Supporting arms to be on wheels ready to move forward when requiredoys with tanks to be in FUP 898891/897888 by 0230 hrs and to cross start line (lateral road 894888/896891) by 0300 hrs. First phase to be completed by 0530 hrs and Bn to reorganize with A & B Coys forward each with a tp of tanks. O & D -oys in reserve. Second phase to staft at 0630 hrs under artillery concentrations prepared on a Corps level. A & B -oys to secure intermediate objectives, then O & D -oys to pass through A & B, pick up tanks and continue to final objectives. When final objectives secure B Coy to pass through exploit as far as River AUSA. "O" Group being finished, officers returned to their respective commands to brief their officers and men.
