WAR DIARIES, C.A.S.F.

Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

1. A War Diary is SECRET.

2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (K.R. Can. Para. 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the A.G., 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to A.G., 2nd Echelon.

4. Post-war disposal will be as under:

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on M.F.M. 11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mdn. Instr. for C.M. 1937. App. "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (F.S.R. Vol. II, Sec. 35, para. 3 iii).

**THE EXTRACTION AND RETENTION OF APPENDICES, MAPS, ETC., FROM A WAR DIARY IS AN OFFENCE
UNDER THE OFFICIAL SECRETS ACT**

6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:

- (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the Original copy of the War Diary.
- (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
- (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the *routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders*, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
- (iv) Detailed account of operations—to include:—
Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc., names of Officers and number of O.R. (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. *Maps and sketches* showing dispositions of batteries, companies etc., at important phases. The record of *communications, both written and verbal*, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the *operation orders and instructions* issued during the month. Notes on conferences and *reports* rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.

(v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed.
Meteorological notes.

(vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of O.R. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. *Copy of Part II Orders and Weekly Field Returns of Officers and O.R.* should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.

7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.

8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (F.S.R. Vol. I, see. 171, para. 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary.

9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.

NOTE: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

UNIT OFFICE FILING SYSTEM AND RECORDS

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (F.S.R. Vol. I. Sec. 171.3.)

1. Titles and Numbering of Files.

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, 1 to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-7-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston." According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned.

2. Date reference.

In giving communications a reference number, it is convenient to use the date system of four figures indicating day and month, e.g. 0102 for 1st February; 3010 for 30th October.

3. Combined Numeration.

If the systems outlined in paras 1 and 2 are combined, by placing the four date figures under the subject file numbers, a simple and informative method of reference results, thus

might be immediately identified as a communication dealing with replacement of gas masks, dated 8th April.

NOTE.—This method is not applicable to signal messages, A.F.C. 2128, which bear serial numbers 1 to 9999. The use of dashes eliminates confusion between serial numbers and file numbers.

4. Documents for Preservation.

The monthly review of correspondence (F.S.R. Vol. I, sec. 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc.) to conform with the system.

5. Correspondence in the Field.

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, F.S.R. Vol. I. sec. 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

A brief précis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.






7. CAPTURED ENEMY MATERIAL

(1) Responsibility

It is the responsibility of all commanders in the field to collect, safeguard and evacuate all types of enemy captured material.

(2) Priority

The first priority for the evacuation and disposal of all captured material will be for technical intelligence purposes, e.g., technical examination and research.

(3) Procedure

(1) New types of enemy equipment will be reported immediately by unit intelligence officers to the intelligence officer of the next higher formation. Wherever possible this channel will also be used for the evacuation of items of interest to technical intelligence staffs. Where swift evacuation through intelligence channels is not practical (e.g. in the case of heavy equipment such as tanks and large calibre guns) new specimens of interest will be adequately safeguarded and exact locations of the equipment will be reported immediately by the next higher formation. Brief details of the equipment will also be obtained by the unit intelligence officer and forwarded through these channels.

(ii) Captured enemy ammunition and explosives of all types will be handled in strict accordance with 1 CRO 444.

(iii) Captured enemy material which is not required for technical examination and research will be handed over to RCOG and in the case of rations and petrol to RCASC. These services will make returns to the next higher formation.

(4) Retention of Captured Material

The unauthorized retention of any captured material is a punishable offence. Captured material is the property of the Allied Forces and not that of the individual or unit into whose hands it may fall.

(5) Removal of Captured Material from the Theatre

The removal from the theatre of captured enemy material of any description without written authority issued in accordance with policies established by the A.C. of S, G-2 AFHQ, is strictly forbidden.

8.

UNAUTHORIZED ALTERATION TO CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

(a) Attention of all ranks is directed to Overseas RO 4074 of 43.

(b) It is particularly emphasized that such alterations as sewing sleeves into leather jerkins and making garments from blankets are NOT authorized and the practice will cease.

9.

CHRISTMAS 1944 - AIR LETTERS TO UK

(1) General Routine Order 555, dated 20 Oct 44, notified that one "FREE" Air Letter may be sent by each man during the weeks ending 4, 11, 18 and 25 Nov 44. Each "FREE" Air Letter will have the word "FREE" written by the sender in the top right hand corner where the postage stamp would normally be placed.

(2) "FREE" Air Letters will bear the impression of the unit censorship stamp.

(3) Special arrangements will be made in the UK to ensure that delivery of the "FREE" Air Letters as near as possible to Christmas Day.

10. BLANKETS

AAI RG 290 of 20 Oct 44 is repeated for attention of all concerned.

- (1) There is a shortage of blankets throughout the world and it is unlikely that the total number of blankets due to this theatre this year will be shipped.
- (2) Numerous cases are reported by the Army Equipment inspect-
orate of blankets being used for tablecloths, curtains, and other purposes for which they are not intended. If this misuse continues, it will not be possible to implement in all units in this theatre the full winter scale of four per man.
- (3) OSC units will take immediate action to stop the misuse of blankets and disciplinary action will be taken against offenders in future. Any surplus blankets held will be returned forthwith to ordnance.

- (i) All sources of water in this theatre will be regarded as contaminated and must be chlorinated whether intended for human consumption or for washing purposes. Dual water sups, e.g. pure for drinking and impure for washing will NOT be allowed. Thirsty men are liable to drink any water.
- (ii) When units are drawing water from other than supervised water pts est by the RCE or RE, unit water duty personnel will carry out filtration, chlorination, and de-chlorination in the manner laid down.
- (iii) Fwd tps who cannot be served by unit water vehs will chlorinate and de-chlorinate all water by means of their individual sterilising outfit. Full instrs as to their use are contained in the outfit.

4. CASH ISSUES TO ORS

An advance or pay to ORs or the equivalent in local currency of \$15.00 is authorised for the purchase of Christmas presents for despatch home, provided that such advance will NOT create a debit balance in the pay book.

5. INDIVIDUAL PURCHASE OF CIGARETTES

1. The No. 1 Can Tobacco Depot, CMF is receiving numerous orders from personnel already in excess of the authorised quota of 900 cigarettes per man per month. In some instances individual quotas are filled several months in advance, yet individual orders are still being received.
2. Both individual purchases and gift parcels of cigarettes from Canada are applied against their monthly quota.
3. Considerable difficulty is also being experienced due to the fact that Unit Post Orderlies are not completing

postal orders properly.

4. Postal Orderly will, therefore, see that postal orders purchased in respect of cigarettes will be left blank. No. 1 Cdn Tobacco Depot, CMF, will complete details in favour of Tobacco Company Concerned.

EXPEDITIONARY FORCE MESSAGES SERVICE -
SUSPENSION DURING CHRISTMAS 1944

- (a) Experience has shown that during Christmas periods the traffic in Expeditionary Force Messages is so great that available facilities are inadequate to carry the load.
- (b) EFM telegrams will therefore not be accepted during period 6 to 25 Dec 44, both dates inclusive.

3. DISCIPLINE - REMOVAL OF LAMPS-TRAFFIC CONTROL

There have been a number of cases of unauthorized persons removing lamps placed by QM on roads and diversions. This illegal practice, besides endangering life and material, may affect ops in that essential routes may be blocked by accidents.

4. SUP OF BLANKETS

- (a) An acute shortage of blankets now exists in this theatre.
- (b) Last winter this fm was supplied an average of over 3000 blankets per month to replace those lost or stolen, or for issue to rfts coming fwd with only one or two blankets. Due to shortage referred above, this will not be possible this winter.
- (c) All ranks in this fm should be in possession of four blankets. When sick or wounded are evac there should be no drain on unit's blanket sup provided blankets of the cas are collected, laundered and held in QM Stores as per Div intrs. Under no circumstances will blankets be used for any other purpose than for which they are intended.

5. CURFEW

Effective 6 Nov 44 curfew for civilians will commence 1800 hrs and cease 0500 hrs A time.

8. LEGAL TENDER IN ITALY

1. All Metropolitan and Allied Military Lire are legal tender.
2. Administrative Instructions, as under, have been issued by E.P.I.
 - (a) Not to accept badly damaged Metropolitan Lire Notes, as Bank of Italy will not take them back. Not to accept Metropolitan 1000 Lire notes, as none are issued by British Cashiers.
 - (b) Not to accept an Allied Military 1000 Lire note without taking particulars of the individual tendering it. Very few 1000 Lire Allied Military notes are issued by Cashiers. A considerable number of forged notes exist.
 - (c) A number of counterfeit 1000 Lire Allied Military Currency notes are in circulation. They may be recognized by the presence of any of the following faults:
 - (i) A decided difference in the feel of the paper, which is coarser to the touch than the genuine note.
 - (ii) Faded colouring.
 - (iii) Poor reproduction of the colouring of the plate at each corner of the note on which the numerals '1000' appear.
 - (iv) Figures in the serial number, especially the figure '4', not true to type.
- (d) All 1000 Lire AMG notes should be carefully examined before acceptance.

7. TRAFFIC CONTROL - PRIORITY SIGNS ON VEHICLES

A large number of vehs in Cdn Corps are displaying traffic priority notices. These priorities are meaningless when traffic is flowing properly, and tend to encourage drivers to double back during bad traffic blocks, thereby increasing the confusion and the length of time taken to clear the block. Priority notices will, therefore, be removed forthwith from all vehs in 1 Cdn Corps.

The only exception to this rule will be priorities laid down by corps Headquarters within the Corps area for a specific op. These priority notices will be removed as soon as the need for them has passed.

Vehs may continue to display notices showing the special nature of their load, e.g. Blood Bank, R.E. Equipment, Stores, Bridging, Tank Transporter, M.I.B., Army Mails, etc, but the word "PRIORITY" will not be used. Such vehs are normally given special consideration by Pro.

If it is considered urgent that a particular veh or convoy should get through during a bad traffic block, the correct procedure is for a rep to go ahead to the nearest TCP, state the urgency and ask for a Pro escort. This procedure will only be adopted in cases of emergency.

Pro have been ordered to stop all vehs displaying "PRIORITY" notices and order their removal.

3. NATURALIZATION OF ALIENS
CANADIAN ARMY OVERSEAS

Attention is drawn to Overseas RO 5011 whereby aliens serving in the Canadian Army may apply for Naturalization, subject to certain conditions. Since this privilege is not available after discharge, it is suggested that any personnel in this category be interviewed by the Adjutant, through Coy Comd.

6. PARCEL POST

- (a) Reference GRC 682 of 1943.
- (b) The attention of all ranks is drawn to the instructions contained in para 27 of GRC 682/43 which directs that particulars of:-
 - (i) The sender's name and address.
 - (ii) The name and address of the person to whom it is being sent should be shown on a slip of paper enclosed with each parcel despatched.
- (c) The British Post Office has reported that many parcels undeliverable in the UK because the addressees cannot be determined (through loss of label or other reason), could be disposed of to the addressee or returned to the sender, were the instructions in para (b) above carried out.

7. TYPHUS FEVER

- 1. Typhus Fever is endemic in all parts of the theatre now occupied by our troops. With the approach of winter it is possible that this grave disease may reach epidemic proportions. The most serious consideration will, therefore, be given to the preventive measures against the disease.
- 2. Lice carry typhus. Measures of control will, therefore, chiefly be directed to preventing personnel becoming infested with lice.
- 3. Commanding officers will ensure that the following preventive measures receive full attention. Operational conditions may impose some limitations to full compliance with these precautions but such limitations must be reduced to a minimum if typhus is to be avoided.
 - (a) Personal Cleanliness. The highest standard of personal cleanliness must be maintained. All ranks will have a hot bath or shower once a week. Any man showing a suspicious skin condition will report to the Medical Officer. Sub-unit bath registers will be maintained.
 - (b) Laundry. A clean change of underclothing will be made available to each man at the time of his weekly bath.
 - (c) Clothing, bedding and necessaries. The communal use of clothing, bedding, towels and hair brushes will be forbidden.
 - (d) Health Inspections. These will be held at least once a fortnight by Unit Medical Officers. All other ranks will attend.
 - (e) Inoculations. All personnel should be inoculated with typhus vaccine and kept continuously protected by a "booster" inoculation every six months. Every effort will be made to maintain the inoculation state of 100%.

• (TYPHUS FEVER CONT'D)

(f) Contact with civilians. This will be avoided as far as possible. It may be necessary on the advice of Hygiene and Medical Officers to place out of bounds places of entertainment, barber shops, cafes, public vehicles and even whole localities.

4. Impregnated Shirts.

Supplies of shirts A/T which are impregnated with a chemical to give protection against lice are becoming available in this theatre. Priority of issue is being made to those troops exposed to special risks. Arrangements for re-impregnation of these shirts by Laundry Units are also in progress.

5. Disinfection and Disinfestation.

Disinfection and Disinfestation will be undertaken by units specially equipped for the purpose. The assistance of Hygiene officers is available and will be sought on all matters relating to these subjects.

6. Anti-Louse Powder

This powder is available from RASC supplies in accordance with the scales laid down in AFHQ Rations and fuel scales. It will be used weekly on the advice of the Medical Officer wherever there is a risk of louse infestation.

COURTS OF INQUIRY

In cases of absence without leave amounting to 21 days, Coy Comds will automatically convene a Court of Coy offrs on the 22nd day and submit the report as soon as possible.

CLEANLINESS

LOSS OF MAIL

(a) A considerable quantity of ordinary parcel post for addresses in the UK and the North West European Theatre was destroyed or damaged by fire on board ship at a Canadian port recently.

(b) The parcels in question were mailed in Canada between the approximate dates of 10 Oct 44 and 19 Oct 44.

(c) Examination of the debris has established that it is not unlikely that the fire was caused by matches which were enclosed in parcels. The enclosure of matches, lighter fluid, etc., in parcels constitutes a grave hazard in the holds of ships at sea and in goods wagons in which mails may be carried.

(d) The Postmaster-General of Canada intends to take legal action in any case where it is established that an overseas parcel contains matches. All ranks are warned that they must not request friends or relations in Canada to forward matches, lighter fluid or other inflammable material by mail.

(e) No letter or registered mails were lost in the fire referred to above.


