Instructions for Compilation and Despatch

- 1. A War Diary is SECRET.
- 2. The War Diary takes the place of the Historical Record when on active service. (KR (Can) Para 1530). Its objects are: to supply authentic material for the history of the unit, and of the force; to furnish a historical record of operations; and to provide data upon which to base improvements in training, equipment, organization and administration.
- 3. Unless otherwise ordered, the original and duplicate copies are sent on the first day of the succeeding month, through the usual channels, to the AG 2nd Echelon, wherever that office may be. The triplicate copy may be held by the unit for three months and then forwarded, also through the usual channels, to AG, 2nd Echelon. In Canada all copies as above are sent through the usual channels to NDHQ; in England to Canadian Military HQ.
 - (i) District Officers Commanding will arrange to forward War Diaries to National Defence Headquarters addressed Director Historical Section, GS (War Diaries) with covering roll, in duplicate, showing unit from which received and number of copies in each case; the duplicate roll will be returned as a receipt.
 - (ii) Formations and Units in the Ottawa Area Command will forward War Diaries direct to National Defence Headquarters (addressed Director Historical Section, GS (War Diaries)).
- 4. Post-war disposal will be as under:

Original—retained at Ottawa for historical purposes.

Duplicate—to British Record Office for historical purposes.

Triplicate—to unit for custody with unit records.

5. The War Diary will be entered up daily on MF M11 and rendered monthly in triplicate (Mobn Instr for CM 1937. App "C"). Each entry will be initialled by the officer detailed to keep the War Diary, which will be signed at the end of each month by the commander. (FSR Vol II, Sec 35, para 3 iii).

- 6. The following should be recorded daily as events occur:—
 - (i) Important orders, instructions, reports, messages or despatches received and issued, and decisions taken. *Original documents* should be attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary; copies should, whenever available, be attached as appendices to the duplicate and triplicate copies of the War Diary.
 - (ii) Daily map location, employment, movements and dispositions of unit headquarters and of batteries, companies, etc. March tables should be attached as appendices.
 - (iii) Important movements of officers and matters relating to the duties of each branch of the staff. A complete set of the routine orders and instructions, Part I Orders, issued by the unit during the month should be attached as an appendix to the original copy.
 - (iv) Detailed account of operations-to include: -Exact hour, location and circumstances of important occurrences. Movements and names of neighbouring units. Commanders of batteries, companies, etc, names of Officers and number of OR (i) engaged and (ii) battle casualties. Dispositions, activities and identity of enemy forces. Prisoners and trophies captured. Ammunition expended. Factors affecting operations, topographical and climatic. Maps and sketches showing dispositions of batteries, companies, etc, at important phases. The record of communications, both written and verbal, received or despatched during active operations as an appendix. A complete set of the operation orders and instructions issued during the month. Notes on conferences and reports rendered to higher formations, or received from lower formations, as appendices to the original copy.
 - (v) Nature and description of trenches, field works or accommodation occupied or constructed. Meterological notes.

- (vi) Changes in establishment or strength. Names and ranks of officers and number of OR. Attachment of units and individuals. Reinforcements. Weekly Field Returns of Officers and OR should be attached as appendices to the original copy. Copy of Part II Orders should be attached to the triplicate copy only. Changes in organization, stores, transport, etc.
- 7. It is essential that all copies of both text and appendices are legible. Appendices will be numbered and referenced to the text in the last column of the form. Current issues of any regimental publication should be attached.
- 8. It will be found convenient at the end of each month, when the War Diary is being completed and the correspondence in unit files for the month is being reviewed and distributed (FSR Vol I, sec 171, para 3) if the material considered to be of historical value in the light of the above is attached as appendices to the original copy of the War Diary, the file title and reference number being entered in conformity with the filing system.
- 9. A good war diary makes possible the accurate and detailed reconstruction of circumstances, conditions and action.
- Note: If monthly diary is more than one inch thick, use a second folder. If appendices are bulky, tie folder up with tape or string to make a firm package.

"Every office will arrange for the filing and custody of its own correspondence." (FSR Vol I, Sec 171.3.)

1. Titles and Numbering of Files

A simple filing system adaptable for use in any military office at home or in the field is illustrated by the "List of File Titles" overleaf.

All documents handled by a unit fall into one or other of the nine categories enumerated, I to 9. The titles of the nine main divisions are based on British army operations, organization, administration and the regulations governing. Each title may be broken down into ten component parts or sub-titles, by adding a dash and subsidiary numbers 0 to 9. In turn each of these may be further broken down by adding a second dash and a third digit, and if necessary a third dash and a fourth digit. Thus 4-6-3 might be "Cooking Course at Kingston". According to circumstances, a fighting unit would expand the 1-3 prefix to accommodate all arms and services with which it may be concerned.

2. Date reference

The method outlined in FSR, Vol II, Appendix IV, will be used for all purposes, e.g., 2 Feb 40.

3. Documents for Preservation

The monthly review of correspondence (FSR Vol I, sec 171.3) is facilitated and future confusion avoided by jacketing the material in "Category ii" (i.e., "no longer required", etc) to conform with the system.

4. Correspondence in the Field

The functioning of the office of a formation or unit during active operations may be simplified by keeping a log or register of all orders and messages, written or verbal, received or sent during the action. This may conveniently be done by extending the use of the "Field Register of Communications Received or Despatched", (Army Form 2040, FSR Vol I, sec 171) to include verbal as well as written orders and messages in chronological order as received or sent.

Time of sending and of receipt are of importance second only to time of event, and should be entered both on the office copy of every field message or other document, and in the log or register. A carbon copy for contemporary reference of the commander or others concerned is desirable.

VI

A brief precis of written orders, reports and messages, with the sender's number, is sufficient, for they will be kept on file. But particular care is necessary in making entries of times of moves and of verbal orders, reports or conversations, by telephone or otherwise, which in the stress of action, may not otherwise be recorded on paper. In battle, operations messages dealt with by one officer may number over twenty-five per hour for several hours on end.

The record should be kept convenient to the telephone. Entries may be made by a clerk, or by the officer on duty at the telephone.

Such a record is invaluable to the commander in making appreciations of the situation during the action, and in compiling his report on the action afterwards. It is contemporary evidence of the highest quality, and therefore is of the highest historical value, and should be attached as an appendix to the original copy of the War Diary, together with the original documents sent and received.



- (a) No military information which may have come to an officer's or other rank's knowledge as a result of his employment in any special branch or regular branches of the Army will be communicated to any person except when necessary in the performance of duty.
- (b) Personnel who in the course of their duties have had access to TOP SECRET or SECRET equipment of any kind will not communicate either in writing or in any other manner to anyone their knowledge of secret matters except in the course of their ordical duties.

COMMUNICATION OF MILITARY INFORMATION

- 1. So that there will be no misunderstanding of the regulations and orders to decerning communications to the press, or the making of statements concerning military matters by officers and other ranks, the following extracts are brought to attention:
- (a) MR (Can) Para 432 "An officer or soldier is forbidden to communicate any military information which might directly or indirectly assist an enemy, to any person other than a person to whom he is authorized to communicate it, or a person to whom it is, in the interests of the state, his duty to communicate such information."

IR (Can) Para 433(a) - "an officer or soldier is forbidden to publish or communicate either directly or indirectly, to the press, any military information, or his views on any military subject, without special authority from National Defence Headquarters, any information of a professional nature which he may acquirewhile travalling anaployed on duty is to be regarded as the property of the bonartment of national Defence and is not to be published in any form without previously obtaining to permission of national Defence and eacquarters.  - (b) Details as to numbers, armament, rquipment or condition of ships of all kinds, troops or aircraft.
 - (c) Any measures which have been taken or which are projected for the defence of any place."



GENERAL.

- 1. MARSEILLE is situated in the area administered by DELTA Base Section U.S. Army.
- 2. In certain ways DELTA Base Section is being assisted by H.Q., 203 Sub-Area.
- 3. A Transit Camp has been loaned by DELTA Base Section to H.Q., 203 Sub-Area. It is some 18 miles NORTH of MARSEILLE.
- 4. Owing to short notice, this camp is by no means complete, but every endeavour is being made to supply essentials which are at present lacking.
- 5. For Security reasons ALL RANKS will remain in the Transit Camp unless duty demands their departure. NO contact is to be made with any civilians.
- 6. A Field Cashier and D.I.D. are established, and E.F.I. canteens are being arranged.
- 7. Mail will be collected in the Transit Camp for despatch through Army Post Office channels to the Base Censor in the destination area.
- 8. The AMERICAN Red Cross in the camp have invited COLDFLAKE troops to use their canteen.
- 9. Arrangements have been made for Mobile Cinemas, games equipment and newspapers to be available in the camp at an early date.

PART II.

203 SUB-AREA RESPONSIBILITIES.

- 1. The responsibilities of H.Q., 203 Sub-Area for this operation are:-
 - (a). Disembarkation of all GOLDFLAKE troops at MARSEILLE.
 - (b). Unloading of cargo from ships.
 - (c). Transport of troops, vehicles and stores to the Transit Camp or other Assembly Area.
 - (d). Maintenance of troops whilst in MARSEILLE area.
 - (e). Despatch of troops, vehicles and stores by road and rail.
 - (f). Maintenance of the No. 1 road-staging camp.
- (g). Supply of BRITISH rations for the whole movement North from MARSEILLE.
 - (h). Assisting DELTA Base Section in policing road-centres and in traffic control.

PART III.

SECURITY.

- 1. DELTA Base Section is responsible for Security of the operation.
- 2. This in no way absolves unit commanders from their responsibility for ensuring that Security Orders are loyally and meticulously obeyed.
- 3. It is, for instance, essential that no civilian shall see personnel in possession of ITALIAN money. The Field Cashier will change all Lire into FRENCH money in the camp.
- 4. All unit commanders are requested to help the Camp police in every way and to exercise the maximum control in order to prevent any man breaking-away into MARSEILLE.
- 5. During the march to the Transit Camp personnel must NOT be allowed into contact with civilians.

PART IV.

TRANSIT CAMP - MARSEILLE.

- 1. Assisting the U.S. Army Camp Commandant is a BRITISH Camp Commandant who is responsible for the administration of the camp and maintenance of transit personnel.
- 2. The camp is divided into numbered areas each having sufficient tentage erected to hold 1000 officers and men with 50% dining accommodation.
- 3. On arrival unit commanders will report ahead to the Camp Administrative Office where a tented area and a vehicle park will be allotted. The tents are C.S. type and 12 other ranks will be allotted to each tent.
- 4. Unit Commanders will be briefed and issued with Camp Standing Orders at the Camp Administrative Office.
- Personnel should be reminded that they are guests in a U.S. Army Camp. Wilful damage and removal of camp stores will result in loss of BRITISH Army prestige in the eys of our Allies and make for discomfort for the troops who follow.

PART V.

ROAD ROUTE AND STAGING CAMPS.

- 1. On disembarkation vehicles will be marshalled into groups of ten and despatched by the Traffic Control police to the Docks Petrol Point.
- 2. The route is clearly signed "GF" (Black letters on White ground) from the disembarkation points to the Petrol Point and thence to the Transit Camp.
- Journal of the march NORTH from the Transit Camp. The journey will take FIVE days.
- 4. Staging Camps have been organised at:-

No. 1. StRIAMBERT D ALBON.

- 5. H.Q., 203 Sub-Area is fully responsible for Staging Camp No. 1 and for provision of supplies at No. 2 Staging Camp.

- 7. Detailed instructions regarding action to be taken by unit commanders at Staging Camps are included in the Movement Order issued by the Movement Control Staff at the Transit Camp.

PART VI.

RAIL MOVEMENT,

- 1. e Personnel for movement by rail will entrain at a siding some 2 miles to the S.W. of the Transit Camp. Personnel will march to the entraining point. Baggage will be carried by R.A.S.C. transport.
 - 2. Details of the route, entraining times, etc., will be issued by Movement Control Staff at the Transit Camp. The journey will take THREE days.
 - At the second halt each day a full hot meal will be served. At the other halts cold rations and either tea or soup will be available.

The Transit Camp Catering Adviser will inform unit commanders which Messing Plan they should adopt. PLAN "A". Whilst in the Transit Camp all meals will be prepared and served un . A.C.C. arrangements. Rations will be drawn on behalf of unit and issued to respective ration stores. There will be no need for units to unpack their G. 1098 equipment or employ their own cooks. Fatigue men will be required to assist, These will be requested through the Camp Administrative Office. Such requirements will not be requisitioned and AB 361 will not be used. The above limits cover goods or services forming part of any one transaction; purchases or racilities will not be divided in order to circumvent such limits.

The above financial limits of each payments supersede in this theatre any other similar figures laid down by Army Orders or ACIs with a view to restricting each purchases; they will only be varied when authorised by HQ 21 Army Group.

Procurement by local purchase is confined to goods or services payment for which may be made out of Imprest Account. Purchases by units out of Regimental Funds remain governed by the restrictions on "individual" purchases contained in General Routine Order 534, 702, 740 and 761 all of 1944.

5. PROCEDURE FOR COS OR OFFRS I/C PARTIES AT ARRIVAL AT DESTINATION.

On arrival COs or Offrs I/C Parties will be met by unit Adv Party if arrived, if NOT contact should be made with the Burgomaster (MAYOR) or Civ Police and solicit help in placing men into correct billets. These officials will do all in their power to help, and will also hand over all premises allocated for Offrs, Sgts and OR Messes and Recreational Rooms etc.

6. PROCEDURE FOR BILLETING AND REQUISITIONING,



This point would be approximately 718752. No enemy encountered along route to ELDEN. No enemy heard at point 718752. Bridges at ALMOND706722 and REID destroyed. Could be repaired with little work. Ground bordering road too soft for vehicles.

- Patrol left FILBERT 690734 moving on right side of road to houses 689736. They were investigated, no enemy found. Patrol moved along ditches some 300 yds in from left of road to orchard 687738, along edge of orchard to building 688740 no enemy but every appearance of being used as O P. The patrol then moved through orchard and then, the Bren group covered the house from edge of road. The enemy allowed the patrol to get within 8 yds of the house before opening fire with MG, MP and rifle. Lieut Hughson threw grenades into the house before being forced to withdraw. MG42 fire also came from a house across from TRUMAN (not shown on map) pinning the patrol down. Arty was called for and patrol withdrew to ditch. Heavy fire kept them pinned down and Cpl. Winters returned to the outpost and called for more arty. AT 0250 patrol returned. Gasualties, two men wounded, Officer slightly wounded; Road passable. to tanks, fields heavy going. Old defenses south side of orchard and weapon pits in orchard. House TRUMAN surrounded by thick layers of barbed wire. Approach to house from right very open.
