hereafter until further notice anti-malaria parade each evening will be held at 2000 hrs. It is noticed that anti malaria drill has lapsed since ~~the~~ ops. This will not be permitted and a high state of anti malaria discipline will be insisted on at all times. Tents bivouac and nets will be checked forthwith and repaired. Those unserviceable will be reported to the Q.M.

3. SHELL DRESSINGS

Disciplinary action will be taken in all cases where shell dressings are used for any purpose other than that for which they are intended. These are in short supply and must be conserved.

4. FRESH VEGETABLES

Before fresh vegetables are used they will be thoroughly washed in chlorinated water. The proper solution is one scoop of chloride to 1 gal of water.

5. LATRINES

All latrines will be inspected and necessary repairs carried out to make them flyproof. Portable latrines will NOT be left behind on change of location.

6. DRESS

Personnel have been noted improperly dressed outside unit lines in particular not wearing shirts. ALL personnel will be properly dressed outside of unit lines at all times and charges will be laid by pro in all cases of contravention of this order.

7. MAIL

Throughout the Bn there appears to be some doubt as to the correct procedure of preparing outgoing mail for delivery from this theatre of ops. The following must be strictly adhered to in order to avoid delay and confusion.

(a) ALL Air mail letter forms MUST have stamps. These letters are not unit censored but the individual must declare the letter by writing the certificate as appears on the Green Envelope on the back of the Air Mail.

(b) ALL ordinary mail will be unit censored unless placed in a green envelope.







4. GERMAN INTERROGATION METHODS

(i) It is known that the Germans are making considerable use of microphones and stool-pigeons in their interrogations of PW. One example of the German use of stool-pigeons is as follows:-

The stool-pigeons work in pairs (one of them invariably being German) and are, after being briefed, put in a cell to await the arrival of the PW. The stool-pigeons lead off with a catalogue of their own woes, going into considerable detail and "giving away" a good deal of info. This method improves confidence in the genuine PW, who hereafter, usually talk freely, having been "softened up" by "wine and beer food". The PW is after a time called out for interrogation, and on his return the stool-pigeons play on his reaction and get the details which have not been divulged at the interrogation. Periodically the stool-pigeons are called out for interrogation and present their reports.

(ii) There is reason to believe that this method is achieving a certain success. The possible use by the enemy of microphones and stool pigeons from the first moment of capture will be impressed on all ranks immediately, and will be a regular point of instruction to newly arrived int personnel.

1. DISCIPLINE  
Restrictions in Naples

(i) It has been brought to the attention of this HQ that there is considerable unauthorized entry into NAPLES and improper use of transport for the purpose. Steps will be taken to stop this. Infringements of the orders in force will lead to NAPLES being placed "OFF LIMITS" or "OUT OF BOUNDS" to the formation or unit concerned.

(ii) No leave which entails spending a night in NAPLES will be granted and no Leave or Rest Camp Centres, or Hostels, will be established in the city.

(iii) Every officer and man within the Metropolitan Area of NAPLES must be in possession of a pass, which will be produced on demand by Military Police or any other authorized posts.

(a) For leave personnel, unit, date and particulars of organized leave parties will be shown. Passes will be given from 0800 hrs to 1800 hrs, except in the case of officers, who will not be subject to a time limit; except as in para 2 above.

2. TRANSPORT - CONTROL OF

(i) Load carrying vehicles of all units operating in rear of Eighth Army boundary and 5 Corps rear boundary will carry work tickets (AFG 3518) at all times unless covered by a Convoy Note. AB 412 will be carried also.

(ii) All work tickets will give specific details for each journey. Column 2 of the work ticket will show the actual details of the service performed and such items as "Camp Deta'ls" or "Company Duties" will not be used.

(iii) Instructions will be issued at all PPs that POL will only be issued to drivers of load-carrying vehicle who produce a properly completed work ticket or special pass (see para 5). Details of POL issued will be entered on the reverse of the Work Ticket by the petrol issuer, such entries will be transferred to AB 412.

(iv) Work tickets will not be signed by an individual below the rank of Sergeant, or NCO IC Section of an RASC Unit. They will be examined weekly, under Unit arrangements, by an officer, who will sign a certificate to the effect that they are satisfactory.

(v) All Load-carrying vehicles passing out of the Eighth Army or 5 Corps areas, as referred to in para 1, will be in possession of a special pass authorizing them to do so, stating route to be taken, destination, and where possible, date of return. This pass will be signed by the CO of the unit, the Adjutant or a Grade II Staff Officer.

3. GUARDIAN OF WAR DEPARTMENT VEHICLES

(i) In future, WD vehicles (including motorcycles) will never be left unattended except:  
(a) when essential on operation grounds.  
(b) on account of other urgent necessity.  
(c) in circumstances in which immobilization has been authorized.

(ii) All units have MT on charge will arrange for their Vehicles Parks to be guarded by day and night.

### 3. GUARDING OF WAR DEPARTMENT VEHICLES (cont'd)

(iii) When on duty, it is the driver's responsibility to ensure that arrangements are made for his vehicle to be safe guarded at all times.

He must ensure that any car park or DR's motor-cycle park in which he leaves his vehicle is officially authorized and guarded.

(iv) The Military Police will not be used to guard vehicles of units other than their own. The duty at car parks, e. g., is to control traffic and parking of vehicles, and the fact that they are present does not absolve any driver from his responsibility for safeguarding his own vehicle.

(v) The practice of immobilizing vehicles often leads to mechanical inefficiency and damage.

This method of safeguarding vehicles will no longer be used, except when ordered by Divisional or higher HQ in an operational area.

(vi) Disciplinary action will be taken against drivers who leave their vehicles unattended, except as in para (I (a), (b) and (c) above; and where as a result the vehicle, or any WD property contained therein, is lost the offender will normally be tried by Court Martial.

Disciplinary action will also be considered against officers who fail to ensure that their drivers observe the provisions of this order.

### 4. DRIVING OF WAR DEPARTMENT VEHICLES

(i) No person, other than the following, will at any time be permitted to drive any WD vehicle except in an operational emergency.

(a) The properly appointed driver or drivers.

(b) Officers and NCOs of the unit responsible for the maintenance of the vehicle on charge.

(c) Those duly appointed to testing, inspecting and instructional duties.

(d) Men under instruction on journeys specially authorized for that purpose.

(ii) When, owing to fatigue or other reasons, the driver is not in a fit state to carry out his duties, motor-cars may be driven on duty journeys by Officers, other than those referred to above, provided that:-

(a) Such officers are fully qualified to drive

(b) The driver allotted to the vehicle always accompanies his vehicle

(iii) An officer or other rank who in future contravenes this order will be subject to disciplinary action. All local orders will republish the substance of this GRO and COs will bring to the notice of all ranks that under King's Regulations, 1940, para 681 (a), a Court Martial may pay regard to the fact that this warning has been issued when awarding sentence.

5. DUTIES



5. SALUTING

LCRO d/21 Jun 44

(a) When two or more other ranks are walking out and pass an offr or offr, all the other ranks will salute as laid down in the manual of Elementary Drill (All Arms), 1935, Sec 74.

(b) A salute made to two or more offr in a street or other public place out of doors will be returned by all the offr saluted. In camps, unit lines or on parade, the salute will be returned by the senior offr only.

(c) When two or more British offr meet an Allied offr or offr, all British offr will either salute or acknowledge the salute of the Allied offr, as the case may be. The rank of the British or Allied offr is immaterial.

The badges of rank of Allied Military Forces should be studied by all ranks.

(d) All ranks will salute offr of higher rank in cars which display authorized flags or stars. The latter distinguishing signs, which are covered when the offr is travelling; consist of red material on plates with one or more stars according to rank displayed on the front and rear of the car.

(e) Offrs and soldiers, on detachment, will show by the standard of their saluting their determination to maintain with pride the reputation of their unit, corps and formations.

6. CAP BADGES

The silvering of cap badges will cease and personnel presently with white badges will polish them clean immediately.

7. CLEANLINESS AND SANITATION

This unit has always had a good reputation for cleanliness and sanitation. In order to maintain this reputation the following steps will be observed:-

- (a) Offrs and NCOs are responsible that their coy, pl or sec areas are clean and tidy at all times. All paper and other burnable refuse will be placed in containers and will be burned daily. Tin cans and other refuse which cannot be burned will be placed in a Coy dump which will be covered over and re-dug daily.
- (b) UNBURNED AND UNSURRIED REFUSE ATTRACTS FLIES. FLIES CARRY DISLASE. KEEP IT BURNED AND BURRIED AND KEEP HEALTHY.
- (c) Orange peels etc., thrown on ground during picture shows, shows a distinct lack of "Pride of Regt."
- (d) Containers are being placed around the camp, USE THEM!

2. SECURITY - CIVILIAN LABOUR


- a) As the Army advances, there is grave danger of units unwittingly employing agents and saboteurs left behind by the enemy as he retreats.
- b) In order to eliminate this danger as far as possible, units will not engage civilian labour except through the Civil Labour Unit or AMG as provided by "Rules Governing the Employment of Civilian Labour in EIGHTH Army" forwarded with 1 CRO 132/44.
- c) All civilians, except unskilled labour, will be vetted by FS prior to engagement in accordance with 1 CRO 141/44.
- f) Chief gangers and gangers will be carefully vetted and held responsible for the bona-fides of the personnel in their charge.
- g) Civil Labour Units and A G officers will pay particular attention to the selection of personnel for gangers and Chief gangers.
- h) No applications for employment will be considered in respect of:
- (i) Persons who come from, or whose homes are in, enemy occupied territory, except those for whom authority has already been granted by DDL.
  - (ii) Persons not in possession of a valid identity document issued in territory under Allied Control.
- i) On no account will units employ individual Italian soldiers unless these personnel are of an Italian unit allotted to the unit concerned by authority of GS (D) EIGHTH Army.
- j) Severe disciplinary action will be taken against anyone contravening this order.

3. CIGARETTES AND TOBACCO

- a) Cigarettes and tobacco which are being transported to this theatre in ships which are urgently required for other uses are being used for improper purposes by certain personnel of the Cdn Army.
- b) The sale, exchange, disposal or attempted sale or disposal, directly or indirectly of cigarettes or tobacco by any member of the Cdn Army Overseas to any member of other Allied forces or civilians is prohibited.
- c) Para 2 above must not, however, be construed as meaning the practice of free sharing or free distribution by COs of tobacco or cigarettes to any personnel of the Cdn Army Overseas is illegal or in fact is to be in any way discouraged.
